Health Office at FACE

- The nurses housed at FACE are Parkview Community Nurses and are a part of the Health and Wellness team
- The goal of clinic operations at FACE is to provide wrap around health services to students who are new to FWCS.
 - 323 new family assessments
 - 242 medical referrals made (38 food referrals made)
 - 493 vision and hearing screenings
 - 1483 students vaccinated (38% uninsured) 4166
 vaccines given (93% VFC which means the students is
 on Medicaid due to low income or they have no
 insurance at all)
