Mapleton has four dedicated Nurse Consultants from the Children's Hospital Colorado School Health Team who are led by our Lead District Nurse, Monica Ycaza MSN, RN. All nurses support Mapleton's 16 health assistants and health offices that serve students with chronic, acute and emergent needs.



The nurses provide consultation, medication administration, and complex care within the school setting so students can thrive and learn. The team helps maintain safety through activities like staff training, screenings and immunizations and bridges resources for student between hospitals, clinics, mental health, and other community partners.

School Lunch Hero Day was last Friday

Last Friday was School Lunch Hero Day for our dedicated Nutrition Staff. This is a day to celebrate all school nutrition professionals, who work tirelessly to ensure all the meals they serve meet rigorous nutrition standards, are appealing to students, and reflect the culture of their communities.

We talked to Lindsay Hull, Mapleton's Nutrition Services Director, to learn a little more about her team and the lunches they make.

Lindsay, how many lunches does your team prepare every year?

"They make about 700,000 lunches every year for students at all 19 of our brick-and-mortar schools. That's about 4,000 a day – and that's after they make breakfasts!"

What are some of our students' favorite meals?

"I would have to say our popcorn penne alfredo is pretty popular. So are the nachos, chicken and waffles, and orange chicken with rice. And we can't forget about our popcorn chicken bowl or

How do you ensure the meals meet nutritional standards and dietary needs while still appealing to students?

"It's a fine balance. Our priority is to provide excellent customer service, so we strive to provide options that kids find appealing and meet their personal needs. As we create and test new ideas, we ensure that those items meet the requirements and fit in with the other options we provide. And we try to add new menu items every year to keep things fresh."

How do school lunch heroes contribute to the well-being and academic success of students?

"Numerous studies have been linked to students performing better when they've eaten. The meal pattern regulations must be met, and they are strict standards. Students who eat breakfast with us get a start on their day by fueling their bodies so they can fuel their minds. Students who eat breakfast have improved attendance, behavior, academic performance, and academic achievement. Then, students who eat lunch with us will find a variety of fresh fruits and vegetables on our salad bar, three entrée choices for grades K-8, and five entrée choices for grades 9-12 every day, so they can go back to learning. We prioritize sourcing clean label ingredients where possible, which further enhances the quality of the food we offer."

What do your staff like most about their jobs?

"They love serving the kids healthy meals and seeing smiles on their faces when they come through the line."

What do you hope students and the community understand or appreciate about the work that you and your team do?

"The food is made with love, most importantly. We also strive to offer local fresh food where we can, offer variety, salad bars, provide scratch-cooked options, and chef-driven meals, all on a budget! Also, we genuinely love what we do and are passionate about child nutrition."

Enrollment: Whether you plan to make changes to your benefits or continue with the same benefits, you **must** log onto the <u>employee portal</u> to review and approve your plans. Flexible Spending Accounts (FSAs) – ACTION IS REQUIRED EVERY YEAR

- <u>FSAs</u> require an active election each year. If you wish to participate you must make your election during open enrollment for the plan year July 1, 2024, through June 30, 2025.
- Healthcare Flexible Spending annual maximum of \$3,200
- Maximum healthcare flexible spending carryover amount to 2025 is \$640
- Dependent Care Flexible Spending annual maximum of \$5,000 or \$2,500 if married, filing separately.

Requests for Sick Leave Pay-Out are now available in Frontline Central

Licensed staff: Requests for Sick Leave Pay-Out are now available in Frontline Central. To access the Sick Leave Pay-Out request form, please follow the instructions below.

- 1. Log into your Frontline Central account.
- 2. Go to My Forms, then Forms I Can Start.
- 3. Scroll to the Licensed Sick Leave Pay Out Request Form
- 4. Click on Start this Form to complete

Per the guidelines of the 2023-24 MEA Agreement, Article 17, the Board and Association recognize the importance of instructional continuity to long-term academic success for students. To promote this goal, teachers can submit for payment up to five (5) unused sick leave days at the end of the school year using the following table:

DAYS USED RATE

- 0-1: \$180.00/day
- 2-3: \$160.00/day

Payout is to be in June of each year. Teachers must carry forward a minimum of five (5) sick leave days into the next academic year.

*Days donated to the sick bank do not count as a use of leave days for the purposes of buyback. You may access the MEA Agreement here: <u>MEA Agreement</u>

All requests must be completed in Frontline Central by <u>4 p.m. on Wednesday, May 22, 2024</u>. Approved payouts will be included in your direct deposit paycheck on June 30, 2024.
