## Fast Facts for Alpharetta HS Seniors

Counselors will begin working on Letter of Recommendation requests in order of receipt on **September 4, 2024**. Please login to **Naviance** and complete the **College Bound Information Survey**.

- Complete the **required** College Bound Information Survey in **Naviance**. By **11/1/2024**
  - Counselors cannot process letters of recommendation without the survey
- Schedule your senior check in meeting with your counselor beginning September 2024.
- Be sure you are checking your school email and Naviance accounts for updates.



# ***VISITING COLLEGE CAMPUSES***

## ***Remote Day/Pre-Approved Absences***

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### ***FCS Pre-Approved Absence Policy***

- Pre-approved Absences are excused for:
- Scholarship interviews/college visitations with verification documentation
- Graduation or wedding of an immediate family member
- Specialized supplemental or extracurricular experience
- Visitation with an immediate family member who is on leave from or is being deployed to military service
- An absence for registering to vote or to participate as an active voter in a local, state, or federal election
- Compliance with an order for a pre-induction physical exam for service in the armed forces
- Other circumstances that are mutually agreeable to the parent and principal

If students do not have a tests or quizzes and they will be out all day, they will need to come to the front office to get a remote day form. If the students have a test or a quiz or checking out early, they will need to fill out a preapproved absence form. For the remote day forms the student's parent will email all their teachers and CC Alina Johnson on the email at least three days before the absence. When they return that's when that remote form will get filled out after they made up their work.



