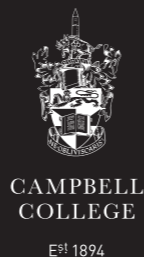

BUILDING FOR THE FUTURE: A £30MILLION CAMPUS VISION

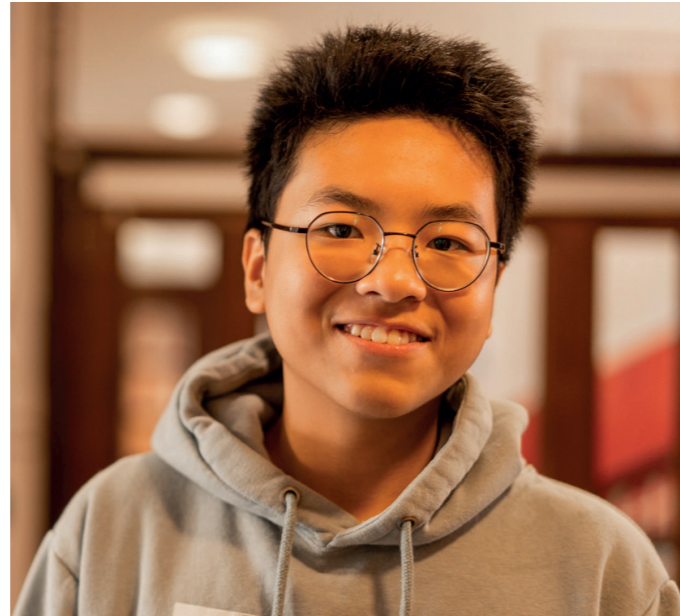
In 2015/2016 the Board of Governors conducted an audit of the whole campus to understand the big picture and prioritise projects. The result was the £30million 'Building for the Future Campus Vision'. As a Voluntary B Grammar School, Campbell receives no government financial support for major capital work and hence relies on cash flow and other income to deliver these projects.

Governors made the decision that the first major building project would be the construction of new boarding accommodation to further increase capacity and secure future cashflow. Boarding is the heartbeat of the College and a vital revenue stream. The new boarding accommodation was completed in 2019 and continues to support the College's financial position with numbers increasing from 100 in 2015 to 150+ in 2024.

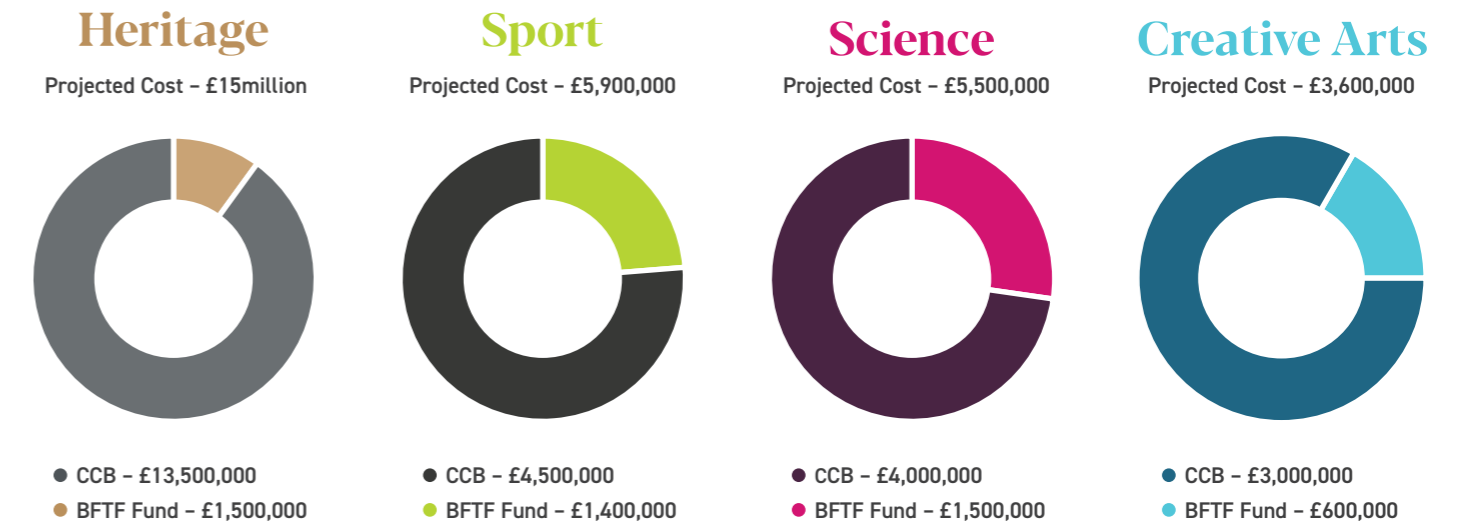
The next priority identified by Governors was the conservation and restoration of the College's wonderful heritage buildings. These buildings were in urgent need of attention; bricks, stonework, windows, chimneys and rooves across every building needed work. It is estimated that BFTF Heritage will take a decade to complete and cost upwards of £15million (as of 2024).

