Individual Tutoring

Students who were in jeopardy of failing a course in the 2020/2021 school year were offered tutoring by district teachers.



Credit Recovery

Students who had failed a MP were given core content curriculum to earn a 60 for the failed marking period.

Department Chairs provided units of study to ensure students were not falling behind.



Enrichment/Compensatory Ed

Students were offered enrichment opportunities for Math and ILA to fill in any loss gaps due to instant learning.

Graduation Requirement Credit Recovery

East Brunswick offered free summer school for students who failed a graduation requirement.

Tuesday Tours

Students were given the opportunity to sign up for a one of 8 Tuesday Tours. Tours supported students who felt nervous about returning to the school building after participating in virtual learning.

- Secondary: 1 per grade level (600–730)
- Key Roles:
 - Respond to Crisis
 - Risk Assessments
 - Threat Assessments
 - Financial Resources/ Food Insecurities
 - ABS– investigate claims of bullying
 - 504 coordinator
 - Safety/ Climate Team Coordinator
 - Run groups & Individual Counseling
 - Class Lessons
- Secondary: work in conjunction with School Counselor, CST members and ESS workers to coordinate care for our most at risk students & families.
