In a special message to staff, the team said, "Your dedication to the education and Mapleton students is a *slam dunk*, so this special night is dedicated to expressing our gratitude for the


incredible work you do day in and day out. As a token of our appreciation, each staff member will receive a complimentary ticket for themselves and a guest."

District breaks ground on new Meadow Community School

Construction on the new Meadow Community School is underway after last week's groundbreaking ceremony! Superintendent of Schools Charlotte Ciancio, Senior Deputy Superintendent Mike Crawford, the District's Board of Education, and Meadow staff all happily dug into the dirt of the current school's baseball field with shovels after their remarks.

The new Meadow will be the first of Mapleton's "Final Four" school buildings to be rebuilt, thanks to generous community support and a \$13 million grant from Colorado's Building Excellent Schools

Today (BEST) program. The current school was constructed way back in 1962 as a K-5 and only received modest improvements through the year as necessary.

The new building will serve grades preschool through eighth grade and highlight its nature and science model with natural light, dynamic nature views, and flexible indoor and outdoor learning spaces. [Check out a "walk through" video of the school's new design!](#)

Faculty regalia orders due by this Thursday

The deadline to submit orders for faculty regalia from Jostens is this Thursday, Feb. 1.

High school faculty, use [this link](#) to order and pay for your hoods and gowns, if you haven't already. After Thursday, Jostens won't be able to accommodate orders, due to the custom nature of faculty regalia.

A limited number of gowns will be available to borrow the morning of the graduation ceremony. Hoods will not be available to borrow.

IRS forms 1095-C and 1095-B

Be on the lookout for your 1095-C form! Forms will arrive to schools and departments tomorrow via in-district mail. Form 1095-C (Employer-Provided Health Insurance Offer and Coverage) provides proof that you were offered health coverage and, if you had self-insured coverage, that you had coverage. Keep it with your W-2 forms and other tax records.

Additionally, Kaiser will no longer be mailing Form 1095-B. Form 1095-B will be mailed to subscribers from Kaiser Permanente by early February. Form 1095-B may be used to support proof of coverage on your tax filing. You may need your form to show proof of medical health plan coverage when filing your tax returns with a tax preparer. Teaching and Learning

Summer professional learning opportunity for middle and high school science teachers

Mapleton Public Schools is inviting science teachers to attend a five day Constructing Meaning Institute this June. The exact dates are not set yet, but participants will receive 35 hours toward CLD Relicensure.

Constructing Meaning (CM) is a framework that can accompany any content area and work in conjunction with any resource. It provides a replicable process for backwards mapping the language demands connected to demonstrating proficiency in grade level content.

Features of Constructing Meaning instruction include:

- Designing “backwards” from a learning goal
- “Chunking” learning for the gradual release of responsibility
- Calling attention to the cognitive function
- Explicitly teaching “brick and mortar”
- Providing frequent opportunities to practice language
- Narrowing and scaffolding text for directed reading

There has been an influx of multilingual learners into our district. This opportunity provides a way to support language development throughout content. It is our goal to have all middle and high school science teachers trained in CM as part of providing language development to all levels of multilinguals throughout the day. The June CM institute is a chance to get ahead of the learning! Additional dates will be available during the 2024-25 school year for teachers unable to make it to the June session.

Mapleton to offer two-week Newcomer Summer Institute in June

We are excited to announce that Mapleton will offer a two week Summer Institute in June designed specifically for identified newcomers going into grades 9-12.

In the first half of each day, the institute will provide instruction for newcomer-identified multilingual students. The instruction will focus on providing language development alongside content through a drone project and real-world application of skills.

In the second half of each day, the institute will focus on teacher development through collaborative job embedded professional learning. Teachers will learn effective strategies to instruct newcomer students, co-plan lessons, and reflect using formative assessments.

The professional learning will support 64 hours for CLD Relicensure. Paid by per diem per negotiated contract.

- After school professional development: Thursday, April 25, and Thursday, May 16, from 4-6 p.m.
- Institute dates: Monday, June 3-Friday, June 14, 8 a.m.-3 p.m.

Enrollment is now open for Mapleton's third Gifted and Talented professional development course of the school year, "Differentiation Using Depth and Complexity for Gifted Learners."

The first meeting will be held on **Thursday, Feb. 8, from 4:30-6:30 p.m., in the Trail Ridge Training Room** at the Administration Building. Attendance is required for this initial meeting, but all other content will be completed asynchronously via the Canvas course for a total of 22 hours of re-licensure credit.

The Depth and Complexity Framework works with all school models, content areas, grades levels, and curricular resources. It provides visual support to identify the specific thinking needed within each activity of a lesson. These supports benefit all students (e.g. multilingual learners, students receiving IEP/504 services, gifted students, and the general population). Course participants will receive a full set of Depth and Complexity Framework materials (e.g. posters, cards, magnets, flipbook, etc.).
