CCCS will maintain some of its prevention and mitigation protocols as outlined in The Scaffolded Reopening Plan. Key points of emphasis will include the following:

Custodial staff will ensure that high-touch surfaces and high-traffic areas are disinfected frequently and procure an adequate supply of EPA-approved disinfecting agents.

All students and staff will have the option to wear face coverings.

Personal hygiene signage will be placed throughout all CCCS buildings to remind students and staff about personal hygiene practices.

Continue to reassess health and safety procedures to ensure the safety of students and staff.

2. How will the LEA ensure continuity of services, including but not limited to services to address the student's academic needs and students and staff members' social, emotional, mental health, and other needs, which may include student health and food services?

Teachers and Principals will fill out referral forms for social workers and counselors to engage in social-emotional wellness with our students and families. Social workers and counselors will contact families to provide support in accessing resources, information, and services.

CCCS will offer services to meet the academic need of all students.

a. Universal and correct wearing of masks ;	All students and staff will have the option to wear face coverings while on the CCCS campuses.

c. Handwashing and respiratory etiquette ;	Signage related to personal hygiene will be displayed throughout all CCCS buildings, reminding students and staff about the importance of personal hygiene practices.

Cleaning and maintaining healthy facilities, including improving ventilation ;	Custodial staff will ensure high-touch surfaces and high-traffic areas are disinfected frequently and procure an adequate supply of EPA-approved disinfecting agents. Also, the HVAC filters in each building should be changed regularly.
e. Contact tracing in combination with isolation and quarantine , in collaboration with the State and local health departments;	The Building Principal, in conjunction with the Building Nurse, Safety Coordinator, Director of Human Resources, and Delaware County Department of Health, will make decisions regarding the quarantine and isolation of students and staff. We are currently following the CDC guidelines for positive cases of COVID-19.
f. Diagnostic and screening testing;	Student and staff are strictly prohibited to entering a CCCS facility while knowingly feeling sick. All students and employees are required to stay home if they are experiencing symptoms. Individuals who become sick at school will be sent home.
g. Efforts to provide vaccinations to school communities ;	CCCS will promote all vaccination clinics and community resources through all CCCS mediums, including social media, website, email, and robo-call.
h. Appropriate accommodations for students with disabilities with respect to health and safety policies; and	The School recognizes that medically fragile and other special needs students have diverse and sometimes contrary masking needs. For that reason, each child's IEP and/or 504 team must make an individualized determination as to what reasonable accommodations are appropriate for each individual child in
