Using Launchpad to get to Office 365

- Log on to computer, click on Google, type in: www.cpsb.org
- Once you are on the CPSB Home Page, click on top of the page.



- Now you will find the orange box labeled Office 365


Using Launchpad to get to Office 365 continued

Using CPSB Home Page to get to your Outlook email

- Log onto computer
- Click on Google
- Type in: www.cpsb.org
- Look on the right side of the page and find the envelope.
- Click on this envelope and it brings you straight to your email
- Office 365 is also located in this area.



Using CPSB Outlook Email

If you are logging in to your email for the first time:

- You will have to type in your CPSB email and password
- Your email will be: first initial, last initial, and ID#
- For example: <u>tb123456@cpsb.org</u>
- Your password is the password you use to log in to the computer.

If you have used your email previously:

 When you click on Outlook mail, it will go straight to your email.
