What is Dual Enrollment?

- ▶ The Dual Enrollment program is an opportunity for qualified high school students to earn college credits. The student is “dually” enrolled in high school and in college. The student can be a full time or part time college student.
- ▶ The student earns college credits as well as high school credits needed for graduation.

Current funding cap for students: 30 credit hours during high school (traditional program)

TRAITS OF SUCCESSFUL DE STUDENTS



Check emails from college and high school daily & reply/respond/take action on items needing attention



Possess problem solving skills, communication skills, time management skills, and organizational skills



Meet deadlines



Possess follow-through & persistence



Avoid procrastinating to apply to DE college and register for classes, turn in required forms to HS and DE college

OBSERVATIONS by Dr. K

- ▶ Success for students who do DE with a friend or sibling

 - Students with IEPs and 504 Plans (recommend use of postsecondary institution's disability support service after student applies and accepted to the college, see Dr. K for more info)

2 Types of GA DE Programs: an either/or choice

- ▶ **Traditional** (students can enroll at participating private or public institutions in Georgia)

OR

- ▶ **Accelerated Careers** (best for students pursuing a program at a local state technical college of Georgia (TSG) who will not attend a 4-year college after high school graduation)

- ▶ A student may apply to attend any participating public college, private college, or technical college in Georgia.

DE Programs: TRADITIONAL

- ▶ Traditional dual enrollment students (DE) will complete required End of Course assessments
- ▶ A traditional DE student cannot take more than 15 semester or 12 quarter hours each semesters (funding maximum).
- ▶ DE Funding limited to 11th & 12th grade students (10th grade students must meet criteria).
- ▶ Some graduation requirements will be completed through DE courses, they can be taken at the DE college (example: ENGL 1101 counts as 12th ELA)

DE Programs: TRADITIONAL

- ▶ Students in 10th grade may enroll in approved Career, Technical, & Agricultural Education (CTAE) courses at a participating TCSG institution only (ex: GTC)
- ▶ Students in the 10th grade with a minimum SAT score of 1200 or minimum ACT composite score of 26 in a single test administration, taken prior to the terms of enrollment, may enroll in any approved DE course at a TSCG, USG or private eligible participating postsecondary institution.



DE Programs: TRADITIONAL

- ▶ Traditional DE students are subject to the DE funding cap of 30 hours (set by the state of GA, House Bill 444).
- ▶ Traditional DE students can self-pay for additional courses

DE Programs: ACCELERATED CAREERS

- ▶ Students can graduate with their high school diploma while being exempt from specific academic course requirements.
- ▶ ACCELERATED CAREERS are **NOT** subject to the 30 hour funding cap.

DE Programs: ACCELERATED CAREERS

- ▶ Students must complete specific courses during their 9th and 10th grade years.
- ▶ Students choose to simultaneously earn a HS diploma **AND** (a) a college associate's degree; (b) Technical diploma; or two (2) Technical Certificates of Credit (TCCs) in a specific career pathway.
- ▶ Students must work closely with their counselor and postsecondary staff to ensure they meet both the high school and college graduation requirements.

DE Programs: ACCELERATED CAREERS

- ▶ Students must take & pass the following high school courses to enter the AC path:
 - Two English courses, one being American Literature
 - Two mathematics courses, one being Algebra I
 - Two science courses, one being Biology
 - Two social studies courses, one being American Gov & one being Personal Finance & Economics
 - One health and one physical education course



Accelerated Career dual enrollment students can simultaneously earn a high school diploma AND (1) any college Associates Degree or (2) any college diploma or (3) two approved certificates.

Required high school courses include:

- 2 English, 2 Math, 2 Science, 2 Social Studies, 1 Health/PE
- Courses can be completed through dual enrollment or through the high school

Required college program of study:

- Any Associates Degree or
- Any Diploma
- One of the following Certificate Groups:
 - **Automotive: 6 classes total – 2 semesters**
Auto Electrical Systems Tech (Program code AE41)
and pick one of the following:
Chassis Technician Specialist (Program code ASG1)
Climate Control System (Program code AH21)
Engine Performance Technician (Program code AE51)
**Students must be 16 years old by the beginning of the semester for all certificates*
 - **Drafting/CAD: 5 classes total – 3 semesters**
Drafters Assistant (Program code DA31)
CAD Operator (Program code CP41)
 - **Early Childhood Education: 5 classes total – 3 semesters**
Early Childhood Care and Education Basics (Program code EC31)
Child Development Specialist (Program code CD61)
**Student must be 18 years old when taking the last class ECCE 1121*
 - **Welding: 4 classes total – 2 semesters**
Gas Metal Arc Welder (Program code GM31)
Gas Tungsten Arc Welder (Program code GTA1)
**Students must be 16 years old by the beginning of the semester for both certificates*

Be advised:



Archer HS does not provide dual enrollment classes on campus/at Archer HS.



