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The Importance of Budgeting

Making Every Dollar Count Toward a Better Education

-FROM THE CFO-



It's that time of year again in Central Indiana — fall has arrived. Aside from the pleasant cooler nights and perfect football weather, it's also budget season. Now, I can sense that the mere mention of budgets might not sound exciting, and that's perfectly understandable. However, allow me to shed some light on why our school's budget holds real significance for you.

To grasp the importance, let's start with a brief overview of how the budgeting process unfolds in public schools. It all begins in late summer, where diligent work takes place at the

district level to shape the upcoming budget year. We commence by projecting the funds we expect to receive and then construct our expenses accordingly.

The primary sources of revenue for public schools are the State Tuition Support, which fuels the education fund — covering teacher salaries and classroom supplies — and Local Property Taxes, which contribute to operational expenses and debt payments. While the state largely determines the allocation of educational fund dollars, local tax dollars provide more local control, governed by the school board and the local taxpayers, including you.

Here's some exciting news: for the sixth consecutive year, our net assessed value has seen an increase. This value, determined by the county assessor, represents the worth of real and personal property within our tax jurisdiction. Once this figure is established, a tax rate is set, which includes both the operations fund tax rate and the debt service fund tax rate. The chart below illustrates this growth in Certified Net Assessed Value and the reduction in the overall tax rate for Danville Community Schools. Since 2018, there has been an impressive \$0.2442 reduction in the overall tax rate—a remarkable 16.1% decrease.

Our commitment to maximizing every dollar for our students remains unwavering. We continuously seek efficiencies and strategies to further lower this rate, all while we're in the midst of building projects at South Elementary and preparing to break ground on the High School in April 2024.

So, even if budgets don't thrill you, remember that we are diligently working to stretch our resources to the fullest, ensuring your dollars go towards providing the best teachers, facilities, experiences, and education for the students of Danville.

Sweet Community Collaborations



An Update on Deses Master Campus Plan

-FROM THE SUPERINTENDENT-



This past summer, Danville Community Schools kicked off the Master Campus Plan process by breaking ground at South Elementary School. To date, 14 classrooms are in the process of being added to the southeast side of the school, with cinder block walls nearly complete. Work is in progress to relocate the administrative offices and school resource officer to the front of the building, with a new secure entry in the works. Work has begun to expand the gym for full use of the playing floor and to accommodate additional bleacher seating. Over the summer, interior renovations will begin to expand the cafeteria space for students and to completely renovate the existing classroom areas of the building. Renovations will continue

through the 2024-25 school year, with completion scheduled in the summer of 2025.

As we approach spring break, we will begin phase 1 of the high school projects. Over spring break, construction crews will mobilize to begin adding 14 classrooms onto the northeast side of the building. At the same time, the south Warrior Way drive will be closed off to allow for safety as construction will begin on the southwest side of the building, where a new pool and weight room will be added. The current pool in the center of the building will be totally renovated into new performing arts areas for band and choir. This summer, initial work will begin to renovate portions of the academic wing, adding permanent wall structures to enhance student safety. Work is already underway to develop temporary new front office areas inside of the present-day entrance 17. Following spring break, this will become the new front entrance as crews work to remodel the interior of the building, including a new secure front entry, interior classroom spaces, library and front offices.

The high school project will span three years from the time of groundbreaking, with all parts of the building being touched at some point. All classrooms will be significantly renovated, including our career and technical education areas and an expansion of the greenhouse. The cafeteria will receive a generous expansion and a student commons area developed to provide space for students to interact. Athletic areas will be updated to include improvements to softball, tennis, track and Warrior Stadium.

As part of the Master Campus Plan, we will be going back into North to update a couple of remaining items that had to be delayed due to budget limitations during the recent renovation. This includes restroom updates, replacing heating and cooling units in classrooms, replacing some of the remaining exterior doors, and providing upgrades to the gymnasium lighting and flooring.

The value added in safety improvements and the learning environment are significant. We are taking great care to look toward the future including being intentional to introduce natural light into the building, provide for space needs, and to allow the free flow of student traffic in the buildings. We are so appreciative of our community's support of the project and grateful for the tax contributions to make these facility upgrades for our students possible. Special attention is being given to be as efficient as possible in the construction process. This entire set of projects is being completed while Danville Community School Corporation is also lowering our school debt service rate to taxpayers. Thank you for your support, and please look for more good things to come as we work together to provide a quality educational experience for the young people in our community.

As we officially turn the page on another successful year at Danville Community School Corporation, we are very proud of our 186 graduates from the class of 2024 and wish them the very best as they take on new life ambitions and challenges. We also want to congratulate our Elementary Teacher of the Year, Mrs. Lori Wynn, and our Secondary Teacher of the Year, Mrs. Sonja Dashiell. These teachers exemplify the caring and committed staff we have as a whole in our schools.

As we move into the summer, construction has gotten into full swing as 14 additional new classrooms are nearing completion at South Elementary, and construction on 14 additional new classrooms at Danville Community High School is getting underway on the northeast end of the building. Entrance to the high school campus will be significantly limited this summer as workers are completely renovating the North and West parking lots in order to have them ready for fall when we return to school. These changes will allow us to separate bus traffic, student traffic, and parent traffic to increase safety on our campus.
