

COLLEGE COURSE OFFERINGS UPDATE

- College Conservation and Environmental Science (SCI 104)
 - Offering one section that essentially ties college credit to traditional conservation class for students who are college bound.
- Financial Literacy
 - Committee is still working to identify college partners and curriculum that meets the needs of our students.
 - Elements of Financial Literacy already embedded in the curriculum;
 however, we are working to create a class specific to this content as a math elective.

GRADE LEVEL COMMUNITY EXPECTATIONS

Students came up with the most important expectations in order to be a successful learner.


All 3 classes have the same classroom rules posted that every student signed.

We us the PBIS PAWS Points System to reward students who follow the classroom rules.


INSTRUCTIONAL PRACTICE

- ❖ Each teacher is developing an expertise in 1 subject in addition to ELA. We are able to focus more on 2 subjects instead of all 4 subjects.
- ❖ When we have training, only 1 teacher is out of the classroom for Math, Science, or Social Studies instead of an entire grade level. This helps with behavior problems across the grade level.
- ❖ We can better infuse ELA in all subject areas and further develop their mastery of the grade level standards. For example, Social Studies working on constructed response questions along with grammar.
- All students are learning the subject content using the same methods and practices daily.
- With the MTSS process we are able to communicate an collaborate more on specific student needs.
- Content area teachers collaborate across the 3 buildings.

ORGANIZATION




- Before 9:00 students pack their bookbags with items for the day.
- Students travel with their backpacks for all 3 rotations.
- Each class has a specific color folder
- All papers stay in correct folder.
- Students have daily routines to provide consistency, assist with organization, and build independence.



PARENT COMMUNICATION

- Fourth grade teachers and parents met together to present our open house presentation.
- We often call parents as a team to discuss academic progress.
- Parents feel comfortable messaging content teachers individually as well as a team on seesaw regarding their child.
- Weekly newsletters are sent on seesaw to inform parents of important dates and content students are learning.

COMPUTER BASED TESTING (CBT)

- New York State Education Department (NYSED) announced that beginning in spring 2026 CBT will be required for the state assessments in grades 3-8.
- In preparation for the statewide implementation of CBT the following plan for CBT will be implemented in the district.

^{*}Currently the district administers CBT in grades 5, 6, 7 and 8.
