Morning Drop Off Procedures:

As the weather turns colder, we typically have more students being driven to school in the morning and temperature checks take a little longer some days. Attendance: If your child will be absent for either in person learning or remote learning, please call the attendance line at **973-383-3227.** It is imperative that you report your child absent prior to the start of the school day if they are unable to participate in remote learning due to illness or other reason. Those students who are not called in absent will be expected to complete their remote learning assignments. A failure to do so will be reflected in their marking period grades.

If your child is absent from their in person cohort, they will be marked absent. If they are able to complete work remotely, the work will be considered as their make up work for the day but the absence will still be marked.



HIDDEN IN PLAIN SIGHT PRESENTATION:

Hidden in Plain Sight will be featured virtually on Tuesday, April 27, 2021 at 7:00 pm. Presented by the Coalition for Healthy and Safe Communities, this presentation is suitable for parents and other adult community members who work with or care about young people to prevent youth drug misuse.

Did you recently find a vape in your child's pocket or read a text about pods or puff bars and wondered what that's about? Seemingly "innocent" items commonly used by youth could actually indicate a substance use problem. This awareness presentation will allow adults to

be more proactive in helping a young person who might be using alcohol or other drugs. Hear from prevention specialists and law enforcement including Captain Seamus Geddis, Drug Recognition Expert and Sussex County Prosecutor Francis A. Koch, about local drug trends, how to prevent youth substance use disorders and understand resources available to help keep youth healthy.

Would you be able to recognize signs of use and intervene before they become impossible to ignore? This "Hidden in Plain Sight" presentation will equip parents and community members with the knowledge to look past the obvious and become aware of the signs and symptoms of drug misuse. 


Mental health services during COVID. If you or someone you know is having difficulty, please give them a call.


