USE OF BICYCLES AND MOTOR VEHICLES</p> <p>Because of the clear and present danger of accident in traffic inherent in bicycle riding, it shall be the policy of the Board to prohibit the use of bicycles by all students to travel to and from school.</p> <p>The Board Regards the use of motor vehicles for travel to and from school by students as an assumption of responsibility by parents and students.</p> <p>The Board will permit the use of motor vehicles by students provide that such students are licensed drivers; have parental permission when they are minors; and have been granted permission by the building principal to drive a motor vehicle on school grounds.</p> <p>The Board will not be responsible for motor vehicles which are lost, stolen, or damaged.</p> <p>The Superintendent shall develop rules and regulations for the operation and parking of motor vehicles and shall disseminate those rules to all students affected.</p> <p>The Superintendent shall establish standards of the granting of permits which shall contain the warning that infraction of rules may result in the revocation of the permit.</p>
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223 USE OF BICYCLES AND MOTOR VEHICLES
(to be used in conjunction with Policy 223)

1. Motor Vehicle Rules and Regulations

- a. Permission – Secondary students who are licensed drivers and have the permission of their parents may drive to school. Students must register their vehicle with the high school principal. The high school office will maintain a list of authorized student vehicles (those granted permits).
- b. Parking – Parking in the vicinity of the high school is limited. Students may not use the facility parking lot when school is in session. Students may use street parking and designated church parking lots when such use doesn't interfere with church activities. Normally, an announcement will be made when local churches will need their parking facilities.

2. Dissemination - Rules and regulations for the use of motor vehicles will be disseminated in the student handbook and at the opening day assemblies.

3. Revocation – Infraction of school rules or violations of the motor vehicle code may result in the revocation of the permit.