GCPS and Archer HS do not provide transportation to the DE college campus.



Archer HS students must have an Archer parking pass (see attendance office) or consistent daily transportation/pick up from Archer HS or drop off to Archer HS.



Online DE classes cannot be taken at Archer HS, must be off-campus to take those courses.

Who Can Participate?

(students need to be on track with high school credits for graduation)

- ▶ 9th graders and 5th year seniors are not eligible per state of GA
- ▶ 10th graders: eligible students may enroll in approved CTAE courses listed on the DE Course Directory (GA Futures.org) at a participating TCSG institution only and meet SAT/ACT test score criteria.
- ▶ 11th/12th graders: eligible students may take any approved dual enrollment courses listed on the DE Course Directory at an eligible PSI (USG, TCSG, or private).
- ▶ DE Funding Cap is 30 semester or 45 quarter hours for the traditional DE program. Accelerated Diploma Program has no cap.
- ▶ No residency or citizenship requirement.
- ▶ Student must maintain "Satisfactory Academic Progress" at the DE college.

TRANSFER CREDIT INFO

- ▶ It is the student's responsibility to talk with colleges regarding their policies on accepting transfer credit (AP and/or DE).
- ▶ Colleges granting transfer credit will require a transcript from the DE college (student requests this via DE college registrar's office).
- ▶ If the DE college requires the student to pick a "major", best to select "general studies".
- ▶ See [GA TRANSFER](#) for more info.

HOW DOES GRADING WORK?

- ▶ Colleges provide the high school with letter grades, & the high school will transcribe the letter grade to the midpoint of the GCPS grading scale.
- ▶ If the DE college has a GPA grading scale on the transcript....
A=95, B=85, C=75, D=70, F=55
- ▶ If the DE college DOES NOT have a numeric grading scale on the transcript...
A=95, B=85, C=75, D=72, F=55
- ▶ No points added to the final grade (exclusion: GA Tech Distance Math, 10 points added).
- ▶ All DE courses will be included on the HS transcript—even D's and F's.
- ▶ If a student withdraws from a course, they will receive a "Z" grade.

CREDIT CONVERSION



1-2 semester hour college course = .50 HS credit



3-5 semester hour college course = 1.0 HS credit



Note: Science labs will receive a grade, but NO credit on the transcript. They will not count toward fourth science requirement.



Students earn a .50 boost for DE courses on their HOPE transcript...but only for B's, C's, and D's (A's are ineligible for .50 boost since DE grades are on a 4.0 scale)

COLLEGE END OF TERM GRADES

- ▶ If the student wants the higher grade on their high school transcript, they need to request that their DE professor send documentation of the actual grade, if higher than it would be transcribed for GCPS (Ex: anything above a 75, 85, or 95); i.e., an email or something on letterhead, and send to the high school dual enrollment coordinator.
- ▶ We defer to the policy of the DE college on this. Some DE colleges will decline the student's request for this.

BE AWARE:

- ▶ It is the student's responsibility to register for the correct classes as advised by AHS school counselors.
- ▶ The student is responsible for ALL interaction with the college. The college will not speak with a parent or the HS counselor re: the student
- ▶ Holidays such as Spring Break may be different from the GCPS holidays.
- ▶ For GHSA Eligibility, Fall transcripts must be at the high school by January 4, 2024.
- ▶ American Literature EOC is required

Policy on withdrawing from a DE Course

1604.7. Course Withdrawals and Retaking a Course.

1. A student becomes ineligible to continue receiving Dual Enrollment program funding after his or her second (2nd) course withdrawal from an approved Dual Enrollment course(s), occurring Summer term 2020 or later, regardless of the total Paid Hours or Funding Cap calculation.
 - a. Lab component corequisite courses, when withdrawn in the same term as the lecture/classroom course, is considered as one course withdrawal.
2. A student is ineligible to receive Dual Enrollment funding to repeat or retake a Dual Enrollment course for which Dual Enrollment funding was received Summer term 2020 or later, regardless of the total Paid Hours or Funding Cap calculation, unless an Exception is granted in accordance with Section 1615.2.

For Seniors... BE AWARE:

SENIORS/CLASS OF 2025:

Your first semester as a DE student SHOULD NOT BE during the semester you graduate high school (Spring semester).

