Visible Learning, based on the groundbreaking research of Professor John Hattie, is a comprehensive framework that focuses on making learning visible to both teachers and students. The key idea is that when teachers clearly understand what impacts student learning the most, they can be more effective in their teaching strategies.

#### **Key Components of Visible Learning**:

- 1. Clear Learning Intentions and Success Criteria: Teachers will clearly communicate what students are expected to learn and how they can demonstrate their understanding. This transparency helps students understand their learning goals and what success looks like.
- 2. Feedback: Effective feedback is crucial. It helps students understand their progress and what they need to do to improve. Feedback will be timely, specific, and constructive.
- 3. Student Self-Assessment: We encourage students to take an active role in their learning by reflecting on their progress and setting personal learning goals. This promotes self-regulation and a growth mindset.
- 4. Teacher Clarity and Expertise: Our teachers are continually developing their expertise and clarity in instruction. This ensures that teaching methods are based on evidence and best practices that have the highest impact on student learning.

#### **Benefits for Your Child:**

## **School Marathon**

What is the School Marathon? Students have the opportunity to run or walk a total of 26.2 miles (131 laps) for 8 weeks. Students will earn prizes for completing 5, 10, 15, 20, and 26.2 miles.

When does it Start? The marathon began August 19 and ends October 10.

**The Details**. Students run or walk laps around the track on the playground each morning at 8 a.m. Students still must come through their designated morning entrances and then walk out to the playground.

Students that eat breakfast at school, will eat their breakfast first and then will begin their laps. Students may also complete laps during their recess each day if they choose. Some mornings we will have special guests to walk with us.

## **Steps to Success: Communicating with Your Child's School**

We strive to be the best place to learn. The only way we can improve is to know about concerns so we are able to address them. Here are some tips for communicating with your child's school when concerns arise.

The fastest way to a positive result is to start with the people closest to the situation in the school. Talk with the teacher or coach about your questions and concerns before going to the principal.

Parents and guardians are encouraged to reach out to teachers and school staff by:

·Calling the school's phone number. Because they are teaching, you often will need to leave a message for your child's teacher or coach.

·Emailing the teacher or coach directly. All teacher emails are available on our school website.

We want to be responsive to parents' questions and requests for information. Our staff will respond to your call or email as soon as possible, in most cases within 2 school days.

If you have had a conversation with your child's teacher and the principal and are still needing assistance, the director of elementary or secondary programs will be able to provide additional support.

We are excited for this new school year and look forward to partnering with you to support a great school experience for your student.



As part of our commitment to transparency and providing the best education for your children, we want to remind you of your rights under Title I. ## Help Your Child Fall in Love with Reading!



Below are fun family activities to help you promote a culture of reading in your home.

#### Play board games together.

Games such as Apples to Apples, Hedbanz, Sequence Letters, Scrabble, Boggle, Tall Tales, Bananagrams, or Zingo are fun for everyone. Practicing sounds, letters, and words will help with reading!



#### Play games as you travel.

Look for letters on signs or license plates. Play "I spy" with sounds—I spy something that has the "ch" sound.

#### Use art to learn letters and words.

Use sidewalk chalk to draw pictures and label them. Practice writing letters and words. Use magnetic letters on a cookie sheet to build words and practice sounds. Use those same magnets on the fridge to play "Change a Word" by moving beginning, middle and ending sounds to create new words.



#### Read together and talk about what was read.

Oral language, vocabulary, and knowledge about the world are some of the best predictors of reading success. Reading and talking about the characters, events, or information in the book develops these necessary skills for your child. Audio books can also be used. Letting your child both ask and answer questions and having discussions about reading is time well spent!

## **Back-to-School Health Tips**



Here are a few back-to-school tips to make your kids' educational experience healthier.

#### Well-child exams

A well-child exam is a comprehensive health check up for children of all ages. The exam includes a sports physical for student athletes and looks at many aspects of health for all kids.

For young children, providers evaluate where your child ranks based on age-appropriate developmental milestones. The healthcare team will also use the time to update immunizations if needed.

#### **Vaccinations**

Vaccinations are vital in order to keep children healthy, especially young children. Vaccinations are safe and can be administered in groups if your child is behind schedule. Receiving vaccinations helps keep your child and his or her classmates safe.

Leading health care providers and the CDC recommend these vaccinations:

Diphtheria/tetanus/pertussis Meningococcal

Haemophilus influenza B MMR

Hepatitis A Pneumococcal

Hepatitis B Polio

Human papilloma virus Rotavirus

Influenza

Talk with your healthcare provider about vaccines and any concerns you may have.

#### **Nutrition**

Eating nutritiously is integral to overall health for people of all ages, including children. However, children do need different amounts of nutrients based on age. Check the Dietary Guidelines for Americans to help measure the specific nutrient levels needed for your children.

Nutrient-heavy foods that should be incorporated into your children's diets include:

Dairy Protein
Fruits Vegetables

Grains



In the whirlwind that is school preparation, be sure to emphasize health. Use the above elements to create a plan that will support the improvement and sustainability of your child's well-being.
