March 29, 2021

The Stillwater Township Board of Education met on March 29, 2021 at 7:00 p.m. remotely via Zoom for a Regular Board of Education Meeting.

The meeting was called to order by Dennis DeGroat at 7:01 p.m. In accordance with the New Jersey Open Public Meetings Law, the time, date and location of this meeting was provided to the New Jersey Herald, Township Journal & Star Ledger on January 5, 2021. Notices were posted in the Stillwater School, Town Hall, Stillwater Post Office, Middleville Post Office, Swartswood Post Office and the Stillwater School Website. Notice of remote meeting access due to current emergency regarding COVID-19 was also provided to the public on March 23, 2021.

Mr. DeGroat led the flag salute. The following Board members were present: Mr. DeGroat, Mrs. LoCascio, Mrs. Svendsen, Mrs. Nothstine, Mrs. Williver, Mrs. Kraft, Mr. Franek, and Mrs. Thibault.

Absent: Mrs. Galante.

Also present were William Kochis, Superintendent, René Metzgar, Business Administrator/Board Secretary, Marissa Cramer, Principal/Supervisor of CST and Special Education/Basic Skills, Cali Roberts, Assistant Principal/Regional Curriculum Coordinator, and members of the public.

BOARD BUSINESS

- 1. Motion made by Mrs. LoCascio, second by Mrs. Nothstine to approve the Committee of the Whole Board of Education Meeting minutes from March 15, 2021. A voice vote was taken and unanimously approved.
- 2. Motion made by Mrs. LoCascio, second by Mr. Franek to approve the Executive Session Board of Education Meeting minutes from March 15, 2021. Motion approved by voice vote: Mrs. Svendsen-Aye; Mrs. Nothstine-Aye; Mr. DeGroat-Aye; Mrs. Williver- Aye; Mrs. Thibault-Abstain; Mrs. Kraft-Abstain; Mr. Franek-Aye; Mrs. LoCascio-Aye.
- 3. Motion made by Mrs. LoCascio, second by Mrs. Svendsen to approve the February 28, 2021 Board Secretary's and Treasurer's Reports which balanced in the amount \$2,513,060.72 pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:23-16.10(c)3, we certify that as of February 28, 2021 after review of the secretary's monthly financial report (appropriations section) and upon consultation with the appropriate district officials, to the best of our knowledge no major account or fund has been over-expended in violation of N.J.A.C. 6A:23A-16.10(c)4, and that sufficient funds are available to meet the district's financial obligations for the remainder of the fiscal year. A voice vote was taken and unanimously approved.
- 4. Motion made by Mrs. LoCascio, second by Mrs. Thibault to approve the School Business Administrator/Board Secretary to advertise in the New Jersey Herald for the public hearing on the 2021-2022 school budget to be held on April 26, 2021 remotely via Zoom, beginning at 7:00 pm, with the regular meeting to follow. A voice vote was taken and unanimously approved.

5. Motion made by Mrs. LoCascio, second by Mrs. Svendsen to approve the Board of Education's support of and possible participation in a "regionalization" feasibility study for the Kittatinny cluster of school districts so long as the feasibility study is paid for by a Local Achievement Efficiency Program (LEAP) Grant or by the approval of Senate Bill S. 3488 and the agreement among the majority of the regional school districts.

Discussion was led by Dr. Kochis. The KRHS region Superintendents met with Senator Oroho to discuss the loss of state aid and the new regionalization legislation. The Superintendents will be compiling questions to send to Senator Oroho to gain more of an understanding on this new legislation.

Mr. DeGroat provided each board member a chance to express their opinions on this topic. Many of the board members were concerned regarding the feasibility study and the language in the new bill. There was also concern that what is best for Stillwater, may not be what is best for the whole region. Also, what the State feels could be the best, may not be the best for Stillwater. There are still so many unknown facts that more information needs to be provided prior to committing to a study from the state.

Motion to table the above motion was made by Mrs. LoCascio, second by Mrs. Thibault. A voice vote was taken and unanimously approved.
