Despite Pandemic, Obion County Students Show Academic Growth

Obion County Schools' teachers and students displayed resiliency and determination in a time when learning stalled for a large number of students across not only the state of Tennessee but also the entire nation and world. In a press release from the Tennessee Department of Education, the department used its Tennessee Value Added Assessment System (TVAAS) tool to make determinations relative to student progress before the pandemic and once students were assessed at the end of the 2020-2021 school year. Through that determination, 7 school systems showed positive growth on all math assessments, and 9 school systems showed positive growth on all English Language Arts (ELA) assessments. Obion County Schools made the cut in both math and ELA assessments, making it 1 of only 4 school districts in the entire state of Tennessee to show student growth on end-of-year assessments.

Such a determination shows that Obion County Schools' teachers, administration, staff, and students rose above adversity unlike any that most have ever faced in the field of education. A special congratulations and thank you is extended to the teachers, administrators, and support staff of Obion County Schools for the tireless work that ensured our students had the opportunity to continue to learn during such an unprecedented and difficult time.


