OPENING DAY

Wednesday, September 6, is the first day of school for grades UPK-12 and E2CCB Career and Technical Education classes. The first day of school is a full day. Students should come to school prepared to start learning. Normal drop-off and pick-up procedures should be followed at all buildings.

Questions about opening day should be directed to individual building principals.

VISITORS TO HOLLAND SCHOOLS

To ensure the safety of students, individuals visiting the schools must check in at the main office upon entering the building.

STAYING SAFE AT SCHOOL

Dignity For All Students

No student shall be subjected to harassment by employees or students on school property or at a school function; nor shall any student be subjected to discrimination based on a person's actual or perceived race, color, weight, national origin, ethnic group, religion, religious practice, disability, sexual orientation, gender (including gender identity or expression), or sex by school employees or students on school property or at a school function.

Bullying

Please report any concerns regarding harassment, bullying, or discrimination to the building principal.

Firearms and Weapons are Forbidden

State and Federal regulations stipulate that bringing a firearm or similar dangerous weapon on school premises can result in a one-year suspension from school.

Building Visitors

Parents are always welcome to visit schools. Please make arrangements with the school principal if you would like to visit a classroom.

TITLE 1 INFORMATION MEETINGS

In order to support you with your student's education, an informational meeting will be offered to address what Title 1 entails, the district's role, and your rights. Title 1 allows our district to provide additional academic supports to students, through Academic Intervention Services (AIS). These meetings are scheduled in each building in September during our Meet the Teacher Nights.

HEALTH SERVICES

School Nurse

The school nurse is available to talk with families and will share any concerns discovered in school examinations. it is important that parents keep the nurse informed of corrective treatment, immunizations received, etc. to maintain accurate health records.

In accordance with the State Education laws, a school physician gives an annual physical examination to students in grades Pre-K, K, 1, 3, 5, 7, 9, 11. If your child is in one of these grades and provides a NYS Required School Health Examination Form that was completed within the last year by their private physician, it will not be necessary for the school physician to examine your child. A copy of the Health Examination Form must be provided to the school within 30 days from the first day of school (October 6, 2023).

Students new to the district or entering UPK or Kindergarten are reminded to get a physical examination prior to the opening of school.

Immunizations

- Four to five doses of DTaP (Diphtheria Tetanus, Pertussis)
- Three to four doses of Polio vaccine
- Two doses of Measles and Mumps vaccine and one dose of Rubella vaccine
- HIB vaccine (required for Pre-K only)
- Three doses of Hepatitis B vaccine
- Two doses of Varicella vaccine
- Pneumococcal vaccine (required for Pre-K only)
- One to two doses of Meningococcal vaccine
- One Tdap

Immunization medical exemptions must be reissued annually by a physician. The required documentation must be submitted within 14 days of the start of the school year.

State Education Law for Medication Administered During School Day

Occasionally, it is necessary for students to receive medication during the school day. To comply with New York State Education Law, there are certain requirements which must be met before medication can be given.

- A school medication form must be completed by the parent/guardian
- Clear and definitive directions by the physician for frequency and dosage of the prescribed medication
- 3. Adequate supply of medication in a properly labeled bottle which will be kept in a locked cabinet in the nurse's office
- 4. Medication should be brought directly to the school office by the parent/guardian as it is illegal for students to carry a medication unless a healthcare professional has permitted the child to self-carry and self-administer their medication(s). Medical documentation stating this is required.

It is recommended that whenever possible, medication be administered before and after school hours under the direction of the parent/quardian.

Illness and Accidents

The school nurses will provide emergency care for illness and injuries which occur while students are under school jurisdiction. Any treatment is limited to first aid only. Necessary subsequent treatment is the responsibility of the parent/guardian. When it is necessary for a student to be sent home due to illness, transportation of the student during school hours is the responsibility of the parent/guardian.

Please note that students are not allowed to leave school independently due to illness. Ill students need to be seen at the health office and the school nurse will then contact the family.

TRANSPORTATION INFORMATION

Safety is our primary concern. Bus stops are reviewed to assure your child is safe. All buses are scheduled for appropriate seating capacity and designed to be at optimum efficiency.

Routes and Schedules

Prior to the first day of school, families will be notified via mail of route and pick up time. Please have students outside, visible, and ready for the bus 3–5 minutes early. School buses will not stop and beep the horn for students not at the designated pick up point.

Pick-Up and Drop-Off Procedures

At NO time are students permitted to get off a school bus at any place other than their home or one alternate placement location (for example: the Boys & Girls Club).

Alternate transportation forms will be available via Operoo and must be completed prior to being accommodated. Please allow 5 days for implementation. Students UPK-4 will not be released at their stop unless an adult is visible to the bus driver. Contact the Transportation Office ONLY with any and all changes at 716-537-8261.

Students Attending E2CCB Ormsby Educational Center CTE Programs

In the a.m., all students will ride the regular routes to the HS and transfer for the trip to the Ormsby Educational Center. Those attending BOCES p.m. classes will be taken from the Ormsby Center back to HS to ride regular routes to their homes.



Cars at Dismissal Time

There will be "no admittance" near bus loading areas during arrival and dismissal times. It is illegal to pass a school bus that is stopped for loading and unloading.

Late Bus Transportation

Late bus transportation will be provided Monday-Thursday at 3:30pm.

Baggage and Instruments

In accordance with NYS law, all baggage and instruments transported on the school bus must fit on the student's lap.

