Get ready! Open enrollment begins tomorrow, Wednesday, May 1

Open enrollment is the annual period in which benefit-eligible employees may:

- Review benefits to ensure plans are meeting their needs.
- Enroll in coverage.
- Change plans.
- Add/drop dependents.
- Drop coverage.

Open enrollment for the 2024-25 plan year is Wednesday, May 1 – Tuesday, May 14. All changes made during open enrollment are effective July 1, 2024.

Please review the information below carefully for important information about open enrollment.

Enrollment: Whether you plan to make changes to your benefits or continue with the same benefits, you **must** log onto the <u>employee portal</u> to review and approve your plans. The Employee Portal will open on Wednesday, May 1. **More information about rates and updated iVisions links are available on Mapleton's** <u>Benefits page</u>.

An important note about rate increases effective July 1, 2024

Kaiser has informed Mapleton that our plans will incur a 15% increase in healthcare costs to operate the plan. While this is not what we had anticipated, Mapleton is committed to providing comprehensive health coverage while mitigating any financial strain on our employees. Additionally,

Mapleton will ensure that no employee experiences a reduction in their total take-home pay as a result of the increase in healthcare cost.

- Mapleton will absorb 2/3 of the total increase.
- The employee group will absorb the remaining 1/3 increase.

Flexible Spending Accounts (FSAs) – ACTION IS REQUIRED EVERY YEAR

- <u>FSAs</u> require an active election each year. If you wish to participate you must make your election during open enrollment for the plan year July 1, 2024, through June 30, 2025.
- Healthcare Flexible Spending annual maximum of \$3,200
- Maximum healthcare flexible spending carryover amount to 2025 is \$640
- Dependent Care Flexible Spending annual maximum of \$5,000 or \$2,500 if married, filing separately.

VSP: 2024-25 New Enhancements added to the vision benefits.

- Frame allowance is \$150 for both plans.
- <u>Enhanced Featured Frame</u> for both plans Additional \$50 for featured frame brands.
- <u>VSP LightCare</u> members can use both their frame and lens benefit toward non-prescription sunglasses or non-prescription blue-light filtering glasses.
- VSP Option 2: Choose your upgrade frame allowance increase to \$250.

MESA student wins T-shirt design contest for national conference

Congratulations to the Mapleton Expeditionary School of the Arts (MESA) Technology Student Association (TSA) for their outstanding results at the Association's state conference, held in late February, in Denver. This was the first time MESA participated in the conference, and every project they submitted made it at least to the semifinals of their respective categories, and one project won a state title!



The TSA is a national organization of students engaged in STEM (science, technology, engineering, and mathematics). For championship events, members produce projects that apply technology, from drones and robots to movies and graphic design. MESA's club earned second place overall in the silent movie category. Sophomore Michaela D. won for her graphic T-shirt design, which depicts the state's mountains and was voted on by students at the conference.

Now the more than 250 Colorado students who qualified to compete at the National TSA Conference will be wearing the shirt Michaela designed at the event. Michaela said she was excited to win.

All four of MESA's small but mighty team of students: Jordyn W., Ezmeralda M., Amanda A., and Michaela, qualified for the National Conference, which will be held in Orlando in late June.