Much more pressure to keep up your GPA and meet all GCPS high school graduation requirements. If you pursue DE, please plan on participating Fall AND Spring semesters.

REQUIREMENTS TO PARTICIPATE

- ▶ Student must be enrolled in & physically attending a participating public or private school or be in an eligible home study program.
- ▶ Parent/student complete required GCPS and Archer HS DE forms and complete the Dual Enrollment Funding Application on Gafutures.org
- ▶ Student must have completed the DE college admission process and been accepted & approved by the participating PSI.
- ▶ All DE college work must be completed prior to graduation.
- ▶ Students can be denied participation for violation of high school and DE college rules.

PART-TIME vs. FULL-TIME

- ▶ Combo of classes at Archer & the DE college
 - ▶ Example:
 - *Periods 1-4: at Archer
 - *Exit to college after 4th
 - *Take 2 DE college classes after 12pm
 - ▶ Note: Archer classes NOT offered every period of the day
 - ▶ Max of 6 total courses
- ▶ No classes at Archer; attend minimum of 4 college classes EACH semester
 - ▶ Must earn 2.5 credits per semester to participate in Archer HS athletics
 - ▶ May enter Archer HS campus 2:30pm and after for clubs, athletics, etc.

Archer HS DE program DEADLINES

Students must complete required GCPS and AHS DE paperwork by the following dates:

Summer/Fall 2024: Deadline: March 29, 2024

Spring 2025: Deadline: October 18, 2024

College deadlines are later, but students must meet Archer HS's deadlines for DE participation.

AHS DE POLICIES/PROCEDURES

1. Attend Dec. 12th DE Information Meeting or view slides in eCLASS
2. Student completes the 24-25 AHS Dual Enrollment Information Google Form; this will cue student's assigned counselor to meet with them to review CHS202 form and remaining credits for HS graduation.
3. Student and parent complete GCPS DE Permission Form for Summer, Fall, and Spring semesters; GCPS EOC/Milestones Form, & Archer HS DE Contract SY 24-25. Drop off in AHS Counseling office or email to:

4. Student attends a mandatory DE student advisement group meeting in Feb or March 2024 (details updated in Jan 2024 in eCLASS-Archer HS Counseling Corner—Dual Enrollment

AHS DE POLICIES/PROCEDURES

5. Student applies & receives acceptance to the DE PSI as a DE student. Student is responsible to follow DE college application procedures, meet all deadlines, submit required documents, official test scores, sign up for required test, etc.
6. Once admitted to the college's DE program, student attends DE college orientation/advising appointment with DE college advisor and registers for DE college courses.
7. Student and parent complete 1 DE Funding Application on GAfutures.org every FEBRUARY.
8. Student uploads copy of DE college schedule before FALL (May-July) and before SPRING (October-December) semesters so Archer schedule can be adjusted: eCLASS-AHS Counseling Corner-Dual Enrollment-SY 24-25—DE Schedule Adjustment Form 24-25 (Google form)

AHS DE POLICIES/PROCEDURES

9. College transcript must be turned into Archer HS Counseling before end of semester. If DE college transcript not ready until after GCPS semester ends, student needs to email screenshot of semester final course grades to 511.DualEnrollment@gcpsk12.org

--Note that this unofficial DE college grade is a "placeholder" grade, and transcribed as GCPS outlines on the previous slides. Ex: if grade is an "A" but technically a 97 in the course, it will be transcribed as a 95. If the grade the student submits is different from the grade DE college final transcript, the student's semester grade/high school transcript will be amended.

Dual Enrollment students are responsible for completing ALL high school graduation requirements to participate in the graduation ceremony.

IMPORTANCE OF GA FUTURES and ACCURATE STUDENT DATA

- ▶ GCPS does "data transfers" only a few times per year to GA Student Finance Commission/GA Futures.
- ▶ If a student has NO social security number on file at GCPS, their GA Futures student will not work properly(student will not be able to send electronic transcripts to a GA college/university).
- ▶ Check with child's Archer HS school counselor for more info if this is a future issue.
- ▶ When student is creating a GA Futures account and DE college account, all data needs to be accurate (birth certificate/SSN/name, current high school name)

WHO QUALIFIES FOR DUAL ENROLLMENT AT GGC

Dual Enrollment Admission Criteria For Spring 2024, Summer 2024, and Fall 2024

- By the first day of semester at GGC:
 - must be 16 years of age
 - must be an 11th or 12th grade student
- Be on-track for completing all high school graduation requirements
- Be on-track for completing the USG's Required High School Curriculum (RHSC)
- Have a 3.25 High School GPA as calculated by GGC Admissions on the RHSC courses completed
- Meet GSFC's Dual Enrollment funding Program eligibility (details on [GAfutures](https://gafutures.org) site: gafutures.org)

