



Hazard, Kentucky Service Trip: March 22 - 28, 2025

Mission

We will work through Reach Global Crisis Response. We will assist in disaster relief from the July 2022 Eastern Kentucky floods that killed 45 people and displaced thousands of others. We will prepare to minister through construction, friendship, evangelism, and worship.

Goals

- To live out your faith by working hard, constructing and/or repairing damaged homes.
- To listen to homeowners share their stories.
- To pray, serve, love, and share the gospel.
- To deepen our personal relationship with our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, through the process of serving.

Itinerary

March 22	Fly to Kentucky. Drive rental vans to the camp and check in at the host site in Hazard, Kentucky.
March 23-27	Minister at work sites 9:00 a.m. – 4:00 p.m. Devotions and free time.
March 28	Leave camp in the morning. Drive vans to the airport and fly home.

Accommodations/Food

We will be staying at a local church in a bunkhouse. There will be separate boys' and girls' dormitories with full bathrooms. Our host, Reach Global Crisis Response, provides all meals (breakfast, sack lunch, dinner) on all work days. On travel days, students will be responsible for their own meals.

Cost - \$1,725

The cost for this trip covers roundtrip airfare, van rentals, meals, and lodging. Meals on travel days will be an additional expense.

Application Process

The Hazard, Kentucky Service trip is open to all High School Students. To apply, please submit the 2025 Service Trip Online Application. The 2025 Service Trip Application is for current full-time students only. The application link will be posted in Canvas in the Grade Level Classrooms. Applications will only be accepted during the following time frame: Thursday, August 29, 3:00PM, through Tuesday, September 10, 11:59PM.

Selection Process

The team will consist of a maximum of 16 students, plus 4 adult chaperones. After applications are submitted, participants will be selected based on trip-specific criteria. Applicants must be open to being challenged and stretched outside of their comfort zone while maintaining a positive attitude. For the Hazard, Kentucky trip, priority will not automatically be given based on grade level. All applicants will be notified of their placement on October 11.
