Positive Recognition

Staff are reinforcing positive behaviors with encouraging words and classroom rewards.

Data

Ongoing use of office discipline referral data for decision making is a priority. We localize the problem by location, month, day, grade, behavior, time, and student.

Behavior Matrix

The Behavior Matrix is a detailed description of expected behavior in each setting of the school. The matrix is posted in classrooms and other areas around the school.

Clear Expectations

Throughout the school year students are taught how to behave according to our behavior expectations. Teachers help students learn what the expectations "look" and "sound" like in every setting during the school day. These lessons are retaught and reinforced throughout the school year, and are a regular part of the instructional day.



What can you do to help your student stay on the path to positive behavior?

- Review The Big Mac way with your student.
- Every day, ask your student about his/ her day at school.
- Make sure your student is ready to learn every day.
- Ensure a good night 's sleep.
- Provide a quiet time and space for your student to do homework and read nightly.
- Keep in touch with your student's teacher
- Encourage your student to use appropriate language and tone.
- Practice positive phrases withyour student, such as, "Thank you", "Excuse me", "Please", and "I'm sorry".
- Attend PTA meetings and other school activities as your schedule allows