WHO QUALIFIES FOR DUAL ENROLLMENT AT GGC

Test Scores (Not required for admission to DE but can be submitted)

Test Scores

- English
 - SAT Evidence Based Reading and Writing: 500
 - ACT English or Reading: 21
 - Accuplacer WritePlacer: 4 and Reading Comprehension: 237

 - **OR**

- Math
 - SAT Math: 510
 - ACT Math: 20
 - Accuplacer Quantitative Reasoning, Algebra, and Statistics: 266

Students who do not attend a regionally accredited high school or home school program are required to submit a Home School Portfolio.

2. Review Admission Requirements
3. Submit Document Requirements
4. Meet with your high school counselor so they can begin the approval process on the high school side.

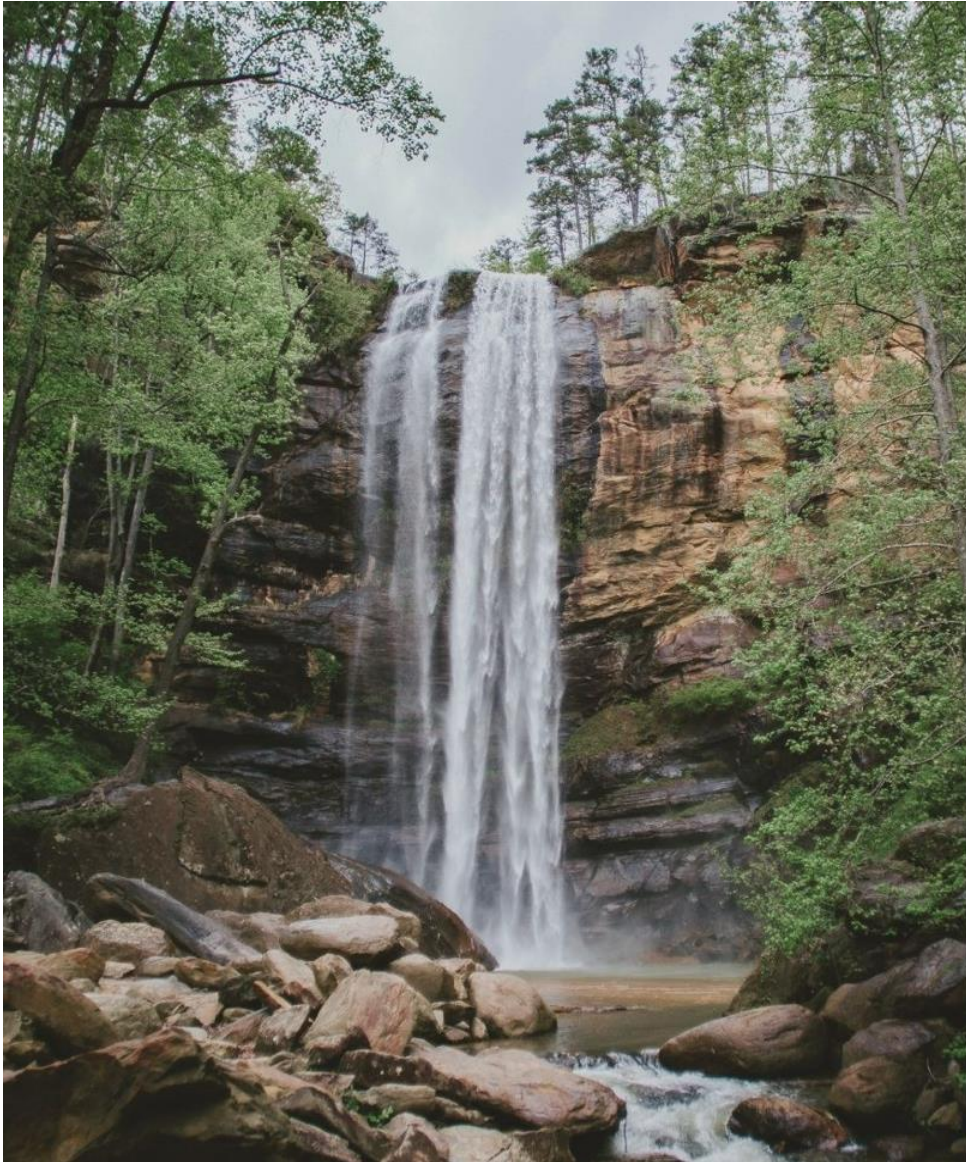
