# Academy High School science teacher Mellissa Pfaff wins national science and energy teaching award

Congratulations to Academy High School science teacher Mellissa Pfaff for being named as one of the National Energy Education Development's (NEED) Project's 2024 Bob Thompson Excellence in Energy Awardees. The award is named for one of the nonprofit's former teachers and is given each year to a handful of teachers around the country who exemplify his "childlike wonder of science and energy."

Pfaff teaches chemistry and space science and constantly creates a curriculum to make it more interesting for her students. Her award includes a \$1,000 cash grant to spend as she wishes on her classroom, and an all-expenses paid trip to NEED's annual National Energy Conference for Educators this July in Philadelphia.

## Teachers, please complete the Collaborative Structures Survey by Friday, March 15

All teachers: Please complete the Collaborative Structures Survey by Friday, March 15.

This survey is intended to gauge how people are implementing and responding to the collaborative structures within Mapleton, Instructional Design Teams (IDT), and Instructional Leadership Teams (ILT). The first section references the Instructional Design Teams that are built into the school day on a weekly basis, and the second section references your school's Instructional Leadership Team and its impact on your school. This survey data provides guidance for the system around support and next steps needed in collaborative structures.

### Summer Training: Supporting Tier 1 instruction with embedded language support

In order to support our growing population of multilingual learners with embedded language support in Tier 1, all Mapleton grade 6-12 science teachers will receive training in <u>E.L. Achieve</u>: <u>Constructing Meaning</u>. "Constructing Meaning" is explicit language instruction to support grade-level content learning in English.

Analysis of the language demands becomes part of lesson planning so that both language and content goals are considered. It occurs throughout the day, across all subject areas. Subject-specific language is differentiated by students' English proficiency levels so each student is equipped to think, discuss, read, and write to the lesson goals.

Because four years of high school science credit is required, it made sense for this training to start with science teachers to ensure students would get as much language support embedded in the content as possible at the onset. There will be two opportunities for this training:

- June cohort: June 3, 4, 5, 6, and 7 (full days)
- Five full days of release time to attend the second cohort during the contract year where a substitute will be provided.

#### **Interim Quarter 3 After-Action Review**
