Summer Reading

This year, Amity Reads, Amity's summer reading program, will again be linked to the Portrait of the Graduate, asking students in grades 7-12 to begin thinking about how each characteristic plays a role in their summer reading book of choice. This fall, we will ask students to share their books and think about how their books showcased one or more of the POG characteristics. Students should select one book that suits them in terms of topic and reading level. It can be fiction, nonfiction, graphic novel, audiobook -- any book that interests them is fine.

Summer Math

Just like reading, regular practice over the summer with problem solving, computation and math facts will maintain and strengthen the mathematical gains you made over the school year.

- Students entering the course, GRADE 7 MATH, should be proficient in topics A-D. Students entering the Pre-Algebra course, GRADE 7 PRE-ALGEBRA, should be proficient in topics A-N. Practicing these topics is **not mandatory** for students entering 7th grade.
- Please be aware that Pre-Algebra students should be proficient in topics A-N as they are prerequisite skills for the course.

Student Health Updates

7th Grade Mandatory Immunizations Due

If you have not done so already, please submit proof of required immunizations and most recent physical with your physician's documentation. Immunizations must be submitted to the District Office **by Aug. 2, 2024.**

Per State law, students who do not have the required immunizations or an appropriate waiver, will be excluded from school. Please visit <u>our website</u> for answers to most frequently asked questions and health forms and refer to the Resources tab.

Physicals & Medical Forms

If your child requires any medications to be administered during school hours you are required to submit a completed 2024-25 <u>Medication Administration Form.</u> Please hand in the completed medication authorization to the school nurse. Any submitted medical documents are required to be hard copies, please keep a copy of any medical documents.

If your child will be participating in sports make sure your child's physical meets the Amity Regional School District's athletic requirements. **For Fall sports eligibility a physical must be dated after November 15, 2024.** If you have any, questions please reach out to our school nurse at: <u>katherine.stavens@amityregion5.org</u>
