Building Temperatures:

We recognize that when it gets intensely hot outside as it has been this week, the building can heat up during the afternoon. Please know we are constantly monitoring temperatures and working to make it as comfortable as possible for students and staff. We are pleased to report that, for the most part, the building did stay at least 20 degrees cooler than the outside temperature. Unfortunately, the exception to this has been the 4th/5th grade wing, where we did have a cooling system malfunction on Tuesday. When this happens we try to move students to other parts of the building when possible as well as set up air circulators in the flex areas and smaller fans in the classrooms. Mr. Rick has been working very closely with the district maintenance and operations team on the issue and we're pleased to report that the temperature improved in that wing by the next afternoon and has maintained the rest of the week. Also, you should know that Meridian was built at the end of the swamp cooler era, and as such, is cooled with swamp coolers, so they can struggle to keep up when the humidity increases. This is one of the major building systems that is planned to receive attention with the \$3+ million allocation plan for Meridian in the upcoming Bond/Mill election (called Blueprint; see more info below).

Additional funding is needed to address the priorities outlined in <u>Blueprint</u>, and the district may ultimately ask voters to decide on how best to fund them. Join us at the upcoming board meeting where the Board of Education is scheduled to vote on whether to place the \$830 million bond proposal and/or the \$34.5 million mill levy override proposal on the November ballot.

Through a collaborative process, the district created the <u>Blueprint Funding Proposals</u> to address what the community values wants when considering school building improvements. At **Meridian, the proposal calls for between \$3.1-3.8 million** focused on updating building interior fixtures and flooring, upgrade to HVAC, water, and lighting systems, as well as school grounds improvements such as parking lots, play structures and playground equipment.
