

Child Sexual Abuse



70% of youth are sexually abused by another minor





Digital Safety

- Engaging in sexual conversation with a child
- Asking a child for sexually explicit images or sharing those with a child
- Purpose is exploit or abuse a child
- Happening to kids as young as 9 years of age.

Reports of online enticement

EVERY DAY





- Single session
- 30 minutes for kindergarten
- 45 minutes for all other grades
- Interactive
 - HSE Middle & High Schools use a video.
 - Teachers are provided with resources to use following the video
- reinforce important concepts

Key Program Aspects - Elementary

- Adults are responsible for a child's safety
- This is "just in case" information
- Most people are safe
- Aspects of a health relationship
- olf someone shows a child unsafe behavior
 - Say, "No" or "Stop"
 - Get to a safe place (where there are adults who keep you safe or where people can see you)
 - Tell a Trusted Adult
- Body Safety Rules (Elementary
 - "Abuse" introduced in kindergarten
 - "Sexual Abuse" introduced in 4th grade
- Common Lures used by predators (3rd grade and up)



OUR GOAL IS TO EDUCATE AND EMPONER YOUTH, NOT SCARE THEM!



Children who do not know proper names for body parts are more vulnerable.

- Potential predators often use this to determine if a child has received abuse prevention education.
- More easily tricked into thinking abuse is a game or normal.
- Reinforces shame and secrecy which abusers use to keep a child silent.
- Makes disclosure and holding offenders accountable more difficult.

- Talk about relationships
- Use teachable moments
 - Books
 - Movies or TV Shows
 - News Articles
- Create a safety plan
 - Digital
 - In-person

Minimize opportunity

- Ask organizations about policies
- Have an open-door policy in your home
- Randomly check in

Talk about it

- Go beyond stranger danger
- Play the "What If" game
- Establish and review safety rules
- Frequent check-ins

Digital Safety Tips

- Set-up parental controls
- Device bedtime
- No-screen zones
- •Be curious! Ask your child about their online activities.
- Talk about digital safety issues.









If your child discloses something...

- Remain calm
- Listen more than you talk
- Listen without judgement or shame
- Thank them for coming to you
- Reassure them they are not to blame
- Answer questions honestly
- Take action
