## **HEAR Report from Interim Superintendent**

- Good evening to all joining us here at our Nutrition Center while our board room is under renovation. I am SO EXCITED to kick off the 2024/2025 school year! This is my 31st year opening schools, and it is the most special one for me as I get to open schools as our Interim Superintendent for the first time.
- We are full steam ahead and clearly focused on just TWO goals this school year: improving student outcomes and achieving operational excellence. While our system does so many remarkable things, I believe that by centering our efforts on teaching and learning, as well as customer service, we can take our growth to new heights. Let us talk briefly about how these priorities will help us make a bigger impact.
- Our students are at the heart of everything we do. By enhancing student outcomes, we ensure that every child receives the best education possible. This means refining our curriculum, expanding support services, and making certain that all students, regardless of their background, have what they need to succeed.
- Operational excellence is the foundation that supports our educational mission. By optimizing our operations and enhancing our customer service, we create an environment where teachers can teach effectively, and students can learn efficiently. This involves managing our resources wisely, investing in the professional growth of our staff, and building stronger partnerships with families and the community.
- When we concentrate on these two priorities, we channel the energy of more than 10,000 staff members and the parents of nearly 70,000 students towards what truly matters. Together, we have the power to create meaningful change and make a lasting impact.

- Now let me share some important reminders and resources as we prepare for school to start on Monday, August 19th!
  - Starting the first week of school, every Tuesday during a full 5-day week will be an early release day. Please check your school's website for the exact times. After-school programs will begin immediately after early release on Tuesdays, and bus schedules will be adjusted accordingly. This early release time provides our teachers with the necessary space to plan, learn, and connect with families.
  - We need to all remember that EVERY DAY COUNTS! We are aiming for significant academic improvements over the next two years, and to achieve this, we need students in class every day. Please try to schedule appointments and vacations outside of school hours. Students should only stay home if they have a fever over 100 degrees, or if they've experienced vomiting or diarrhea in the last 24 hours. A cough or sniffles? Bring them to school!
  - Families, please note that our after-school programs will start on Tuesday, August 20th, and run every school day from dismissal until 6 p.m. Please call your child's school to learn more. Please plan for the first day of school as the after-school program will not be in place quite yet.
  - Kindergarteners and 7th graders have certain required immunizations they need to have BEFORE starting school. To help with that we have another immunization clinic this Saturday, August 17th at Tioga Middle School from 8am to 2:30pm. These immunizations are free for students who are uninsured or on MediCal.
  - Want to know what is for breakfast and lunch? You can find the menus on our website. Simply hover over the 'Families' button and select 'Meals.' Choose your school to see the menu for the next two weeks.
  - We need you to be connected families! We encourage you to download the ParentSquare app from the Apple or Google Play store to receive updates from the district, your school, and your teachers.
  - For our families speaking a language other than English, we have you covered. Staff and families, you can call our Family Connect Line any business day between 7am and 5pm to be quickly connected to an interpreter in the language of your choice.
  - As I mentioned earlier, we are committed to providing excellent customer service. Please use our 'Let's Talk' tool anytime, 24/7, by clicking the blue 'Contact Us' button on our website to share your thoughts, concerns, or questions. Someone will get back to you quickly.
  - Finally, please visit [www.fresnounified.org](http://www.fresnounified.org) for all the back-to-school information you need. You will find details on immunizations, bus and bell schedules, FAQs, and more.
- To wrap up, I want to share a quick video! We mean it when we say we cannot wait to have you back! See you on Monday!

## BOARD/INTERIM SUPERINTENDENT COMMUNICATIONS

Board members had the opportunity for Board/Interim Superintendent communications. A summary is as follows:

**Clerk Davis** expressed gratitude to Parent University staff for the kickoff and backpack give-away, to Billy Chan and Michelle Anderson for facilitating and opening the Sunnyside Regional Literacy kickoff, and to the McLane Highlanders for hosting today's press conference. Member Davis expressed excitement for the start of the Farber Campus, and to seeing double-digit gains by students as the new school year progresses.

**Member Islas** thanked Parent University staff for the kickoff and underscored that no student or family was turned away regardless of the school district of attendance. Member Islas applauded the community-based partners that supported the Parent University event and are stepping up with their own unique backpack giveaways within Fresno Unified schools.

Member Islas shared that Norseman Elementary School will hold a Back-to-School Night on August 21 and the Fresno Airport District and the Assistance League of Fresno committed to giving 100 backpacks that evening. Member Islas thanked the Valley Christian Center and Hopeful Encounter that are stepping up to help giveaway backpacks and ice cream and Member Islas commented that this is what community looks like.

**Member Cazares** shared a welcome back to school to all parents, students, and teachers. Member Cazares shared reminders as follows: asked families to remind their children to wake up early this week and over the weekend to prepare for the first day of school on Monday, August 19, 2024; asked families to remind their children to please take off their earphones when walking to school as this will help keep them safe; asked drivers to slow down around schools; and, asked families to be cautious when dropping off or picking up students at school, don't rush through school zones, please slow down.

Member Cazares thanked all staff that provided their services over the summer and thanked fellow Board members that helped share paraprofessional hiring event information with others, and for coming together to help the Human Resources team. Member Cazares thanked all high school staff that put in extra effort during the summer to help create a smooth transition back to school for all ninth through twelve grade students. Member Cazares thanked principal Martinez and the Duncan staff for helping to provide students with confidence when returning to school.

