Tri-Valley High School hosted an Anne Frank Exhibit on Thursday, May 9th. The exhibit was from the University of South Carolina (USC), who is a direct partner with the Anne Frank House in the Netherlands. A business in Germany generously donated grant funds to have the exhibit transported to Tri-Valley.

Donna Tarney, who works for USC contacted Tri-Valley High School History Teacher, Brad Sims about hosting the exhibit at our school. Fourteen of our students were selected to be docents and Donna trained them over a 2 day period. Our student docents led 42 classes through the exhibit between April 29 - May 10. Nine-hundred elementary, middle school, & high school students toured the exhibit as well as another 60-70 community members during a community night held on Thursday, May 9.

The exhibit has 31 panels covering the life of Anne Frank and the Holocaust. It has been showcased in 23 states and Tri-Valley was the first school to host it in the State of Ohio.



## Prospect Place

On Friday, May 10, Adamsville third graders went on a field trip to Prospect Place in Trinway to discover more about how communities have changed throughout the years. They took a guided tour of the Prospect Place home and were able to see where runaway slaves would enter the home and where they could live safely as well as the many rooms within the home. Students were amazed that the home had 4 floors and how the family was one of the few with an indoor well to help in aiding runaway slaves making their way North.

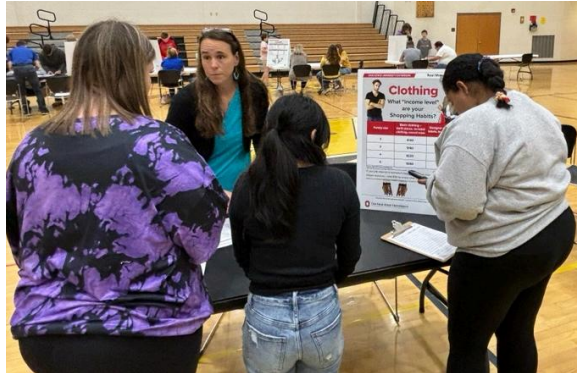




## Real Money - Real World

Real Money. Real World. (RMRW) is a youth-focused financial literacy program from Ohio State University Extension. It is highly successful because of the community efforts of Extension educators, local school teachers, and community volunteers. It includes an interactive spending simulation that provides the opportunity to make lifestyle and budget choices similar to those made by adults aged in their mid to late twenties. As part of the financial health education, students spend time learning 4 preparatory classroom lessons regarding gross vs net income, budgets, spending priorities, savings, interest rate, and insurance premiums. The simulation takes place in the gym for students to visit each booth either to make their payments or collect their earnings/deposit. They keep track of all transactions on the checking account register.

## The Wilds

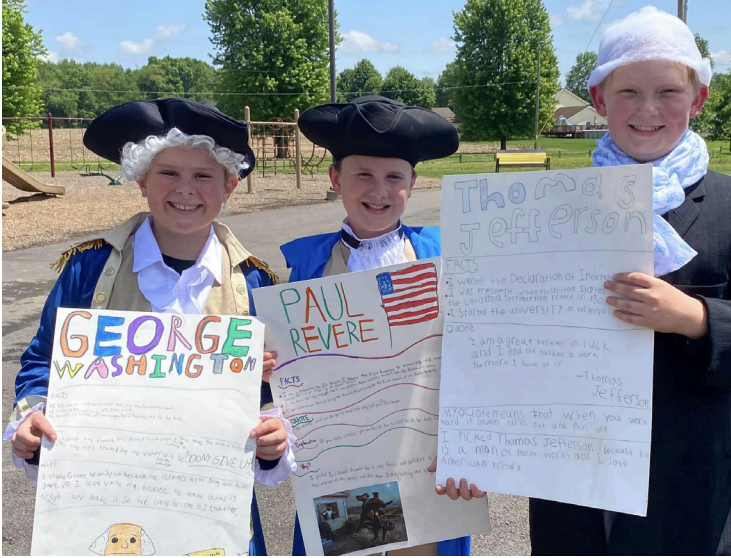

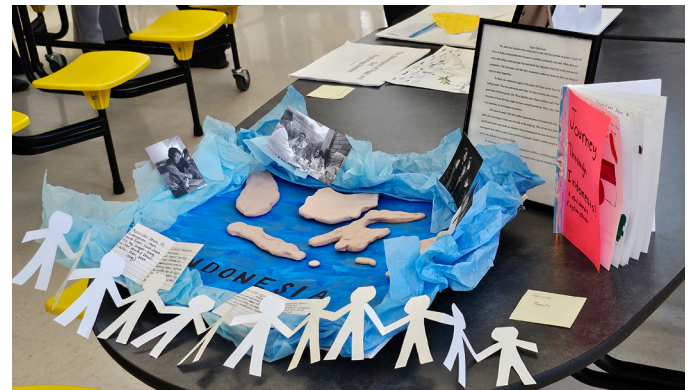
## Band News

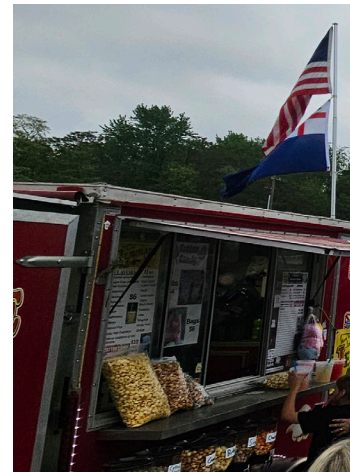

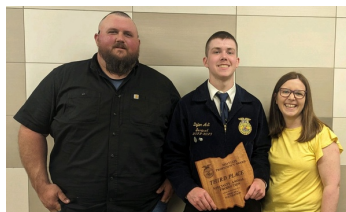
## State Convention & State Degrees

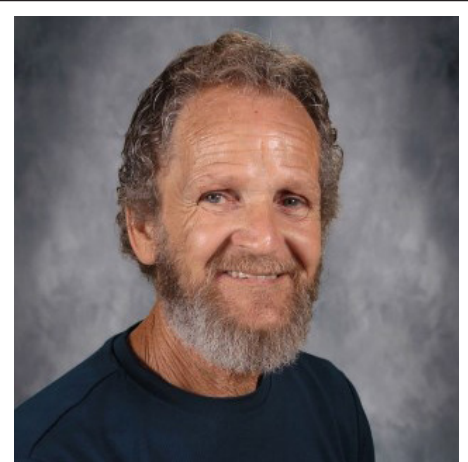