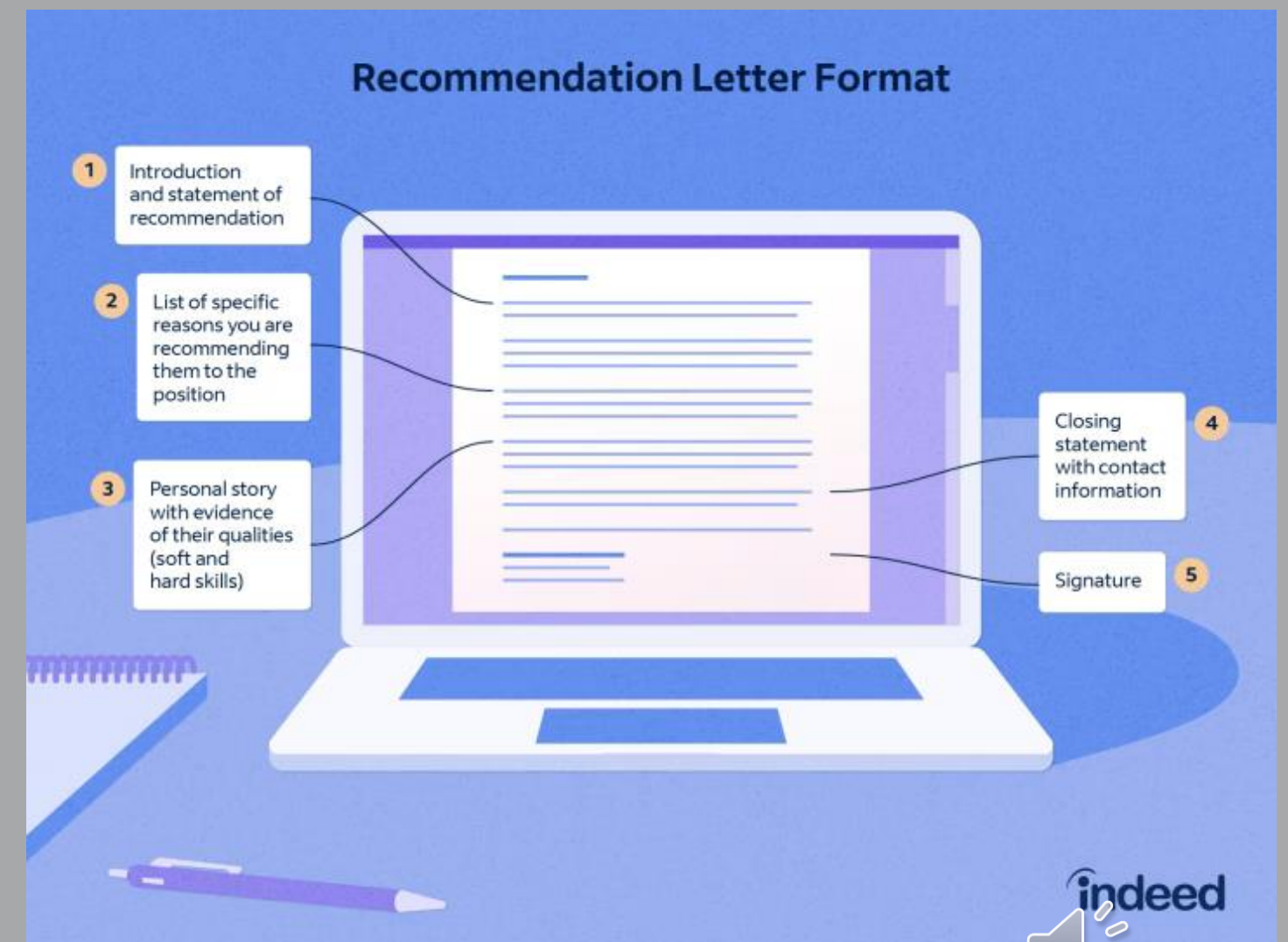

# *LETTERS OF RECOMMENDATION, TRANSCRIPT REQUESTS, MID-YEAR REPORTS*

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- Read the application carefully to determine what documents the college or scholarship organization requires.
  - Only send what they require or recommend.
- **Before you request Letters of Recommendation:**
  - Complete the College Bound Information Survey in Naviance
  - Check with individual teachers on their process for letters of recommendations.
  - Give teachers at least four weeks before the deadline to process.
  - Submit requests through Common App or Application Portal.
- AHS school counselors require at least 15 School Days to complete letters of recommendation or forms of any kind.

# UNIVERSITY SYSTEM OF GEORGIA

## *USG to extend temporary test optional admission for Academic Year 2025–2026*

The University System of Georgia (USG) will continue its temporary waiver of test score requirements. With state colleges already test optional, this means no test scores will be required for admission at 23 of USG's 26 public colleges and universities during the Academic Year 2025-2026 (Fall 2025, Spring 2026 and Summer 2026).

The temporary waiver does not apply to the Georgia Institute of Technology, the University of Georgia and Georgia College & State University.

For Academic Year 2025-2026, the 23 remaining institutions will have two options for making admissions decisions:

- 1. Freshman index:** Schools can use a formula that includes the student's high school grade point average and test scores for either the SAT or ACT.
2. Test-optional: Schools can use the student's grade point average on the required high school curriculum without a standardized test score at the following minimum grade point averages (GPA):
  - a. 3.4 GPA for research universities:** Augusta University and Georgia State University.
  - b. 3.2 GPA for comprehensive universities:** Kennesaw State University, Georgia Southern University, University of West Georgia and Valdosta State University
  - c. 3.0 GPA for state universities:** Albany State University, Clayton State University, Columbus State University, Fort Valley State University, Georgia Southwestern State University, Middle Georgia State University, Savannah State University and the University of North Georgia.
  - d. State colleges:** Abraham Baldwin Agricultural College, Atlanta Metropolitan State College, College of Coastal Georgia, Dalton State College, East Georgia State College, Georgia Gwinnett College, Georgia Highlands College, Gordon State College and South Georgia State College will continue to be test-optional in accordance with Board of Regents policy.

Test-optional admission was additionally extended to the Dual Enrollment Program through Academic Year 2025-2026. This program provides Georgia high school students the opportunity to earn college credit alongside their high school diploma.

Test scores will continue to be required to apply for Zell Miller scholarships in accordance with state of Georgia requirements.



# GEORGIA MATCH



GEORGIA MATCH is a simple way for you to know where you are eligible for admission (to be admitted to college), based on your high school calculated HOPE grade point average (GPA) through 11th grade. We want to make it easy for you to see where you could attend college in Georgia based on your current academic record and to apply to institutions you are most interested in attending! You will still need to submit an application, but that will be easy.

