- Easter meal in the Black Oak Café open to the public in April

 Marquee outside to inform of upcoming events, school is clean and welcoming, entrances are clear and marked, signs to direct visitors to important places in the building, bulletin board welcomes all visitors to the building, all staff greets school visitors in a positive way in person and on the phone, user friendly phone menu

PROVIDE OPPORTUNITIES TO VOLUNTEER

- Parent and family volunteers can participate in reward days, field days, field trip chaperones, classroom parties and events, Christmas Store, local career fair, informational classroom visits, Parent Teacher Organization, Mentoring program, Book Fair, committee assignments
- Donations by community members and organizations for families in need

RESPECT ALL FAMILIES

- Accommodate religious and family beliefs, practices, and values
- Provide information in all languages and written in a way for all parents to understand

REMOVE ECONOMIC OBSTACLES TO PARTICIPATION

 Fees waived for programs, activities, etc. based upon economic needs, school supplies provided free of charge for all students, free breakfast for all students

ENSURE ACCESSIBLE PROGRAMMING

 Provide multiple opportunities for parents to attend meetings by ensuring early morning meetings as well as afternoon meetings, childcare provided during designated planned parent events

 Two parent teacher conferences during the school year to inform parents of their child's progress, report cards sent home every six weeks, agenda books for two-way communication, mid-six-week progress report sent home, parent portal, parent phone calls, updated calendar of events on district website, Black Oak Facebook page

LINK STUDENT WORK TO ACADEMIC STANDARD

- Progress monitoring reports for Tier 2 & 3, provide TN Ready test results and user-friendly interpretation, students copy standards and homework assignments in agenda books

USE STANDARDIZED TEST RESULTS TO INCREASE STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT

- Students are offered academic activities for a range of abilities through the Afterschool Program and after school tutoring
- Opportunities are given throughout the year to parents that relate to student needs, improvement, and enrichment

SHARE SCHOOL PROGRESS

 All call system, school and county wide student rewards, advertisement on radio, district and school websites; social media to include a Black Oak Facebook page, and display signs in the community

 Orientation night for students and parents transitioning to different grade levels, visitation and tour opportunities for new students and their families, Obion County Central school counselors and principal meet with 8th graders and their parents to discuss registering for high school classes and various opportunities at the high school level
