PART I. GENERAL EXPECTATIONS OF THE PARENT INVOLVEMENT POLICY

Dove Schools agrees to implement the following statutory requirements:

• The school will put into operation programs, activities, and procedures for the involvement of parents with Title I, Part A programs. Those programs, activities and procedures will be planned and operated with meaningful consultation with parents of participating children.

5. Dove Schools will take the following actions to conduct, with the involvement of parents, an annual evaluation of the content and effectiveness of this parental involvement policy in improving the quality of the school. The evaluation will include identifying barriers to greater participation by parents in parental involvement activities (with particular attention to parents who are economically disadvantaged, are disabled, have limited English proficiency, have limited literacy, or are of any racial or ethnic minority background). The school will, with the assistance of teachers, provide materials and training to help parents work with their children to improve their children's academic achievement, such as literacy training, and using technology, as appropriate, to foster parental involvement, by:

- o Hosting a Back to School Night and Open House.
- o Offering parents e-mail addresses to all professional staff.
- o Offering parents, a home visit during the school year.
- o Offering all parents, a secured internet based grade reporting system.
- o Offering information to all parents through the school website.
- o Providing all students with a student handbook.

The school will, with the assistance of parents, educate its teachers, pupil services personnel, principals and other staff, in how to reach out to, communicate with, and work with parents as equal partners, in the value and utility of contributions of parents, and in how to implement and coordinate parent programs and build ties between parents and schools, by:

- o Administrative team meetings
- o Title I staff meetings
- o Parent Teacher Organization meetings
