**Rock Spring Elementary School
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What is Title 1?

Rock Spring Elementary is identified as a Title 1 school as part of the Every Student Succeed Act. (ESSA) Title1 is designed to support State and local school reform efforts tied to challenging State academic standards in order to reinforce and enhance efforts to improve teaching and learning for students. Title 1 programs must be based on effective means of improving student achievement and include strategies to support parental involvement. All Title 1 schools must jointly develop with all parents a written parental involvement policy.

School Plan for Shared Student Achievement

What is it? This is a plan that describes how Rock Spring Elementary (RSE) will provide opportunities to improve family engagement to support student learning. RSE values the contributions and involvement of families in order to establish an equal partnership for the common goal of improving student achievement. This plan describes the different ways that RSE will support family engagement and how families can help and participate in activities and events to promote learning at school and at home.

How is it developed? RSE welcomes family input and comments at any time regarding the plan. All family feedback will be used to revise the plan for next year. The plan is posted on our school website for families to view and post feedback throughout the year. We also distribute an annual survey online to ask families for their suggestions on the plan and the use of funds for family involvement. For families without Internet access, paper copies of the survey will be made available on the information table outside the front office. Families can also give feedback during any Title I event throughout the year.

Who is it for? All students participating in the Title 1, Part A program, and their families, are encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described in this plan. RSE will provide full opportunity for the participation of families with limited English, families with disabilities and families of migratory children. Residential facilities in RSE attendance area are included in the family engagement correspondences and activities.

Where is it available? At the beginning of the year, the plan is sent home with all students. New students will receive this information with their new student packet. The plan will also be available in the Family Resource Center, school office, and on the school website.

2024-2025 Academic Goals

District Goal	<p>Reading: At the end of the 2025 school year, we will see a 3% increase in the percentage of students who are proficient and above on Georgia Milestone ELA assessments from the 2024 results. (End of Grade in 3rd - 8th and End of Course for English Literature and Composition combined) (Grade 2024 = 37.2%; goal for 2025 = 40.2%)</p> <p>Math: At the end of the 2025 school year, we will see a 3% increase in the percentage of students who are proficient and above on Georgia Milestone Math assessments from the 2024 results. (End of Grade of 3rd - 8th Grade and End of Course in Algebra I combined)</p>
School Goals	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. By May 2025, students in grades first through fifth grade will improve their math score measured by MAPS assessment and/or GA Milestones. A five to eight percent increase in math will be achieved. 2. By May 2025, students in grades first through fifth grade will improve their reading score measured by MAPS assessment and/or GA Milestones. A five to eight percent increase in reading.

School-Family Compacts

As part of this plan, RSE and our families will develop a school-parent compact. This is an agreement that families, teachers, and students will develop together that explains how each party will work together to ensure all our students reach grade-level standards. The compacts will be sent home with all students at the beginning of the school year. The compacts will be reviewed and updated annually based on feedback from families, students, and teachers at the Spring Family Education Night. The compacts are kept on file with the family involvement coordinator if parents would like a copy.

Opportunities for Family Involvement at RSE for the 2024-2025 school year

Based on the survey results received in Spring 2024, Rock Spring Elementary will host the following events to build the capacity for strong family involvement to support a partnership among the school, parents, and the community to improve student academic achievement.

Open House – August 2024

Meet your child’s teachers and our friendly and helpful school staff.

Family Orientation – DATA Night - September, 2024

This is a set aside time to hear from the administration about school-wide policies and procedures and also meet with your child’s teacher to learn student requirements for this school year. Academic goals, individual current student data and expectations for the year will be discussed. This event is offered at two separate times so that families can attend the session that works best for them.

Annual Title I Meeting- – September 2024

This is a very informative meeting where RSE families will learn about our Title 1 program, including our family involvement policy, our school wide plan, and our school-parent compacts.

Volunteer Training- Fall - Various dates and times

Can we count on you to volunteer at RSE this year? Attend this training session to learn about our volunteer policies, and find out how you can help. All volunteers must complete the volunteer training. .

Winter Reading DATA Night – January 2025

Enjoy an evening of family time as you learn reading strategies, levels, and games to increase reading fluency and achievement. Fun activities will be provided for the students and parents will meet with their child’s teacher to discuss progress.

Family DATA Night & Spring Transition– Spring 2025

Join RSE faculty and staff to follow up from the fall and winter DATA nights and see the progress your student has made. Individual student data will be available to each family. Families will also visit the next grade so that they can be prepared for next school year. Childcare will be available for all students so that families may meet with the teacher.

Transition Night for 5th Grade Students - Spring 2025

An opportunity for parents and students to visit SRMS / LMS with their student and get information.

Transition Night for Upcoming Kindergarten Students – Spring 2025

Upcoming Kindergarten families from the community are invited to tour RSE and participate in a segment of class. A tour will be given and questions answered about the upcoming school year. (Virtual until further notice)
