School District Debuts New Campus



<u>Elgin Independent School District</u> on Monday, Aug. 12 celebrated the grand opening of Harvest Ridge Elementary School, its fourth elementary campus, located within the Harvest Ridge master planned community.

School district board members and administrators gathered with campus leaders, city and chamber officials, students, and community members in the school cafeteria that afternoon to mark the milestone. Elgin ISD Superintendent of Schools Dr. Jana Rueter and School Board President Beth Walterscheidt addressed the crowd on hand before a ceremonial ribbon-cutting. A group of HRES students followed by cutting a smaller ceremonial ribbon of their own.

The event brings to fruition a capstone project in the voter-approved 2021 Elgin ISD Bond Referendum. The bond package included funds for two new elementary schools, improvements to Elgin High School, district-wide renovations, a new transportation facility and a multi-purpose facility.

"We're excited to welcome our young Wildcats to Harvest Ridge Elementary," said Dr. Rueter. "In Elgin ISD, we believe that every student deserves access to engaging, innovative educational experiences so that they have choice and opportunity for their future. This new campus will be a major part of that, while also fostering a sense of community and collaboration."



Harvest Ridge Elementary is located at 338 Harvest Ridge Blvd., just northeast of Elgin High School. The new school is designed to accommodate between 800-900 students and was built on the principles of creating a caring space, a sense of community, collaboration at the center, and a connection to the outdoors.

It includes a centrally located library, classrooms, a maker space with a Lego wall, an interconnected gym and cafeteria, and more. It will serve students in Pre-K through fourth grade this school year.

Former Elgin Elementary School Principal Megan Wehrle has been selected as principal for Harvest Ridge Elementary.




EDUCATORS RALLY AT CONVOCATION





Elgin ISD on Aug. 6 welcomed its faculty and staff back for the 2024-25 school year during its annual Convocation pep rally. Students took part in a panel discussion, and principals Jeffrey Martinez and Michelle Ruthven performed a skit aligned with the district's 2024-25 school year theme, "Something to Cheer About." TRINITY RANCH TOPPING OUT

Elgin ISD on July 31 hosted a Topping Out ceremony for Trinity Ranch Elementary at the future site of the campus. The event marked the hoisting of the final structural beam in the construction of the school, set to open next year. Topping out ceremonies trace back to Scandinavian tradition, in which pine trees are placed atop buildings under construction. Superintendent Dr. Jana Rueter and Elgin ISD Board President Beth Walterscheidt addressed the crowd on hand at the event.

NEW BUDGET AND TAX RATE ADOPTED

Elgin ISD on Monday, Aug. 19 formally adopted its 2024-25 budget and set its lowest tax rate in more than 20 years.

Elgin ISD Trustees adopted a total budget of \$87,061,660 in total revenue and \$87,393,360 in total expenditures across three funds, General Operating Fund, Child Nutrition Fund, and Debt Service Fund. Due to excess fund balance, the Child Nutrition Fund has a planned estimated spend down of \$331,700.

The 2024-25 Elgin ISD budget is based on a total tax rate of \$1.2234, a drop of \$0.0023 over last year's total tax rate of \$1.2257. It marked the sixth consecutive year Elgin ISD has decreased its tax rate for local residents.

The 2024-45 Elgin ISD fiscal year begins on Sept. 1, 2024, and will run through June 30, 2025, due to a planned fiscal year change.
