GAVS Credit Recovery

The purpose of the Credit Recovery initiative, as presented by the GaDOE through Georgia Virtual Learning, is to provide online course access to Georgia students for the purpose of earning credit for a course that a student has not been academically successful. The coursework provided by the Georgia Credit Recovery will reach out to students in need of Credit Recovery and engage them in challenging; highly motivational classes that will help them get back on track. **Credit Recovery is not accepted by NCAA**.

Participation Requirements

Students must have taken the course previously and scored between a 60% and 69% for a final grade.

Cost:

The program is offered at no charge to Georgia public high schools who choose to participate. While all first time enrollments are free of charge for all Georgia public high school students, there is a \$25 re-enrollment fee for any public school student who needs to be enrolled into a credit recovery course more than one time.

About the Courses

The Georgia Credit Recovery Program provides online (web based) access and instruction to Georgia students registered for a Credit Recovery course.

- 1. Students take a pretest at the beginning of each unit. If that score is 85% or higher, the student is allowed to proceed directly to that unit's post-test.
- 2. If the pretest score is less than 85%, the student must view every content item in the unit. When all items have been completed, the post test will be available to the student.
- 3. In order to move out of one unit into the next, the student must score a 70% or higher on the unit post-test.
- 4. Only unit post-tests/final exams/EOC assessments are recorded in the final grade. Students must complete the entire course and the final exam or EOC to receive credit for the course.

Program Requirements

- 1. Students must log in within ten days of enrollment.
- 2. Students must complete the course in 26 weeks.
- 3. All post-tests and final exams must be proctored at Gwinnett Online Campus on a testing day (Wednesdays from 9:30- 11:30 in the Productivity Center).
- 4. If the course requires an EOC test, students must retake the test at the end of the credit recovery course. This test will be scheduled through the testing coordinator at GOC.