Sport is one of Campbell's core strengths with a list of sporting heroes across the Old Campbellian network. However, the sports buildings were tired and in desperate need of modernisation. BFTF Sport will see a complete refurbishment of the old sports buildings into a new £6million state-of-the-art Sports Centre complete with one of the largest school fitness suites on the Island of Ireland, integrated sports classrooms, multi-purpose sports hall, climbing wall, studio and public area. This is due for completion in June 2025.

The next project identified is refurbishment of all the College's Science facilities. STEM is a growing area and Campbell's science classrooms have changed little in the last 50 years. They need urgent modernisation and it is hoped that work will commence on BFTF Science in 2025 to ensure we are educating our boys in classrooms that are fit for the future.

The £5million Challenge

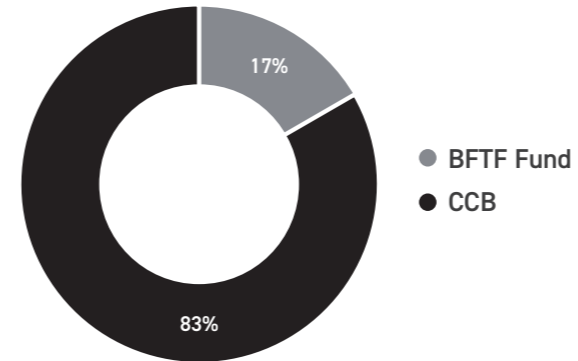
The overall cost for the delivery of the 'Building for the Future Campus Vision' is estimated at £30million (2024) and Governors recognise that to deliver this vision will not only require a strong cashflow but also the ability to generate additional income from other sources.

Fundraising is one of these sources and the Development Office has a target of £5million to raise towards this overall cost.

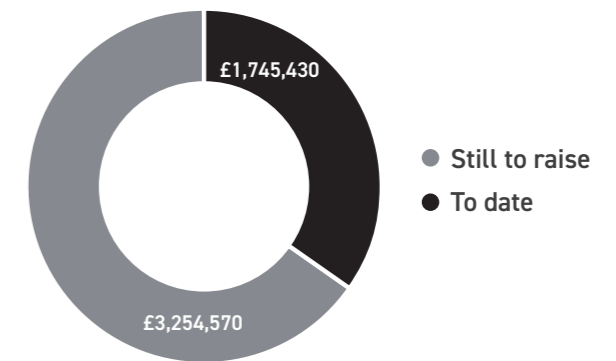
The BFTF Campaign Board was established in 2018 to guide and support the Development Office in this endeavour and to date the Campaign has received pledges to the value of nearly £2million.

Building for the Future Heritage

PROTECTING OUR HERITAGE FOR FUTURE GENERATIONS

The landscape of East Belfast has included our Victorian buildings since 1894 with the Clock Tower forming a landmark for all to know. Since the College opened its doors 12,000 pupils have walked these halls and each year over 9,000 visitors experience these historic surroundings through residential and outreach.

A significant structural survey highlighted the need for restoration works to all the heritage buildings including stone repairs, brick repointing, replacement of heritage windows, protection of chimney stacks and roof refurbishment. Using stone from the exact quarry in Scotland that provided the original stonework the craftsmanship of this work is extraordinary.

IMPACT IN ACTION

The first phase of the new Sports Centre, a state-of-the-art Fitness Suite, was completed in June 2024 and the impact for the pupils was immediate.

The new Fitness Suite represents one of the largest of its kind in any school in Ireland, rivalling Universities in its size and provision. Within minutes of opening, the gym was full of pupils and has been in constant use ever since. Not only a space for the elite athletes the facility will be used by all pupils, boarders and staff and has introduced a new wave of activity on campus.

Phase 2 is under way and the overall building is due for completion in the summer of 2025.
