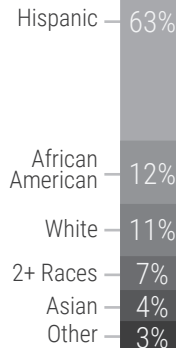

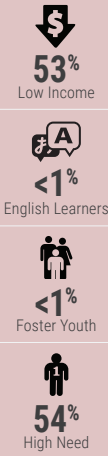

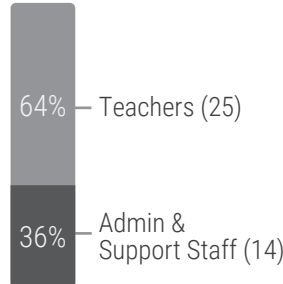

Vision Statement

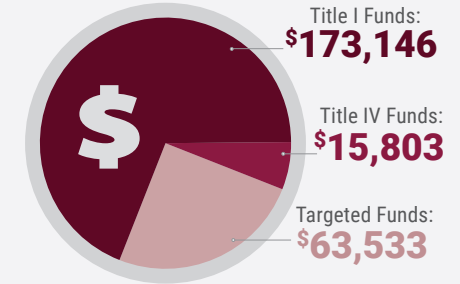
