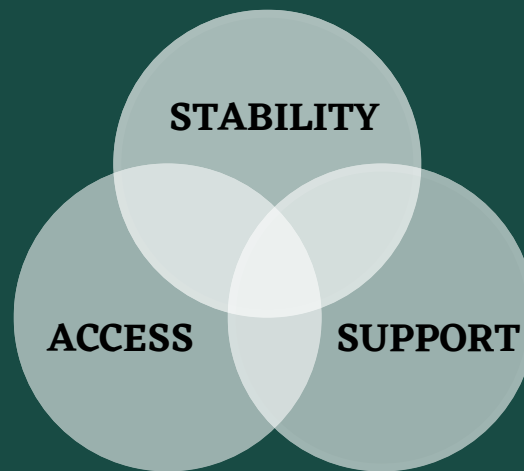

Dispute Resolution Process

If a dispute arises over school selection or enrollment, the child / youth involved must immediately be admitted to the school in which they are seeking enrollment, pending resolution of the dispute.

If the parent, guardian, or unaccompanied youth is dissatisfied with the LEA's disposition of a dispute or would like to raise any issue of the McKinney-Vento Act noncompliance, they may file a complaint or appeal with a McKinney-Vento site or regional coordinator or with the state coordinator.

McKinney-Vento qualifications are as follows:

- Sharing the housing of other persons due to loss of housing, economic hardship, or a similar reason.
- Residing in motels, hotels, trailer parks, or camping grounds due to lack of alternative housing.
- Residing in emergency, transitional, or domestic violence shelters.
- Residing in cars, parks, public spaces, or similar spaces.
- Unaccompanied Youth



McKinney-Vento

KNOW YOUR RIGHTS

- Remaining in the same school and receiving transportation to that school, as long as it is in the student's best interest
- Enrolling in school in a timely manner without the documents schools usually require
- Receiving free / reduced school lunch
- Receiving support with other school-related costs
- Additional support for unaccompanied youth
- Assistance connecting young children with early childhood services

Pennridge School District prides itself in ensuring that all families and students are provided with the support they need. These supports include:

- Timely enrollment in school
