MUSIC NEWS:

What's happening in music class? Kindergarten has been singing and dancing along with some seasonal themed activities. We've celebrated spring, the meadow and the pond. The next songs will be about insects and farm animals. Grades 1 and 2 have been discovering music notes through our Freddie the Frog unit. Freddie and his friends help teach young musicians how to read music using their home, Treble Clef Island. Recorder has been challenging but fun with the third graders. While students are playing their recorders at home, they are working hard with their "Covid-safe" paper towel rolls here at school!

Fourth and fifth grade have been learning about the inspiration on nature in music. The seasons, water, animals, plants and Earth have inspired musical writing for many years, both for instruments and singing. Grade 6 is in the middle of their musical theater unit. We've been discussing differences between plays, musicals and operas while watching stage performances and learning some musical songs as well. Can you spell supercalifragilistic expialidocious? The sixth graders will soon be able to! Band students have been provided with videos for their newest song, Cool It! The perfect song for trying to cool off with an ice pop as the spring whether gets warmer. Keep up the great work everyone. It's always fun to have music class with you!

SECOND GRADE NEWS:

Let's explore measurement! The second grade is working on a unit of measurement with their rulers in math. Students are discovering inches, feet, and yards. They are having fun measuring objects in both the classroom and at home! Next, the second grade math experts learned some of the metric units of measurement, such as centimeters and meters. Did you know that your pinky nail is about 1 centimeter? Students practiced using everyday objects to help recognize these measurements, such as baseball bats, paperclips, and our desks. Finally, the students determined that some units of measurement are more helpful to use than others. For example, second graders agreed to use yards instead of inches to measure the hallway. Look out, a second grader may ask to measure you!



SCHOOL GARDEN NEWS:

Students in Grades K-6 celebrate Earth Day with a visit to the School Garden and a special project!

During Makerspace classes last week, students celebrated Earth Day 2021 by enjoying a visit to our school garden ~ a place where we can celebrate Earth Day every day! We utilized our Outdoor Classroom space, the gazebo, and began each lesson with a discussion of Earth Day. Students shared ideas of ways that they can make a difference both at school and at home. At school, students shared how important recycling is and our School Garden - for it's a place where we all make a difference through planting vegetables and herbs, sustaining our pollinator garden as a habitat for bees and butterflies and maintaining a wonderful outdoor space for all to enjoy! Earth Day bookmarks were created in the gazebo, complete with phrases and illustrations that highlight what Earth Day means to each student. Students were also able to work in the garden area by planting seeds in the raised beds, weeding and setting up seed trays for the greenhouse. 


