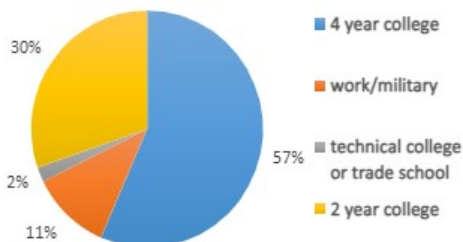
## Graduation Requirements

In 2016, Tennessee introduced the TN Promise, a scholarship and mentoring program for TN high school graduates to attend a two-year community college or college of applied technology tuition free. - Cum Laude: 3.95 – 4.24

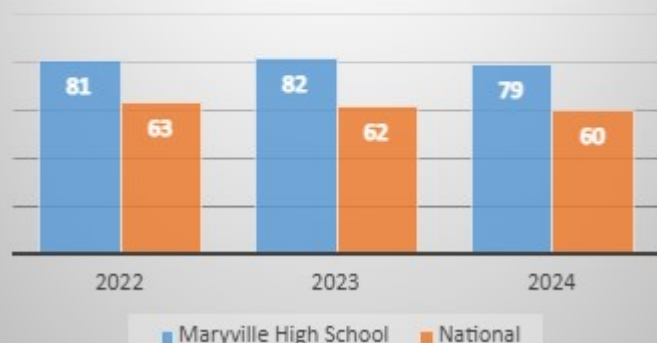
Per the Tennessee Department of Education uniform grading policy, AP courses are given an additional 1.0 quality points; Statewide Dual Credit and Dual Enrollment courses are given an additional 0.75 quality points; Honors, Local Dual Credit and Industry Certification courses are given an additional 0.5 quality points. The transcript includes both a weighted and unweighted GPA.

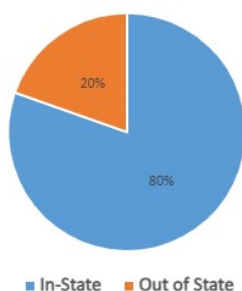
