SCHOOL COMMUNITY

The oldest established American curriculum school in Italy (1952), the International School of Florence is an independent, co-educational day school for students from 39 countries. There are 570 students in Preschool through Grade 12. Grades 9-12 have an enrollment of 200, comprised of Italian, American, and other nationalities, primarily of European, United Kingdom, Russian and Asian backgrounds with a full-time faculty of 38. An IBO World School since 1983, ISF is accredited by the Council of International Schools and the Middle States Association of Colleges and Schools.

MISSION AND VISION

A laboratory for learning where we collaborate to add meaning to a shared future. We aspire to build communities of makers and doers.

ACADEMIC PROGRAMS

ISF offers a rigorous academic program culminating with the International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma Program. Students in Grades 9 and 10 take a prescribed set of college preparatory courses. The school also offers the Italian Curriculum to students until Grade 8. The primary language of instruction is English; EAL students are welcome in Grades 9 and 10. All students, upon meeting graduation requirements, receive an American High School Diploma.

INTERNATIONAL BACCALAUREATE (IB)

The IB offers a rigorous college preparatory course of study in Grades 11 and 12, consisting of six academic courses. Students must also complete a Theory of Knowledge (ToK) course, a 4,000-word Extended Essay (EE), and a balanced two-year engagement in Creativity, Activity, and Service (CAS). The highest possible score for an IB diploma is 45 points. The minimum passing score is 24.

Each subject is awarded a mark on a scale of 7 to 1.

EE and ToK results may combine for a maximum of 3 additional points.

HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

Graduation requires a minimum of 24 credits in Grades 9-12: 4 in Language A, 3 in Mathematics, 3 in Science, 3 in Social Studies, 3 in Language B, and 8 Electives.
