5.1 Introduce the candidate for Director of Curriculum, Instruction and Assessment

Amanda Riggleman was introduced as the new candidate for Director of CIA and joins us from Charlotte Central School currently in the role of Assistant Principal. Experienced Education Leadership work in Virginia. Mrs. Farrell provided a brief overview of this committee's work.

5.2 Text Discussion with "4 A's" Protocol

Mrs. Farrell shared trying to have a learning experience each month. Something about curriculum or happening in curriculum. Last month we had information on "What is the field of curriculum". We review, have a discussion and answer any questions. Mrs. Fredericks used the framework from last time "4 A's Protocol" and discussion began around the new text discussion starting with things that might feel like assumptions the author of the text had and moving onto things you might agree with or argue, or inspire you to act.

5.3 Annual CurriculumCommittee Calendar review

Mrs. Fredericks went over the updated calendar. Updates included open door invites for teachers to attend and quarterly report times have been added. New Teacher Orientation will take place on August 19th and 20th. Engagement with Professional Learning Groups (PLG) - Teacher Leader Facilitators run the groups - May probably be a good time. 5.4 Program cost/benefit summary of new programs adopted within the last 3 years and recommendations for FY26 airing the group: Mr. Grauford Stampel, Dott. Chair of Saianae at SHS: Mo. Highert, Literacy Tacaber, Mc. Guild, BCEMS

Joining the group: Mr. Crawford-Stempel, Dept. Chair of Science at SHS; Ms. Hiebert, Literacy Teacher, Ms. Guild - BCEMS Teacher, Ms. Dorfman - Interventionist at BTMES. Mrs. Fredericks provided this being a discussion about updates on new programs, things that different content areas are working on, and associated progress we are seeing.

Discussion on the following took place: (please review the recording for detailed information)

Science K-4, 5-8, and 9-12: All programs follow Next Generation Science Standards (NGSS) which are required by the state for science. Grades K-4 using Mystery Science - a platform which has scope and sequence, units, lessons, and assessments. Grades 5-8 and 9-12 using OpenSciEd, curriculum is a phenomenon based storyline approach to Science teaching. Required classes at the high school level are Physical Science for freshmen and Life Science for sophomores. Then they move onto a wide range of electives and a wide range of possible interest and career or higher education paths in Science.

ECO Program: Educating Children Outdoors is not a Science program but more of an approach that can be applied through any content area developed by North Branch Nature Center. They provide support staff who come out and help teachers navigate different challenges of educating children outdoors. ECO programs have been in both elementary/middle schools for many years.

Structured Literacy Programs and Math: Information shared for a very targeted small group of students who have been identified through diagnostic assessments of their needs. Overview provided for what all students have access and exposure to. Summaries can be found in the first few pages of the addendum documents.

Looking at the increased percentages provided, many of the committee members feel the district is absolutely getting their money's worth out of these programs.
