#### **Listening and Learning Tour**

Senior Deputy Superintendent Mike Crawford is launching a Listening and Learning tour to hear from as many families, students, staff, and community members as possible prior to taking over as Superintendent on July 1, 2024. Input gathered from the Listening



and Learning tour will be used to inform *Mapleton Momentum*, a collaboratively created two-year plan for improvement.

#### Why Momentum?

The formula for momentum is **P= M x V**, where P is Momentum, M is Mass and V is Velocity. To determine Mapleton's Momentum, or that which carries the district forward, the information gathered during the Listening and Learning tour will be used to write Mapleton's unique formula for momentum, where **P** is **Mapleton's acceleration toward fulfilling the district's mission**, **M** is **who we are**, and **V** is **what we do to make progress**.

*Mapleton Momentum* will serve as Mike's entry plan as Superintendent, and as the pre-work for Mapleton's next Strategic Plan, to be implemented in 2026.

Watch your footing! The ice and snow we woke up to yesterday could linger throughout the rest of the week due to temperatures remaining close to or below freezing. Additionally, there are several chances for snowfall this week and into next week.

#### Please remember to:

- Wear appropriate footwear, with grooves and lots of tread.
   Work and dress shoes should be carried into the building separately. Avoid wearing cowboy boots, high heels, or other footwear that does not have the appropriate tread.
- Take the best route. Follow the clearest route to your entrance, even if it is not the most direct one. Obey posted signs.
- <u>Avoid carrying items.</u> Your hands should be empty so that your arms are free for stabilization. Do not overload your arms as you would during the warmer months.
- Remember to <u>Walk Like a Penguin</u> and watch the video on tips on how to prevent falls and injury.

#### **CogAT Universal Screening (2nd and 6th Grades)**

Mapleton will administer the Cognitive Abilities Test (CogAT) for all second and sixth grade students Feb. 1-29 as part of our annual universal screening for the gifted and talented (GT) program. In addition, any other referred K-12 students are invited to participate, as long as this is coordinated through each school's GT Leads.

This week, second and sixth grade teachers and GT Leads will receive a calendar invitation for the training session to be held online, via TEAMS, with the necessary instructional documents attached. The training will take place on Thursday, Jan. 18, from 4:30-6 p.m.

It is a district expectation that all second and sixth grade classroom teachers will be the primary test administrators for their classes because they know their students best and how to maintain positive classroom management.
