* One Bible credit and .25 Week Without Walls credit per year of attendance at Liberty is required.

** To graduate College Prep with Honors, a student must pass six year-long Honors/AP/DC/DE courses. Beginning with the entering class of 2021, at least two of the six courses must equal two year-long AP/DC/DE courses. Three foreign language credits from the same language are required. The student must not have failed more than a total of two semesters in courses counting toward graduation requirements.

Advanced Courses Offered

In order to maintain a balanced course load, qualified students are encouraged to take no more than one AP course in 9th and 10th grade, two courses in 11th grade, and three courses in 12th grade. To qualify for advanced courses, a student must have a minimum of 85 percent in a Honors course or 90 percent in a regular course and must have been maintained in the subject for the entire previous year. Dual Credit (DC)/Dual Enrollment (DE) options are also available and vary by subject, students may take these for an elective credit on their transcript. Open for 9th-12th, DC/DE students are pre-assigned both a Liberty teacher and a college instructor.

Class Rank

Liberty Christian School provides a rigorous academic program with high expectations. Liberty ranks only the top 10% of each graduating class. The weighted class rank calculation is determined on the 100.0 GPA scale. Class rank is calculated every semester after exams for 11th and 12th graders. Transfer students receive class standing after four consecutive semesters at Liberty.

GPA Computation

The Grade Point Average (GPA) is determined on a graduated 4.0 and 100.0 scale that includes the following Liberty courses from ninth through 12th grade: English, Social Studies, Science, Math (Algebra I included if taken in the eighth grade), Foreign Language, Bible, and Liberty Honors/AP/DE courses. The GPA shown on a transcript is weighted. Weighting is five points for Honors courses and 10 points for AP and DE GPA is calculated every semester after exams.