Member Cazares shared information regarding Back-to-School Nights and asked families to attend so they can meet their child's principal, teacher, and friends.

The number of licenses allows for employee turnover. Mandated training courses include Sexual Harassment and Workplace Violence Prevention; the third training course included is Ethics and Code of Conduct.

**TITLE AND SUBJECT: Adopt Waiver Request for Myra Stephanie Rubio and Zoraida Rodriguez Velasco**

**ITEM DESCRIPTION:** Included in the Board binders are two waiver requests for Myra Stephanie Rubio and Zoraida Rodriguez Velasco to serve as Deaf and Hard of Hearing Teachers. The Education Code 44225(m) allows the commission to grant waivers to fill unanticipated needs in an area deemed hard-to-fill.

Myra Stephanie Rubio and Zoraida Rodriguez Velasco hold a master's degree in Deaf Education. This is a one-year academic waiver for the 2024/25 school year. The employees are working toward passing the Reading Instruction Competence Assessment (RICA) exam, which requires special accommodation due to their disabilities (Deaf/hard of hearing). **ITEM DESCRIPTION:** Included in the Board binders is the Fresno Unified proposed 2024/25 Special Education Local Plan Area (SELPA) Local Plan. The Local Plan is comprised of four sections: contracts and certifications, governance and administration, the annual budget plan, and the annual service plan. With the exception of the governance and administration section, the remaining three must be approved by the Board annually.

On June 11, 2024, a public hearing was held at Addicott Elementary School to review all sections of the Local Plan with members of the public. Public notice of the hearing was provided in the following ways:

- Public notice of the hearing was posted at each site in English, Spanish, and Hmong.
- Announcements in English, Spanish, and Hmong on the Special Education website.
- Written public notice in the Fresno Bee on May 29, 2024, and June 09, 2024.
- A recorded message to families of students with special education services through School Messenger on June 07, 2024 and June 10, 2024.

A Board approved proposed Local Plan must be submitted to the California Department of Education (CDE). Once approved by CDE, this will become the official 2024/25 Local Plan and is expected to serve approximately 11,000 students with special education services. Delay in approving the Local Plan could jeopardize the district's Individuals with Disabilities Education Act funding. The contracts and certifications, annual budget plan, and the annual service plan sections cover the time period of July 01, 2024 through June 30, 2025. The governance and administration section were updated this year and covers the time period July 01, 2024 through June 30, 2027.







The Fresno Unified School District (FUSD), founded in 1873, is a single-district special education local plan area (SELPA) that serves a 77-square mile area which covers the city of Fresno. FUSD is the third largest school district in the State with approximately 72,000 students in attendance that include close to 11,000 students with disabilities from birth to 21 years old that qualify for those services under the IDEA (Ed. Code 56195.1(a)).

FUSD supports 66 Elementary Schools, 15 Middle Schools, 3 K-8 Schools, and 17 High Schools.

The district also supports 4 Alternative Education Sites, 4 Specialty Schools, and 3 Charter Schools; those schools are uniquely designed to provide an opportunity for students to become fully immersed in an enhanced specially designed course of study.

2. Describe the SELPA regional governance and administrative structure of the local plan. Clearly define the roles and structure of a multi-LEA governing body, or single LEA administration as applicable: [EC 56195.1(b)(1)-(3)(c); EC 56205(a)(12)]

The district's governing Board of Education provides a free and appropriate public education to all individuals with special education services on any education plan, birth through 22 years. Students who reside in the district have plans that provide progress toward college readiness, meaningful employment and practical life skills. To meet the needs of individuals with disabilities and employ staff with expertise for this purpose, the district shall serve as a special education local plan area (SELPA).

The District Superintendent or designee shall develop a Local Plan for the education of all individuals with disabilities residing in the district. The plan shall be reviewed by the Community Advisory Committee (CAC) and approved by the district's Superintendent. The FUSD SELPA shall administer a Local Plan and the allocation of funds.

**Responsibilities of the Local Governing Body:**

The SELPA is governed by the Board of Education of the Fresno Unified School District. The Board is

responsible for the special education programs operated within its jurisdiction. The Fresno Unified School District Board of Education shall:

- Exercise authority over, assume responsibility for, and be fiscally accountable for special education programs operated by the SELPA.
- Review the final draft and subsequent revisions of Section B: Governance and Administration for signature by the district's Superintendent.
- By approving the Local Plan, as applicable, enter into an agreement with other agencies participating in the Local Plan, for the purpose of delivery of regional services and programs. - Participate in the governance of the SELPA through its designated representative, the Executive Director of Special Education.
- Approve all policies related to special education necessary to implement Education Code (EC) Part 30, Sections 56000 through 56885, special education programs, et al., and EC selection provisions not included in Part 30 and governing specific areas of special education.

**Responsibilities of Local Education Agency (LEA) Administrators:**

**District's Superintendent**

The Fresno Unified SELPA has established a Community Advisory Committee (CAC) for special education. The Fresno Unified CAC is comprised of parents of students with disabilities enrolled in public or non-public schools within the Fresno Unified SELPA. CAC may include students and adults with disabilities, general education teachers, special education service providers, other school personnel within the Fresno Unified SELPA, and community stakeholders.

The Fresno Unified CAC bylaws state the purpose of the organization, officers of the committee, standing committees, composition, terms of representation and appointment, attendance and dismissal, CAC meetings and bylaw amendment process; CAC procedures are outlined in the CAC bylaws.

The CAC shall act in an advisory capacity. The recommendations of the CAC shall be directed to the Executive Director and the District Superintendent, if needed. The responsibility for action on any recommendations shall rest with the CAC Executive Committee. The Executive Director shall provide each CAC member with a copy of the currently-approved Local Plan and shall continue to provide each CAC member with a copy of any proposed amendments or revisions to the currently-approved Local Plan.

The responsibilities of the CAC shall include but not limited to:

- Advise the policy and administrative entity of the Fresno Unified SELPA regarding the development, amendment, and review the Local Plan. The entity shall review and discuss comments

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from the CAC.

- Facilitate parent training on special education programs and services, and issues as identified by members.
- Encourage community involvement in school sites.
- Support district-wide and site activities on behalf of students with special education services.

Assist in parent education and in recruiting parents and other volunteers who may contribute to the implementation of the Local Plan.

The Executive Director is responsible for providing each CAC member with a copy of any proposed

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amendments or revisions to the currently-approved Local Plan.

As a single district SELPA, the district is the Responsible Local Agency (RLA). The Board of Education is the governing board of the RLA. The responsibilities of the RLA include the following:

Receipt and allocation of regionalized services, funds, and the provision of administrative support.

- Develop and approve policies and procedures for special education programs and services provided in the SELPA, according to the Local Plan and the Board of Education's direction. Such policies and procedures shall include, but not be limited to, all areas specified in applicable sections of the Education Code.

Upon the recommendation of the Superintendent, the Board of Education, as the governing board of the RLA, is responsible for approval of the annual service and budget plans. The development of the annual service and budget plans shall coincide with the district budget process.

As a single-district SELPA, FUSD is responsible for the education of all students with special education services, including students in charter schools that are members of the SELPA, residing within the geographic area of the district.

As a single-district SELPA, FUSD is responsible for the policymaking process. Collaboration between the Fresno County Superintendent of Schools and the other SELPAs emphasizes consistent practices throughout the county.

FUSD is responsible for the hiring, supervision, evaluation, and discipline of the Executive Director and staff employed by the district in support of the plan.

The Instructional Superintendent of Special Education shall be responsible for the selection, direction, monitoring, discipline, and annual evaluation of the Executive Director; the Instructional Superintendent shall be assisted in the hiring and selection process by the district.

It is understood that this includes responsibility for any allegations of violations arising under the federal and state equal employment law.

The Executive Director is subject to the Responsible Local Agency's policies and procedures for day-to-day operations, but receives direction from, and is responsible to the Instructional Superintendent.

**SELPA Staff**  
The Instructional Superintendent shall be responsible for designating the staff to support the functioning of the district SELPA. In reviewing and approving the SELPA budgets on an annual basis, the Instructional Superintendent designates the staffing for the SELPA office upon recommendation of the Executive Director.

SELPA staff shall be employed by the Responsible Local Agency and supervised by the Executive Director according to the Responsible Local Agency's policies and practices. The Executive Director shall use a selection process that is in accordance with the law and personnel policies of the Responsible Local Agency and in support of the Local Plan.

FUSD is a single-district SELPA and is therefore governed by the FUSD Board of Education. All district staff are recruited and hired under the district policies and contractual agreements.  
Superintendent: Participates in the selection process for the Department of Special Education administration and makes hiring recommendations to the Governing Board where applicable.

Chief Academic Officer: Maintains supervisory authority over the Instructional Superintendent, Special Education.

Instructional Superintendent, Special Education: In conjunction with the Human Resources Department, the Instructional Superintendent shall use an employee selection system comprised of an interview panel that includes representation from district administration, certificated and classified staff, special education staff, community members, and parents as appropriate. The Instructional Superintendent shall assign, supervise, and evaluate special education staff, as needed.

Executive Director: Supervises special education and school psychological services staff including secretarial and operations staff. The Executive Director oversees the Local Plan and assists in recruiting,

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selecting and recommending for hire special education personnel and school psychologists. The Executive Director is also responsible for the following duties:

- Prepare the regional special education plan and State, Federal and Local reports as required.
- Monitor compliance with Federal and State laws and regulations.
- Prepare and submit State waiver requests that are needed to allow for the provision of appropriate programs and services to students with disabilities residing within the SELPA.
- Coordinate services to students with disabilities and to other local public agencies through the development of procedural handbooks, negotiation of agreements, understandings, and ongoing dialogue.
- Develop and implement a plan or providing development opportunities for staff, parents, the Community Advisory Committee, and others.
- Collect, process and report program, personnel and fiscal data related to the State evaluation of special education as specified in accordance with State and Federal laws and regulations.

Manager IIIs, Special Education Programs and Services: Supports the Regional Instruction Managers, individuals contracted to provide specialized services, on-site administrator with special education teacher evaluations, and assists in recruiting, selecting, and recommending for hire special education personnel.

Regional Instruction Managers: Recruits, selects, and recommends eligible special education candidates for hiring. Participates in the evaluation of special education personnel. Develops improvement plans, memos of concern, and letters of reprimand when necessary. Provides direct instructional program support.

b. The local method used to distribute federal and state funds to the SELPA RLA/AU and to LEAs within the SELPA: [EC 56205(a)12(D) (ii)(II); EC 56195.7(i)]

The annual budget plan and the annual service plan for the district are developed annually by the Executive Director and reviewed by the CAC for approval by Assistant Superintendent, Fiscal Department, District Superintendent, and the Governing Board. All policies implemented in the single-district SELPA are developed consistent with the district special education policies and procedures.

Funds allocated for special education programs shall be used for services to students with disabilities. Federal funds under Part B of IDEA may be used for the following activities:

- For the costs of special education, related services, supplementary aides and services provided in a general education class or other education-related setting, to a child with a disability in accordance with the IEP for the child, even if one or more non-disabled children benefit from these services.
- To develop and implement a fully integrated and coordinated services system.

Supplementation of State and Federal Funds:

The Instructional Superintendent or designee shall ensure that the IDEA Part B funds shall be expended according to the state and federal guidelines. Such funds will be used to supplement and not to supplant state, local and other federal funds.

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c. The operation of special education programs: [EC 56205(a)(12)(D)(ii)(III)]

Special Education programs serve students with disabilities who meet the criteria of Education Code 56026 which refers to Section 1401 (3)(a) of Title 20 of United States Code to further define, "child with a disability," as a child with: Intellectual disabilities, hearing impairments, speech or language impairments, visual impairments, serious emotional disturbance, orthopedic impairments, autism, traumatic brain injury, other health impairments, or specific learning disabilities who, by reason thereof, needs special education and related services, including children and students who have been suspended, expelled, or placed by the district in a nonpublic, nonsectarian school.

The Executive Director shall maintain regular communication with the Special Education Management Team regarding the continuum of services for students with disabilities. The communication shall include:

- Review information provided at the monthly State SELPA meetings.
- Discuss and review any necessary changes in development or implementation of special education services based upon information from State SELPA and CAC meetings, district programming based on student needs, new legislation, regulations, and/or guidelines.
- Discuss and recommend any necessary changes in district special education policies and procedures.
- Make recommendations for services and programming to the Instructional Superintendent.
- Prepare the initial draft of annual service and budget plans.

In addition, the Executive Director will collaborate with the Special Education Management Team in making recommendations to the Assistant Superintendent regarding the number, type, and location of special education classes, programs and services based upon (a) the service limits and proportions established by the State, and (b) the number of students with special education services. The SELPA will ensure that special day class programs are geographically distributed within the district, so that students may be placed in an appropriate special day class and assure equal access of all students to special education programs and services that will provide each student with an appropriate education as required by law.

This includes meeting the Augmentative and Alternative Communication (AAC) needs of students as recommended by the Speech Language Pathologist and/or the IEP Team. This may also include meeting the assistive technology needs of students as recommended by the appropriate specialist and/or the IEP Team.

The district shall be responsible for administering low incidence services and programs for individuals ages 0-21 with solely visual, hearing, and severe orthopedic impairments and any combination thereof as outlined by Education Code 56026.5.

The Child Find process, in accordance with EDC 56301 (c)(1) will be implemented to locate, identify, and access all children with disabilities residing within the district as early as possible to determine if special education and related services are required. Per Section 1412(a)(3) of Title 20 of USC, All children with disabilities residing in the state, including children with disabilities who are homeless or wards of the State and children with disabilities attending private schools, regardless of their severity of their

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disabilities, and who are in need of special education and related services, are identified, located, and evaluated and a practical method is developed and implemented to determine which children with disabilities are currently receiving needed special education and related services.

Procedural safeguards, in accordance with (IDEA) state parents or guardians of children ages 3-21 and students aged 18 and over have the right to refer their child or self to special education services. This includes initiating assessment or IEP request.

In alignment with recommendations from Council of the Great City Schools and a districtwide Multi-Tiered System of Supports (MTSS), and principles of Universal Design for Learning, eligible students with special education services shall be referred for special education instruction and services within regions of residence in order to provide a continuum of services as close to a student's home school as possible only after the resources of the general education program has been considered and utilized.

**d. Monitoring the appropriate use of federal, state, and local funds allocated for special education programs: [EC 56205(a)(12)(D)(ii)(IV)]**

The Instructional Superintendent or designee shall be responsible to monitor on an annual basis the appropriate use of all funds allocated for special education programs. Final determination and action regarding the appropriate use of special education funds shall be made through the Annual Budget Plan process. Funds allocated for special education programs shall be used for services for students with Individualized Education Programs (IEPs) . Expenditure reports created and submitted are available for public review.

The Executive Director is responsible for developing and maintaining the Annual Budget Plan in accordance with the Local Plan and district policies and procedures. Such duties shall include:

- Review and submit the Annual Budget Plan prior to the required CAC public hearing and approval by the Board.
- As necessary, review and recommend revisions to the Annual Budget Plan during the fiscal year.
- Receive and/or provide updates on local, regional, state, and federal special education financial or budgetary matters.
- Discuss and submit the financial implications of potential significant changes to special education services or other services that may financially impact the district.
- Discuss and submit the financial implications of potential significant changes planned or implemented by the district and/or other entities.
- Discuss and submit any necessary changes to the district budget policies and procedures and make recommendations to the Instructional Superintendent.

**12. Describe how specialized equipment and services will be distributed within the SELPA in a manner that minimizes the necessity to serve students in isolated sites and maximizes the opportunities to serve students in the least restrictive environments: [EC 56206]**

Individualized Education Plan (IEP) Teams that identify students requiring specific technology tools to

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meet their communication/social needs or provide appropriate access to their adopted curriculum, will create an implementation plan and goals. This will be discussed with their designated RIM and Manager III for details and budget procurement.

In addition to providing additional technology needs and assistance, low incidence funds provided by the State allow for the purchase of specialized books, materials, and equipment are necessary.

Due to the adverse educational impact of a low incidence disability on access to instruction and learning. Low incidence funding is intended to supplement and not supplant other available funding for books, equipment, and materials. The Executive Director is responsible for ensuring that all eligibility requirements are met prior to approving any expenditure of these funds.

**Eligibility**

The recommendation for the use of Low Incidence equipment is an Individual Education Program (IEP) team determination made after an assessment has been completed and during an IEP team meeting. It is not a unilateral decision made by a parent, classroom teacher or other related service provider such as a Speech and Language Pathologist, Occupational Therapist, Physical Therapist or Assistive Technology Specialist. Low incidence categories for special education are as follows:

- Hard of Hearing (220)
- Deaf (230)
- Visual Impairment (250)
- Orthopedic Impairment (270)
- Deaf/Blind (300)
- Any combination of the above, Multiple Disability (310) in which one of the above-mentioned disabilities must be included.

**Transfer of Special Education Student Equipment/Supplies Form**

The district has adopted an administrative procedure regarding the transfer of special education student equipment/supplies. As students with low incidence disabilities move from class to class and/or school to school, it is essential that the student's personalized equipment/ supplies are transferred with him/her.

As need arises for the transfer of Special Education Student Equipment/Supplies, the IEP Case Manager shall complete and process the Transfer of Special Education Student Equipment Supplies Form. Upon receipt of the completed form, the Regional Instructional Manager will contact the site case manager (teacher/speech therapist) and confirm the equipment/supplies, the transfer date and the person responsible for the transfer.

The Regional Instructional Manager will communicate with the receiving school and the case manager. The Regional Instructional Manager will secure appropriate signatures, inventory the equipment on the computer, and make a record in the student's Special Education file.



11. Anti-discrimination. 12. Termination of Agreement. Either District or Contractor may terminate this Agreement at any time for any reason upon thirty (30) days prior written notice. In the event of early termination, Contractor shall be paid for satisfactory work

performed to the date of termination. The District may then proceed with the work in any manner the District deems proper.

Notwithstanding the expiration or termination of this Agreement for any reason (a) any provision of this Agreement that imposes or contemplates continuing obligations on a Party shall survive the expiration or termination of this Agreement, including without limitation, the rights and duties under Paragraphs 12, 13, 15, and 17; and (b) all undisputed fees due and payable hereunder through the termination date in accordance with Paragraphs 4 and 5.

### 13. Confidential Information

- a. For the purposes of this Agreement “Confidential Information” includes any written or oral information or data, disclosed by either Party to the other, which may include, without limitation, information relating to technical, financial, personnel, personal employee information, the network, corporate, administration, plan design, benefits or contractual affairs of either Party or a third party that has been identified as confidential or that by the nature of the circumstances surrounding disclosure ought reasonably to be treated as confidential.
- b. Contractor hereby agrees that it shall not disclose Confidential Information, and any materials, discussions, or other communications concerning Confidential Information to any person or entity, except to its own employees, contractor personnel, and to its attorneys, accountants, consultants and other professional advisors having a “need to know,” and who are themselves bound by similar nondisclosure restrictions (collectively, “Representatives”). If Contractor becomes aware of any disclosure or use not in compliance with this Agreement, Contractor shall notify the District in writing within three (3) business days. Contractor shall use at least the same degree of care in safeguarding Confidential Information as it uses in safeguarding its own confidential information. Representatives shall be bound to comply with all terms of this Paragraph  
13.B. Upon the request of the District, Contractor shall provide a written acknowledgment from each of its Representatives that said Representative is bound by the terms of this Paragraph 13.B.
- c. Contractor's obligation under this Agreement to not disclose Confidential Information shall not apply to information that: (a) becomes generally available to the public other than as the result of unauthorized disclosure by Contractor or a third party; (b) is independently developed by Contractor without the aid, application or use of Confidential Information; or (c) was received by Contractor on a non-confidential basis prior to receipt from the District or from a third-party lawfully possessing and lawfully entitled to disclose such information.
- d. Disclosure of Confidential Information shall not be precluded if such disclosure is: (a) required pursuant to a valid court order; or (b) in the opinion of legal counsel for Contractor, is otherwise required by law, provided that in either circumstance:
  - i. Contractor shall furnish the District with a copy of the demand, summons, subpoena or other legal process to compel such disclosure;
  - ii. Contractor shall give the District reasonable prior notice of its intention to disclose Confidential Information in order to allow the District an opportunity to seek appropriate protection; and
  - iii. Contractor shall take all reasonable steps including, without limitation, the pursuit of a protective order, to restrict the disclosure of Confidential Information to the greatest extent possible.
- e. All Confidential Information provided by the District to Contractor is and shall forever remain the sole and exclusive property of the District. By granting access to Confidential Information, the District does not grant any express or implied right to Contractor to use, publish or disclose any Confidential Information. After its review of the Confidential Information Contractor will return to the District all Confidential Information disclosed to it (including copies or summaries of Confidential Information), or with the District's permission destroy the Confidential Information and certify in writing that it has been destroyed.

14. Injunctive Relief. Each Party acknowledges that a breach or threatened breach of this Agreement may cause immediate and irreparable harm to the District and that, to protect against such harm, the District may seek from a court of competent jurisdiction the issuance of a restraining order or injunction to prohibit any threatened disclosure

or misuse of the District's Confidential Information. Such an action for a restraining order or injunction is in addition to and does not limit all other remedies provided by law or in equity or by agreement between the Parties.

15. **Indemnification and Hold Harmless.** To the fullest extent allowed by law, the Contractor shall defend, indemnify and hold District, its agents, employees, Board of Trustees, members of the Board of Trustees, officials, officers, volunteers, and representatives ("Indemnities") free and harmless from any and all claims, demands, negligence (including the active or passive negligence of Indemnities, regardless of whether sole or otherwise, as allowed by law), causes of action, costs, expenses, liabilities, losses, damages or injuries, fines, penalties in law or equity, regardless of whether the allegations are false, fraudulent, or groundless, to property or persons, including wrongful death, (collectively "Loss") to the extent arising out of or incident to: 1) the performance or breach of any of the terms and conditions of the contract (including but not limited to) the Contractor's use of the site; or 2) any acts, omissions, negligence, in connection with the performance of Services or otherwise arising from this Contract ("Indemnification"); or 3) the willful misconduct of the Contractor or their respective agents, subcontractors, employees, material or equipment suppliers, invitees, or licensees. The Contractor's Indemnification includes, but is not limited to, the payment of all damages and attorney's fees, fines, penalties and other related costs and expenses.

a. The Contractor's defense obligations (with counsel approved by District), shall arise immediately upon tender of any of the Indemnities, and the defense shall be paid at Contractor's own cost, expense and risk, for any and all such aforesaid suits, actions or other legal proceedings of every kind that may be brought or instituted against any of the Indemnities, notwithstanding whether liability is, can be or has yet been established.

b. The Contractor shall pay and satisfy any judgment, award or decree that may be rendered against any of the Indemnities, in any such suit, action or other legal proceeding. The Contractor shall reimburse Indemnities, and each of them, for any and all legal expenses and costs incurred by each of them in connection therewith or in enforcing the indemnity herein provided.

c. Acceptance of insurance certificates and endorsements required under the contract does not relieve the Contractor from liability under this indemnification and hold harmless clause. The requirements of this Section (Indemnification and Hold Harmless) shall apply whether or not such insurance policies shall have been determined to be applicable to any of such damages or claims for damages.

16. **Insurance.** Without limiting "Contractor" indemnification, it is agreed that "Contractor" shall secure and maintain in force during the term of this Agreement a **Commercial General Liability** policy (Contractual liability included) utilizing an occurrence policy form, with limits of not less than two million (\$2,000,000) dollars per occurrence, four million (\$4,000,000) annual aggregate limit. **Business automobile Liability** Insurance shall be maintained for owned, scheduled, non-owned or hired automobiles with a combined single limit not less than two million (\$2,000,000) dollars per occurrence. In the event "Contractor" is working with students individually or providing professional services to students, "Contractor" shall maintain a policy providing coverage for sexual molestation and/or abuse claims. In the event that "Contractor's" Commercial General liability policy excludes coverage for sexual molestation and/or abuse claims shall be required to procure a separate or supplemental policy providing such coverage. The limits of coverage for the **abuse and molestation policy** shall be not less than \$2,000,000 per claim and \$4,000,000 aggregate. If any of the required policies provide coverage on a claims-made basis then the following shall apply; 1) The retroactive date must be shown, and must be before the date of the contract or the beginning of contract work; 2) Insurance must be maintained and evidence of insurance must be provided for at least five (5) years after completion of the contract work; (3) If coverage is canceled or non-renewed, and not replaced with another claims-made policy form with a retroactive date prior to the contract effective date, the Contractor must purchase "extended reporting" coverage for a minimum of five (5) years after completion of work. Self-insured retentions must be declared to and approved by District. The District may require "Contractor" to provide proof of ability to pay losses and related investigations, claims administration and defense expenses within the retention. The policy shall provide, or be endorsed to provide, that the self-insured retention may be satisfied by either the named insured or the District. **The District shall be named as an additional insured on the policies by separate endorsement.** A Certificate of Insurance and endorsements shall be **attached to this Agreement as proof of insurance.** The "Contractor" policy shall provide that it is primary such that insurance maintained by the District, if any, shall be excess and not co-primary.

17. Independent Contractor Status. While engaged in carrying out the terms and conditions of the contract, the Contractor is an independent contractor, and not an officer, employee, agent, partner, or joint venture of the District.
18. Workers' Compensation Insurance. Contractor agrees to provide all necessary workers' compensation insurance for Contractor's employees, if any, at Contractor's own cost and expense.
19. Fingerprinting Requirements. Contractor hereby acknowledges that, if applicable, it is required to comply with the requirements of Education Code Section 45125.1 with respect to fingerprinting of employees who may have contact with the District's pupils. The Contractor shall also ensure that its consultants on the Project also comply with the requirements of Section 45125.1. If required by Education Code Section 45125.1, the Contractor and its consultants, prior to any of the Contractor's employees, or those of any other consultants, coming into contact with the District's pupils submit through the DISTRICT fingerprints to the Department of Justice (DOJ) for the monitoring and supervision of employee(s) and/or affiliated constituents. Contractor will not begin work on the Project site until obtaining a DOJ cleared status through the DISTRICT. Contractor further acknowledges that other fingerprinting requirements may apply, as set forth in Education Code Section 45125 et seq., and will comply with any such requirements, including having Consultant certify that none of these employees and/or affiliated constituent(s) will have been convicted of a felony as defined in Education Code section 45122.1. "Fingerprinting Requirements," is expressly understood and agreed to by the parties hereto:

20. Taxes. Contractor agrees that Contractor has no entitlement to any future work from the District or to any employment or fringe benefits from the District. Payments to the contractor pursuant to this Agreement will be reported to Federal and State taxing authorities as required. District will not withhold any money from compensation payable to Contractor. District will not withhold FICA (Social Security), state or federal unemployment insurance contributions, state or federal income tax or disability insurance. Contractor is independently responsible for the payment of all applicable taxes.
21. Assignment. The Contractor shall not assign or transfer by operation of law or otherwise any or all of its rights, burdens, duties or obligations without the prior written consent of the District.
22. Binding Effect. This Agreement shall inure to the benefit of and shall be binding upon the contractor and the District and their respective successors and assigns.
23. Severability. If any provision of this Agreement shall be held invalid or unenforceable by a court of competent jurisdiction, such holding shall not invalidate or render unenforceable any other provision hereof.
24. Waiver and Amendments. This Agreement may be amended, modified, superseded, cancelled, renewed or extended, and the terms and conditions hereof may be waived, only by a written instrument signed by the parties or, in the case of a waiver, by the party waiving compliance. The waiver by any party hereto of a breach of any provision of this Agreement shall not operate or be construed as a waiver of any subsequent breach.
25. Governing Law. This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of California and venue shall be in the appropriate Superior court in Fresno, California.
26. Attorney's Fees. The non-prevailing party in any dispute under this Agreement shall pay all costs and expenses, including expert witness fees and attorney's fees, incurred by the prevailing party in resolving such dispute.

27. Written Notice. Written notice shall be deemed to have been duly served if delivered in person to the individual or member of the company or to an officer of the corporation for whom it was intended, or if delivered to or sent by registered or certified mail to the last business address known to the person who gives the notice.



31. Execution of Other Documents. The parties to this Agreement shall cooperate fully in the execution of any and all other documents and in the completion of any additional actions that may be necessary or appropriate to give full force and effect to the terms and intent of this Agreement.
32. Execution in Counterparts. This Agreement may be executed in counterparts such that the signatures may appear on separate signature pages. A copy, or an original, with all signatures appended together, shall be deemed a fully executed agreement.
33. Board Approval. For contracts in excess of **\$15,000.00**, the effectiveness of this Agreement is contingent upon the approval of the Fresno Unified School District Board of Education.
34. The complete Agreement includes and incorporates by reference herein all of the "Contract Documents" which includes: all terms and conditions of this agreement, Academic Return on Investment Exhibit, provisions of required forms, any appendix, schedules, or attachments, and all modifications, and amendments.



to the Fresno Unified School District  
Proposed Term 2024-2027

**Article 6: EFFECT OF AGREEMENT**

CSEA is proposing a new term of July 1, 2024, through and including June 30, 2027.

For the 2024-2025 fiscal year, the parties agree that Article 9, Fringe Benefits, and Article 23, Salary, have been negotiated. However, those articles may be opened to address other language in the articles.

For the 2025-2026 fiscal year, each party may open Article 9 Fringe Benefits, Article 23: Salary, and 2 unspecified articles.

For the 2026-2027 fiscal year, the articles that may be opened for negotiations are Article 9, Fringe Benefits, Article 23; Salary, and 2 unspecified articles.

**ARTICLE 9: FRINGE BENEFITS**

Health and welfare

Effective as of July 1, 2024, and for the term of this Agreement as defined in Article 26 (i.e., 2023-2026), the District's contribution to the Health Fund as set forth in Section 3 of this Article "Health Fund", shall be Adjusted Baseline District Health Fund Contribution. The parties acknowledge that the Adjusted Baseline District Health Fund Contribution reflects a \$2,370 decrease from the current guaranteed District contribution to the Health Fund (the "Original Baseline District Health Fund Contribution).

On July 1, 2026, the District's contribution to the "Health Fund" as set forth in Article, Section shall automatically increase using the Original Baseline District Health Fund Contribution by the percentage that is the effective, ongoing dollar increase to the District's base grant revenue ("BGR") actually received by the District for the 2023-2024, 2024-2025, and 2025-2026 school years, and thereafter for the applicable school year, including any ongoing deficit reduction or equalization of the BGR, and/or any other ongoing adjustment to the District's funded BGR and accounting for declining or increased enrollment, except the annual contribution for each active eligible employee shall not decrease year to year. The District's contribution obligation provided for in 2024-2025 shall survive the expiration or termination of this Agreement. For illustrative purposes only, if the BGR increases by 2% each year for years 2024-2025, and 2025-2026 and the Original Baseline District Health Fund Contribution is \$24,370, on July 1, 2026, the District Health Fund contribution baseline shall be \$25,354.55 plus any increase in the 2026-2027 BGR.

**ARTICLE 12: HOURS AND OVERTIME**

For the 2024-2025 school year only, Cooks, Bakers, Nutrition Service Operators, Senior Assistants, Nutrition Service Assistants and Packaging Machine Operator may be eligible to work up to one additional hour per day depending on the needs of the site/department as determined by the Nutrition Service Managers/CSS with final approval by the District Supervisor. The adjustment of up to one(1) hour to assigned time through this section does not expand the part-time employee’s rights to health and welfare benefits, only to Statutory benefits as required by the California Education Code 45136 and 45137. The parties agree the additional time of up to one (1) hour added through this article shall be eliminated at the end of the 2024-2025 student calendar year and without requiring the District to initiate layoff procedure through statutory or contractual procedures.

**ARTICLE 23: SALARY**

Effective July 1, 2024, all Classified Salary Schedule shall be increased by three percent (3%). All unit members shall also receive a one-time 2.5% off schedule payment.

Effective July 1, 2025, the Classified Salary Schedule shall be increased by four and one-half percent (4.5%). All unit members shall also receive a one-time 2.5% off schedule payment. The parties agree to meet and confer should the state allocate any ongoing non Local Control Funding Formula monies.

In addition CSEA proposes to square the salary schedule which will be effective July 1, 2024.

3. ANNIVERSARY INCREMENT:

An anniversary increment shall be applied as follows: **1.6% shall be added to the base salary each year from the 11th to 15th year to a total of 8.0% at the 15th year and thereafter** ~~Eight tenths of one percent (0.8%) each year of employment from the 16th to the 25th year, to a total of eight percent (8%) at the 25th year and thereafter.~~ **Unit members shall receive \$5,000 dollars each year for years 21-25. Unit members shall receive \$10,000 dollars each year beginning the 26<sup>th</sup> year and each year thereafter.**

- A. Payments Made Monthly: Increment payments to employees shall be made monthly during their duty year (e.g. ten [10] month employees will receive their increment in ten [10] equal payments). A year shall be construed as seventy-five percent (75%) or more of a normal work year.

- B. Currently Receiving Longevity: In any case, where a bargaining unit member is currently receiving a longevity increment that would be more than the new longevity increment, that bargaining unit member shall remain on the old increment plan until such time as the new increment schedule shall equal or surpass the old increment schedule. All bargaining unit members not currently receiving any longevity increment pay shall receive only the new longevity increment.
- C. Years of credited service for Anniversary increment purposes shall mean years of service in FUSD. All regular District employment will apply toward the Anniversary increment.

CHAPTER 143 FOOD SERVICE UNIT  
SUCCESSOR CONTRACT NEGOTIATIONS PROPOSAL JULY 1, 2024 – JUNE 30, 2027**

The District's Initial Proposal to the California School Employees Association, Chapter 143 Food Service Unit is based on the following Guiding Principle and Supporting Goals and Priorities. By continuing to adhere to this Principle and these Goals, the District reiterates its investment in the students we serve. All subsequent District proposals, as well as Association proposals, will be assessed by the District according to whether they further the accomplishment of these criteria.

The District enters into these negotiations mindful of its Guiding Principle:

**Guiding Principle: Accelerating Learning for All Students In Order to Have Career Ready Graduates**

In order to promote and secure the preservation and future of Fresno Unified School District as a viable, locally governed academic institution that exists to serve children, District resources, energy and effort must be dedicated to the overriding goal of accelerating learning for all students in order to have career ready graduates.

The District's proposals are based on substance, need and the following Overarching Priorities that represent the core beliefs of the Board and District:

**Supporting Goals and Priorities**

1. Fiscal Health and Budget Certainty: The concerted effort to accelerate student learning cannot be diluted, and the focused efforts of all District personnel in this enterprise cannot be distracted or derailed by the uncertainty inherent in the state's funding of public education. The District's commitment to sustaining its fiscal solvency despite historic instability in the economy at the state and local levels requires that we continue to build and maintain healthy reserves.
2. Build Educational Programs: The Governing Board must have the discretion and ability to build educational programs that accelerate learning and guarantee student achievement. The building of educational programs must occur not only to meet the expectations of the District community, but also to forestall the increasing scrutiny of state and federal agencies that are questioning the ability of the District to remain self-governed due to poor student achievement.
3. Identify Appropriate Revenues Available for Adjustments to Employee Compensation: Student learning cannot be accelerated, and students cannot achieve academic success without the efforts of skilled educators and staff who are dedicated to this effort. In order to attract and retain the most qualified and committed individuals to fill these roles, the District will seek to make an appropriate and "equitable allocation" of increased District revenue for employee compensation. In order to be "equitable and appropriate," the level of such allocation must support all of the Goals and Priorities set forth above.

Consideration of and responses to Association proposals will be guided by the District's Guiding Principle, Supporting Goals and Priorities. The District looks forward to collaborative, objective and

reality-based negotiations with CSEA, Chapter 143 as we prepare to meet the significant challenges facing all stakeholders of the District community.

With these goals, priorities and economic interests in mind, in addition to any articles opened by the bargaining unit, the District proposes opening the following articles:

**District Initial Proposal:**

**Article 6 – Effect of Agreement**

The District seeks to set a new term of the collective bargaining agreement for July 1, 2024 through June 30, 2027 and to set the number of articles to be opened during reopener negotiations.

**Article 12 – Hours and Overtime**

The District is interested in modifying this article in the agreement to address call off procedures and daily call offs unless an extended leave is in place

**Article 14 – Leave Provisions**

The District is interested in modifying this Article to establish procedures for addressing staff with high absentee rates and chronic absences (more than the annual sick leave allotment).

**Article 19 – Promotion**

The District is interested in modifying this article to add eligibility requirements for promotions regarding employees on absence verification, competency reviews, and receiving summaries of conference or other progressive discipline documentation.

**Article 27 – Transfer**

The District is interested in modifying this article to add eligibility requirements for transfers regarding employees on absence verification, competency reviews, and receiving summaries of conference or other progressive discipline documentation.

The Governing Board and District administration are committed to achieving the goals and priorities set forth in this Initial Proposal. There is only one goal all must strive to achieve:

Accelerating learning for all students in order to prepare career ready graduates. Failure to achieve this goal is not an option.
