#### **CCSC schools achieve Level 1 HRS Certification**





Following the partnership of Crawfordsville Community School Corporation and Marzano Resources, all schools within CCSC have completed the Highly Reliable School Level 1 Certification, which focuses on a safe, supportive, and collaborative culture. Marzano Resources is a nationally recognized educational research organization providing best practice solutions for teaching and learning. All CCSC schools have achieved certification and will proudly display their banners. Only 28 schools in Indiana have achieved HRS Certification and of those 28 schools 5 of them are CCSC schools.

Level 1 Certification means the following criteria has been met for a Safe, Supportive, and Collaborative Culture:

- 1. The faculty and staff perceive the school environment as safe and orderly.
- 2. Students, parents, and the community perceive the school environment as safe

and orderly.

- 3. Teachers have formal roles in the decision-making process regarding school initiatives.
- 4. Teacher teams and collaborative groups regularly interact to address common issues regarding curriculum, assessment, instruction, and the achievement of all students.
- 5. Teachers and staff have formal ways to provide input regarding the optimal functioning of the school.
- 6. Students, parents, and the community have formal ways to provide input regarding the optimal functioning of the school.
- 7. The success of the whole school, as well as individuals within the school, is appropriately acknowledged.
- 8. The fiscal, operational, and technological resources of the school are managed in a way that directly supports teachers.

Parents and many in the school community were invited to visit the fair and ask the students about their farm animals.


Through their Charlotte's Web project, students combined writing and literacy skills with project design skills to bring together many concepts from the kindergarten curriculum.

Each day of the week offered a themed dress up day focusing on dreaming big, working hard, and looking toward bright futures!


Classes especially had fun on Wednesday when they dressed as their dream career.


To end career week, various community members were invited to share about their occupation with classes. Careers included firemen, police officers, Wabash basketball coach, judge, electrician, nurse, and many more.


#### **Baseball team wins** sectional, regional

Prior to that, CHS claimed the Sectional Championship title after defeating the Western Boone Stars 9-1 on Memorial Day. This




### **Sectional Champions**

#### **Byard ties for 18th at State**

CHS Track & Field represent well at Regionals

Junior Na'arah Byard advanced to the state track and field meet in the long jump, and finished in a tie for 18th place with a jump of 16 ft 8 1/4 inches.

This is the first time since 2006 a female has advanced to state and the first time since 2010 that any track athlete has advanced to state. At Regionals, Byard placed second with a jump of 17 ft 9 inches.

Also competing at the girls Regional meet was the the 4x800 relay team of Sophia and Caroline Melevage, Syklah Strawser, and Katherine Novak who finished 13th: Guinevere Schmitzer-Torbert in the 300 hurdles finishing sixth and a PR; Riley Gardner in the high jump with a sixth place finish.

For the boys track team, seniors Ryan Miller and Tyson Fuller, and junior Alex Saidian advanced to Regionals in the 3200, the 400 and 100, and the 110 hurdles. Miller finished 11th in the 3200 with a new school record of 9:48.66 and beating his previous record. Fuller finished 9th in the 400m race in a time of 50.03. Fuller was also 13th in the 100m with a time of 11.50. Saidian finished 5th in the 110m hurdles with a time of 15.14.
