

### About the Eastern Suffolk BOCES Board

A 15-member Board elected by the Boards of Education of our component school districts governs ESBOCES. Board members serve for three-year terms that are staggered so that five seats open each year. An ESBOCES Board member must reside within the boundaries of a component school district but need not be a member of a school board. An ESBOCES Board member may not be an employee of a component school district. The Board is the official policy-making body of ESBOCES. Among the Board's duties and responsibilities are the following:

- Establish policies for the operation of ESBOCES
- Set goals and develop a vision for the agency
- Build community support and promote understanding of the agency
- Offer career and technical education programs that meet regional needs
- Offer special education programs that meet regional needs
- Offer shared services to local school districts
- Provide administrative support to local school districts
- Appoint a district superintendent
- Prepare administrative, capital, and program budgets
- Prepare and maintain a strategic plan to meet the need for services in the region
- Employ staff to carry out programs and services
- Maintain facilities to house programs and services
- Provide transportation for students to ESBOCES programs

ESBOCES Board members, like all school board members in New York State, serve on a volunteer basis and receive no pay for their services.

ESBOCES desires to hear the viewpoints of residents, staff members, and other individuals having legitimate business before ESBOCES, and also needs to conduct its business in an orderly and efficient manner. Comments or questions at a regular meeting may deal with any topic related to ESBOCES conduct of its schools or programs. Comments at special meetings must be related to the call of the meeting. Members of the public shall be heard at the beginning of the meeting, at the discretion of the Board, and will not be recognized by the President as ESBOCES conducts its official business.
