PASB presents the "Legend of Sleepy Hollow"

Performing Arts School on Broadway high school students will bring the Washington Irving classic, "Legend of Sleepy Hollow," to life on **Wednesday and Thursday, Oct. 25-26, at 7 p.m. at the Mapleton Arts Center.**

The students have been preparing to tell the tale of Ichabod Crane and the Headless Horseman since the first day of the semester and took a great deal of ownership of the production. They are divided up between performers and technical crew, who handle aspects like construction design, prop painting, and costumes. A couple of innovative students are even using skills they learned outside of school to produce an ominous-sounding beat the audience will hear at the beginning of the play.


The school's curriculum pairs performing arts and rigorous academics and the school's director, Jackson Westenskow, said there are explicit connections between the play and his students' education. This includes how they learned about language arts when reading and analyzing the story or used geometry to develop sets. Each student also earned Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) certification, which they could use in theater jobs or construction fields down the road. Most importantly, he said the PASB model teaches creativity, communication, collaboration, and leadership skills.

Staff and students can't wait to show you what they've been working on. Admission to "Legend of Sleepy Hollow" is free to the public, but they will also offer tickets for purchase that will help the school pay for supplies like wood and paint for future productions.

Join the Special Education Task Force

At Mapleton Public Schools, we take great pride in our commitment to providing high-quality education for all. Central to our mission is ensuring students of all abilities thrive academically, socially, and emotionally within our classrooms. By collaboratively exploring strategies to enhance how we support students with diverse learning needs, we hope to drive the dialogue and development of innovative practices that will benefit students, families, and teachers alike.

During Negotiations in Spring 2023, MEA and District Administration agreed to form a task force, composed of certified staff who provide special education services to students with IEPs, to study and develop processes and possible solutions to special population caseload/workload issues. The charge of this group is to bring forward recommendations to the 2023-24 bargaining team.

Employees interested in serving on the Special Education Task Force must submit the <u>Special</u> Education Task Force Interest Form no later than Tuesday, Oct. 17, 2023. Serving on the Special Education Task Force is voluntary. Applicants will be asked to write a short paragraph describing their interest in serving on this task force. Individuals will be selected to ensure the task force is truly representative of all Mapleton employees who support students with IEPs, based on the following:
