If you believe you will have completed enough credit hours by Thursday, Aug. 15, to fulfill the requirements for salary advancement, please complete this <u>Intent for Salary Advancement form</u>. This link will be available until Friday, March 29. (**Please note:** this form is designed to assist the District in budgeting and planning purposes only.) This information can also be found on our website's Talent Management page, under the Salary Advancement tab.

To be considered for salary advancement for the 2024-25 school year, your official transcripts and completed salary advancement applications must be completed and submitted through Frontline Central by Thursday, Aug. 15. Salary advancement applications will be available in Frontline Central beginning Monday, April 1.

Important Reminders:

- District-paid professional development is not eligible for salary advancement.
- Please have your university send your official transcripts to <u>you</u> directly and upload them with your salary advancement application in Frontline.

New K-5 science curriculum training

Demonstration Classrooms

As a Demonstration Classroom teacher, Nicole DiPaolo (4th grade at Explore PK-8) is *responding flexibly to students* by actively monitoring and collecting data on the progress students are making toward reaching the learning target. Gathering this information helps teachers design their next steps to support students who may require some differentiation in how they access grade-level content.

Mapleton is looking for teachers for its Gifted and Talented Summer Camp, which will again be offered to gifted and talent pool students in grades K-7. You can apply on Frontline from the district's website, by clicking the "Careers" tab on the upper right of the homepage.

The teacher positions will be paid through a combination of extra-duty pay (pre-planning during April/May) and per diem (for the five days of the camp itself) per the negotiated contract. There will also be opportunities for high school students to earn community service hours as teacher aides.
