The Three R's

- **Respect** - kindness, politeness, positive language
- **Responsibility** - prepared, on time, accountable for actions and behavior
- **Readiness** - ready to learn, ready to grow, engaged in classes and activities



College/Career Indicators



College/Career Indicator (CCI): Measures of Career Readiness

The CCI shows how well local educational agencies (LEAs) and schools are preparing high school students for success after graduation, whether in postsecondary education or in a career. For this reason, the CCI consists of both College/Career measures. Several measures have been approved by the State Board of Education as indicating College/Career readiness. Graduates classified as **Prepared** on this state measure must meet at least one of the criteria in the **Prepared** level, as shown below:

- 1 Smarter Balanced Summative Assessments**
Score of Level 3 "Standard Met" or higher on both English Language Arts/Literacy (ELA) and Mathematics
- 2 Advanced Placement (AP) Exams**
Score of 3 or higher on two AP exams
- 3 College Credit Courses**
Two semesters, three quarters, or three trimesters of college coursework with a grade of C- or better in academic/CTE education subjects where college credits are awarded
- 4 State Seal of Biliteracy (SSB)**
SSB awarded and a score of 3 or higher in ELA on the Smarter Balanced Summative Assessments
- 5 Career Technical Education (CTE) Pathway**
Pathway completion with grade C- or better in the capstone course plus one of the Additional Criteria below:
 - **Smarter Balanced Summative Assessments**
Receive a score of Level 3 or higher in one subject area (ELA or Math) **AND** a score of Level 2 in the other area.
 - **College Credit Courses**
Two semesters, three quarters, or three trimesters of college coursework with a grade of C- or better in academic/CTE education subjects where college credits are awarded
- 6 University of California (UC) and California State University (CSU) A-G Requirements**
Complete A-G course requirements with a grade C- or better **PLUS** one of the Additional Criteria below:
 - **Smarter Balanced Summative Assessments**
Receive a score of Level 3 or higher in one subject area (ELA or Math) **AND** a score of Level 2 in the other area.
 - **College Credit Courses**
Two semesters, three quarters, or three trimesters of college coursework with a grade of C- or better in academic/CTE education subjects where college credits are awarded
 - **Score of 3 on one AP Exam**
 - **Completion of CTE Pathway**

Graduation Requirements

Credits Required


- 280
- Each block class is worth 10 credits. Terms are 5.
- Credits are earned with a grade of "D" or higher
- 4 classes per block
- 8 classes per year

San Juan Unified graduates will be prepared for life after high school. Our graduation requirements support the expectation of rigor and provide opportunities for students to be ready for college and a global, technology-driven workforce.




English
40 Credits
Must include English I-4 or the equivalent(s).




Social Science
35 Credits
Must include 10 world history credits, 10 US history credits, 5 American government credits, 5 economics credits and 5 social studies elective credits.




Math
30 Credits
Math through IM2 is a minimum.




Science
30 Credits
Must include at least 20 credits of lab science, including 10 physical science credits and 10 life science credits.




PE & Health
25 Credits
Must include 20 physical education credits and 5 health credits.



World Language
20 Credits
Must be 20 credits of the same world language to meet A-G.



Visual & Performing Arts or CTE
10 Credits
Must be 10 credits of the same VAPA to meet A-G.



Total Credit Requirement
Traditional Schedule - 220 Credits
Block Schedule - 280 Credits

Each course semester = 5 credits.

MORE INFORMATION
Individual schools may have additional requirements. Counselors can also offer flexibility based on student needs. For A-G consideration courses must be passed with at least a C- grade. CSU/UC Requirements

- A History/Social Science - 2 years
- B English - 4 years
- C Mathematics - 3 years (**4 recommended**)
- D Lab Science - 2 years (**3 recommended**)
- E Language other than English - 2 years
- F Visual and Performing Art - 1 year
- G Academic Elective - 1 year

- Only grades of C or better count for UC
- Must complete 11 of the 15 classes by end of junior year



9th Grade

- Create a 4 Year Course Plan in Naviance
- Start thinking about life after high school
- Participate in extracurricular activities
- Explore summer opportunities
- Save for college/trade/vocational schools
- Take the PSAT 8/9
- Meet with your counselor



10th Grade

- Review your 4-Year Plan
- Take Honors, AP, & CTE classes
- Attend college & career fairs
- Tour college campuses
- Participate in school activities, clubs, and volunteer efforts
- Part-time employment
- Research financial aid options (FAFSA)
- Register for PSAT 10 (October) & AP exams (May)
- Consider the military as an option
- Meet with your counselor



11th Grade

- Review your 4 Year Plan
- Visit colleges, attend college fairs, meet with college reps
- Create a list of schools of interest
- Estimate financial aid need and begin a search for sources
- Ask your counselor about the PSAT and SAT
- Create a resume of your high school experiences
- Consider a summer job
- Meet with your counselor



12th Grade

- Strengthen your college/school list
- Create a master calendar with due dates
- Complete the FAFSA/Apply for Scholarships
- Ask teachers/counselors for recommendations
- Write essay drafts
- Apply to colleges
- Send transcripts as needed
- Visit your school before accepting
- Meet with your counselor


