Notes for Attending Athletic Contests

- Parking- Please make sure you park in a parking space without blocking traffic or other parked cars. If you are park on grass or blocking a roadway or another parked car you are subject to being towed at vehicle owner's expense.
- ALL Fans will enter through the Main Entrance of the Stadium by the School Café/Bus Ramp or the athletic entrance for Volleyball.
- Concession Stand will be open. NO OUTSIDE FOOD OR DRINK will be allowed into the stadium or as you enter our Athletic Entrance. This includes brining in drinkware.-
- Fans should not come onto the field and stay outside the fenced area/track parents/fans please wait outside the track area or off the volleyball courts.-
- Fans will not be screened but we ask anyone that has been in contact with someone that tested positive for Covid 19 and or has a fever, loss of taste or smell and/or has trouble breathing and/or other signs of Covid 19 not come to the game.
- No pets are allowed at any BCSD athletic contest.
- The Hilton Head Island High School Athletics Staff appreciates your understanding and cooperation in keeping all involved safe throughout this fall sports season.
- Please note the guidelines above are subject to change. Any spectator who chooses not to follow the above guidelines can be asked to leave the campus immediately.
- The expectation is that all spectators and participants always promote and exercise great sportsmanship.

Clear Bag Policy

- We abide by the Clear bag/No Bag Policy at our stadium and also in our gym. Spectators must bring clear bags upon entry.
- Only bags allowed are those used for medical purposes and clutch purses not to exceed 4.5" x 6.5".
- These bags will be subject to search.

Proof of Residency

Beaufort County School District (BCSD) requires proof of residency of all students every school year. Proof of residency must be provided for a student's enrollment to be complete. The intent of this process is to verify that students attend the school based on where they reside. You must provide documentation showing that you live at the address in accordance with Federal, State, and District guidelines. If your address changes, you must notify the school within 30 calendar days. A residence is that place where one has established his/her home and where one is habitually present, and to which, when one departs, he/she intends to return. Merely superficial residence in the HHIHS zone, obtained for the sole or primary purpose of taking advantage of attending HHIHS, will not entitle the child in question to attend HHIHS.

DOCUMENTATION THAT HHIHS REQUIRES TO COMPLETE YOUR ENROLLMENT You must

provide documentation for both sections 1 and 2

Section 1

You must provide one (1) of the following documents. The document must show and match the parent/guardian and address listed above. If you are unable to provide one of the following documents, request the Alternate Proof of Residency Application.

Real Estate Tax Bill (Must be the most recent bill) Signed Lease (Dated within 1 year of the first day of attendance) Military Housing Letter Section 8 Letter

Section 2

You must provide one (1) of the following documents. The document must show and match the parent/guardian and address listed above. If you are unable to provide one of the following documents, request the Alternate Proof of Residency Application.

Utility Bill (Gas, Electric, Water/Sewer - Within last 60 days) Phone Bill (Landline only - Within last 60 days - Cell phone bills will not be accepted) Cable Bill (Within last 60 days) Current Car Insurance declaration page (Must be an active policy) Current Home or Renters insurance declaration page (Must be an active policy) Vehicle Registration (Must be for current period)

Please check and attach copies of the documents above. You should black out account and social security numbers on the documents. All documents must be current and show the name and address of the parent(s)/ guardian(s). Envelopes will not be accepted.

Notice: Parent/Guardians will be given 30 days to provide documentation of residency from the date of enrollment. A home visit may be conducted by the school's social worker or other school official if documentation is not provided within 30 days.

If it is found that a parent/guardian is knowingly or willfully providing false information to a school district regarding the residency of a child for the purpose of enabling that child to attend any school in that district, the adult can be prosecuted for providing false information, a misdemeanor with a penalty of up to \$200 or imprisonment for not more than 30 days and required to pay an amount equal to the cost of educating the child.

When completing PowerSchool Registration parents can upload Proof of Residence documents. However, it is

recommended that documents be brought to HHIHS. We will begin to accept Proof of Registration forms at the front desk on Monday July 31st. PLEASE READ THE PROOF OF RESIDENCY FORMS CAREFULLY TO AVOID NOT SUBMITTING THE CORRECT DOCUMENTS.