- GSFC/GaFutures will mail GEORGIA MATCH letters the first week of October to the current seniors – Class of 2025!
- The colleges listed on your GEORGIA MATCH letter and your GaFutures [Student Dashboard](#) are an academic match based on your HOPE GPA and they are holding a spot for you in their Fall 2025 Class. GA Futures created a way for you to request information from your GEORGIA MATCH colleges and claim your spot for admission to the GEORGIA MATCH college of your choice.

# CNA VS GPA

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FCS reports Cumulative Numeric Average (CNA) on a 100-point scale instead of Grade Point Average (GPA) on a 4.0 scale.

- Your counselor cannot convert your CNA to GPA

You can see your current weighted and unweighted CNA in Naviance and on your transcript. Student can view their HOPE GPA by visiting [www.gafutures.org](http://www.gafutures.org).

When completing formal forms, substitute your CNA when GPA is requested.

- Colleges calculate GPA their way when they review your transcript.

## **Weighted CNAs & Course Grades on Transcripts**

- Students can report their weighted and unweighted CNA on college applications.



# ***FEE WAIVER***

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SAT, ACT, and colleges want to make sure that testing and application fees do not pose a barrier for any student. If you meet certain qualifications, you can request a fee waiver for SAT, ACT, and college applications.

- You are enrolled in or eligible to participate in the federal free or reduced price lunch program (FRPL).\*
- You have received or are eligible to receive an SAT or ACT fee waiver.
- Your annual family income falls within the income eligibility guidelines set by the USDA Food and Nutrition Service.
- Your family receives public assistance.
- You are enrolled in a federal, state, or local program that aids students from low-income families (e.g., GEAR UP, TRIO such as Upward Bound or others).
- You live in a federally subsidized public housing, a foster home or are homeless.
- You are a ward of the state or an orphan.
- You have received or are eligible to receive a Pell Grant.
- You can provide a supporting statement from a school official, college access counselor, financial aid officer, or community leader.





# CHECK HOPE/ZELL ELIGIBILITY

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*Visit [www.gafutures.org](http://www.gafutures.org)*

- **Check your HOPE/Zell Miller eligibility** September, February, & June.
- Make sure your HOPE transcript matches AHS transcript.
  - Courses and grades should all be the same
  - Middle school classes should not be counting
  - Make sure noncore classes are not counting
- **Make sure you have 4 courses on the [academic rigor list](#)**
- Students have two options when applying for the HOPE Scholarship:
  - Complete the Federal Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)
  - Complete the Georgia Student Finance Application (GSFAPPS)
- Zell Miller eligible students need to be sure to submit eligible test scores to Georgia Finance Standards Commission.
- A minimum composite score of 26 is required for the ACT.
  - A minimum score of 1200 is required for the SAT.

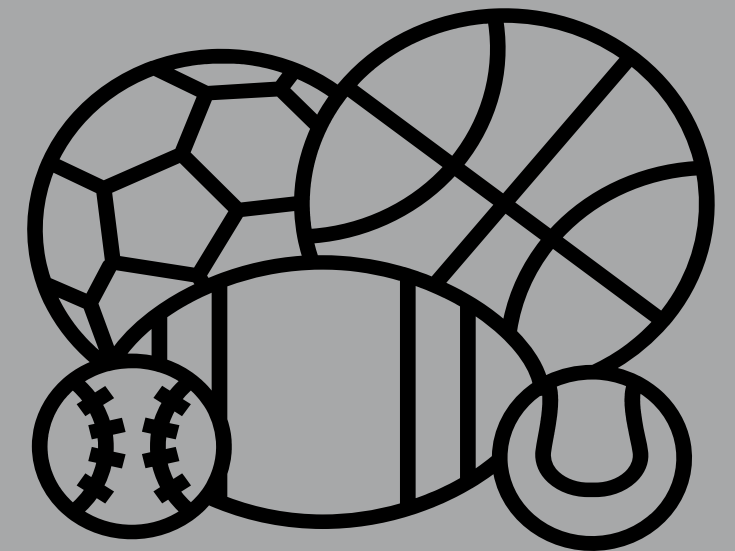
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College bound athletes must register with the Eligibility Center: <http://www.ncaa.org/student-athletes>

An official transcript must be uploaded through the NCAA High School Portal. A Final Transcript must also be requested in May.