Bus Rules

- 1. Observe same conduct as in classrooms
- 2. Be courteous; profane language is not allowed
- 3. No eating or drinking
- 4. Keep the bus clean
- 5. Cooperate with the driver
- 6. No smoking
- 7. Do not be destructive
- 8. Stay in your seat
- 9. Keep head, hands, and feet inside the bus
- 10. Bus drivers are authorized to assign seats

Failure to adhere to the rules will result in loss of riding privileges!

Free and Reduced-Price Meal Application

Did you know the school meal application is more than just a meal application? Your meal application affects many areas such as school meals, discounted fees for academic tests, increased school funding, and discounted fees associated with applying for college. Holland CSD asks that all families fill out a new school meal application each year to ensure continued funding for ALL students in our district.

Under the federal guidelines for the National School Lunch Program, those people whose income is at a certain level or have someone in the household receiving Medicaid or services may qualify for free or reduced-price meals for their children. Applications are available on the district website and may be submitted at any time. If you require further information, contact the Director of Food Service at 716–537–8216.

Applications will be processed within ten days of submission. Families will be notified of eligibility by mail. If your child was eligible last year, eligibility will continue until October 15. If an application is not received by this date, free/reduced meals will be discontinued on the assumption that you are no longer eligible. Please note that those students who are eligible for free/reduced meals are also eligible for exam (ACT, SAT) and some college application fees waivers.

Meal Payments

Monitor your student's meal account online using www.myschoolbucks.com. See account balances, student purchases, prepay for meals and more. When purchasing breakfast or lunch, students can access accounts via PIN number. If a student account has a negative balance of \$5.00 or more, the Parent Portal and Student Portal will be disabled until the negative balance is cleared.

INTERSCHOLASTIC ATHLETICS

Grades 7 & 8 (Modified B) Grades 7-9 (Modified A)

- 1. Students are given the opportunity to be able to explore and expand their interests and abilities.
- 2. Coaches maximize the opportunities for all students to participate in the contests.
- 3. The major focus is on teaching the basic fundamentals of the game. Emphasis is on practice, participation, and sportsmanship.

Grades 9 & 10 (Junior Varsity)

- 1. The program is designed to lend itself to increased interscholastic competition and preparation for the varsity level.
- 2. This program will allow each athlete the opportunity to practice and participate in scheduled athletic contests whenever possible.
- 3. Coaches give their athletes playing time in each contest, but factors such as: ability levels, closeness of the game, discipline, how they practice etc., all influence their decisions.
- 4. A major focus continues to be the teaching of basic fundamentals of the game and the development of game skills and sportsmanship.

Grades 11 & 12 (Varsity)

- 1. Varsity competition lends itself to an emphasis on winning. The program does not emphasize winning at the expense of the rules of the game, good sportsmanship, or the health and safety of the athlete.
- 2. Each athlete's performance is constantly assessed based on improvement both during a practice or contest.
- 3. Playing time is the sole discretion of the coach.

Anyone participating in athletics will be required to have both the student and parent sign the Athletic/Extracurricular pledge and attend one mandatory meeting per year.

Each season (fall, winter, spring) has a specific timeline for sign-ups and the return of the HCS Athletic Health Form. These timelines are clearly communicated through the school-wide announcements and through physical education classes. Failure to meet deadlines may result in exclusion for the first game/practice(s).

EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

The extracurricular program offers students many opportunities to participate in worthwhile activities which will help them develop leadership qualities and social, vocational, and cultural interests.

Anyone participating in extracurricular activities will be required to have both student and parent sign the Athletic/Extracurricular Code of Conduct pledge.

All clubs have a carefully planned system for accounting of extracurricular funds in which the books are audited each year and regular financial reports are made to the Board of Education.



MIDDLE AND HIGH SCHOOL ASAP AND ECIP

The After School Academic Program (ASAP) and Extracurricular Intervention Program (ECIP) are held Monday through Thursday from 2:25 – 3:25 pm.

In ASAP, students may use the time to work on homework or receive support. Both teacher assistance and peer tutoring are available. Students on academic contracts must attend ASAP.

ECIP is an academic eligibility program designed to help students maintain satisfactory academic standing while involved in athletics, school musical, and extracurricular activities. Students on extracurricular/athletic contracts must attend ECIP.



E.P.A. ASBESTOS MONITORING REGULATIONS

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency's Asbestos Containing Material in Schools Regulations took effect in December 1987. Holland Central School has had its buildings inspected for asbestos containing building materials and continually monitors each building for the presence of asbestos. A management plan was developed for the district and is on file in the superintendent's office. Results on the testing and a plan to manage asbestos containing building materials were submitted to the State Education Department.

Through a variety of capital projects that have been completed in past school years, the district has addressed many asbestos issues, but materials containing asbestos are still present in buildings. Periodic inspection of the condition of any known and identified asbestos material(s) is done by trained staff to monitor any changes or damage to the area.

MESSAGING SYSTEM

When it is deemed necessary to close schools due to weather, you will receive an electronic message via Parent Square. Parent Square is also used to follow up on student absences and notify families of upcoming events. Parents can supply the school with multiple telephone contact numbers, email, or texting information.

HOLLAND PARENT/TEACHER ORGANIZATION

The Holland PTO is a service organization established to benefit all student attending Holland Central Schools. Members, who are parents, teachers, and community volunteers, organize various fundraisers and events throughout the school year. Membership dues are \$5.00 per family.
