- ♦ Cum Laude: 3.750-4.249
- ♦ Magna Cum Laude: 4.250-4.499
- ♦ Summa Cum Laude: 4.500+



Northern Arizona University

NAU

- Minimum GPA for acceptance unweighted 2.75 GPA; 14 core academic courses (no world language) Course Requirements
- Application apply direct or through Common Application (self-report grades)
- No letter of recommendation for regular admission
- Scholarship information on NAU website
- No application fee for in-state residents

NAU Honors College

- ♦ Student needs to be admitted first
- ♦ 3.0 GPA; 14 core academic courses
- Application opens September 1st
- ♦ 2 Essays and Resume
- Deadline to be considered for Merit Scholarships is November 15th
- No letters of recommendation required




Arizona State University

ASU

- Minimum GPA for acceptance unweighted 3.0 GPA; 16 core academic courses
- Application –apply direct or through Common Application (self-report grades)
- ♦ No letter of recommendation for regular admission
- Scholarship information on ASU website
- ACT/SAT not required but providing score(s) may lead to increased scholarship awards

Barrett, The Honors College

- Application opens Wednesday, September 4th
- ♦ Early action deadline November 1st
 Regular decision deadline January 15th
 Late consideration deadline March 15
- A student can start the honors application before being accepted to ASU. Apply 4 weeks before their preferred Barrett deadline
- ♦ 2 letters of recommendation (teachers and/or counselor). Barrett will email recommenders directly
- ♦ Essay required



University of Arizona

U of A

- Minimum GPA for acceptance unweighted 3.0 GPA; 16 core academic courses
- Applications –apply direct or through Common Application (self-report grades)
- No letter of recommendation for regular admission
- Scholarship information on U of A website

W.A. Franke Honors College

- ♦ Early Action November 15th
- ♦ Regular Decision January 31st
- ♦ 1 letter of recommendation; U of A will email recommender directly
- A student can start the honors application before being accepted to U of A

Counselor Letters of Recommendation

- ♦ Complete the College
 Application Portfolio (CAP) –
 available in College and Career
 Center

 - Counselor questionnaire
- Return CAP to your counselor
 - ♦ AT LEAST 3 WEEKS PRIOR TO YOUR FIRST COLLEGE DEADLINE!!!

- ♦ Schedule a meeting with your counselor the following week
- ♦ Inform your counselor if you ADD ANY schools after you have turned in your CAP



Common Application (Common App; "CA")

- 1. Create CA account
 - https://www.commonapp.org/apply/first-year-students
- 2. FERPA Waiver must complete before counselor can complete letter
- 3. Letters of recommendation (LOR) may be required (teachers and/or counselor)
- 4. Early decision vs. early action vs. regular decision
- 5. Transcripts will be sent through Common App




Major Clarity



- 1. Login to Major Clarity from Clever. Select "Continue with Google" to sign in.
- 2. Manually add any school(s) to which you are applying. You do NOT need to add honors college applications.
 - a. Go to Postsecondary Exploration.
 - b. Search your school(s).
 - c. Click the star to "favorite" your school(s).
 - d. Go to "Application Center."
 - e. Click "Manually Add Application."
 - f. Enter the college name and answer required questions.
 - g. Click "Add Application" to save.
- 3. Request Transcript colleges typically need an initial, mid-year and final transcript. For any non-Common App school, complete a transcript request in Major Clarity. You will also request transcripts for NCAA in Major Clarity, if applicable.
 - a. Go to "Application Center."
 - b. Scroll down to "Request New Transcript."
 - c. Type your college into the search box and select then "Save."

How to narrow down the list...

- * Reach: Schools with 30% or below acceptance rate (AR) are the MOST SELECTIVE.
 - * Examples: Ivy's, Military Academies, Rice, Vanderbilt, Northwestern, UT, etc.
- * Mid-range: Schools in the 30-50% AR range are considered VERY SELECTIVE.
 - * Examples: LMU, USD, Univ. of Washington, Chapman.
- * Sure Bet: Will be different for every student. These are schools where a student is confident of admission.