Athletes can request their transcripts be submitted to NCAA by email Ms. Proksa at [ProksaJ1@fultonschools.org](mailto:ProksaJ1@fultonschools.org)

Be sure to check NCAA before taking courses outside of our face-to-face courses to be certain you are taking courses the NCAA will accept.



NCAA **does not** accept **credit recovery** classes taken through Fulton Virtual Credit Recovery (FVCR) or Georgia Virtual Credit Recovery (GVCR) programs.

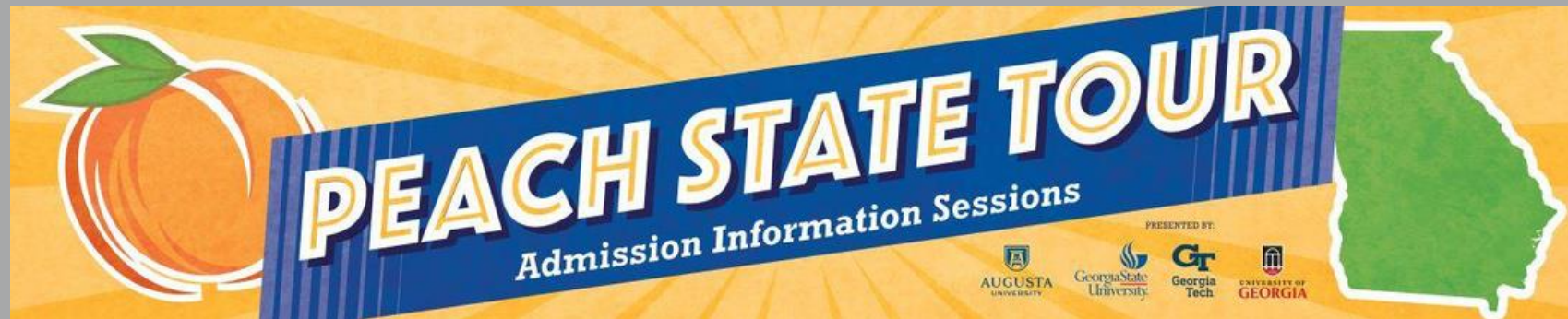

# GRADUATION FEE

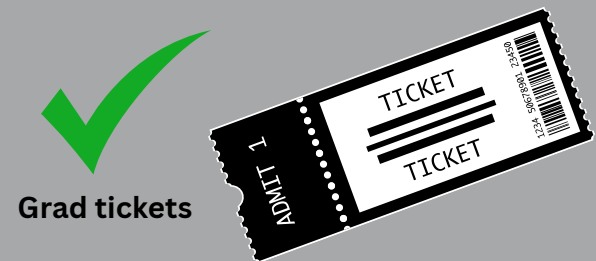

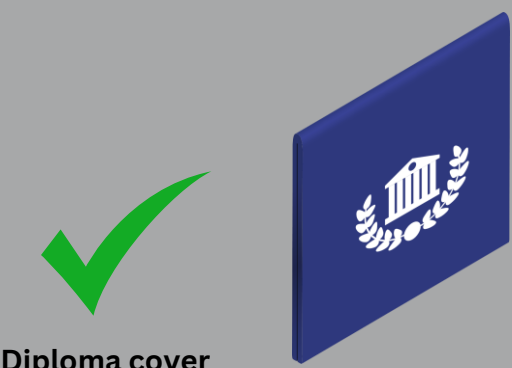

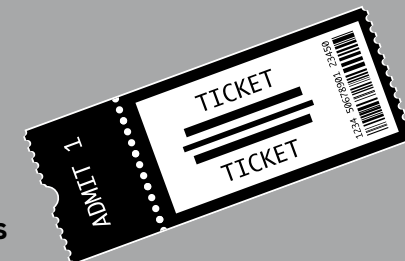
