### A message from Superintendent Mike Crawford

All,

As we welcome our students back to school, I thank you for ensuring they start the year feeling a true sense of belonging in Mapleton. As I mentioned on Opening Day, our momentum depends on the strength of our collective force— our mass – who we are,



what we bring to our work, and our organizational culture. ### Help families submit their 2024-25 meal benefit application

All Mapleton students have access to healthy, nutritious school meals at no cost thanks to the Healthy School Meals for All program approved by Colorado voters. While meals are available at no cost, it is still important for all families to submit a meal benefit application for the 2024-25 school year.

### Why should families submit their 2024-25 meal benefit application?

When families complete their <u>2024-25 meal benefit application</u>, they receive access to additional resources, including:

- Opportunities for school-related fee waivers
- Discounted internet, phone, and utility services
- SNAP, TANF, Medicaid, or FDPRI

Schools receive benefits, too, including funds for:

- Classroom resources (from books to technology to teachers!)
- · Before and after school enrichment activities
- Health and wellness services

Submitting the meal benefit application is safe and can be completed online in minutes. All application information remains private and confidential and will not be shared or used for any other purpose. Only one form is needed per family.

### Nearly 30 teachers become Mapleton's first to attend Secondary Constructing Meaning training

This past June, 29 Mapleton teachers became the first cohort to attend a five-day training in Secondary Constructing Meaning, a framework that supports educators in teaching language alongside



content. The teachers who attended the training were incredible, demonstrating the caliber of our Mapleton educators through collaborative planning, encouraging and building upon each other's thinking, and generally being awesome at what they do!

Each day, as participants finished up, they were asked to take an exit survey ranking how valuable the day's learning was to their development as a teacher. The average rating was 4.53 out of 5! Below is what Brian Touher, a North Valley School for Young Adults science teacher, had to say about his experience:

"Thank you. I learned a lot this week. I was fully expecting another BICS/CALPS talk and this was nothing like that! Very applicable to my practice and high leverage. My students' biggest challenge is using language to communicate their learning, and this PD has been spot on to help me elicit this from our students. THANKS AGAIN!!!"

Our goal is to have all science and social studies teachers working in grades 6-12 trained in and implementing Secondary Constructing Meaning by fall 2025. If you have already registered for our fall 2024 Cohort, details of your upcoming training will be coming to you this week.
