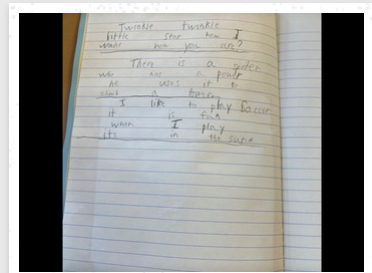
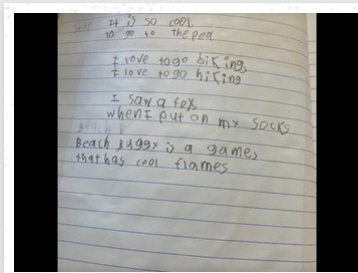
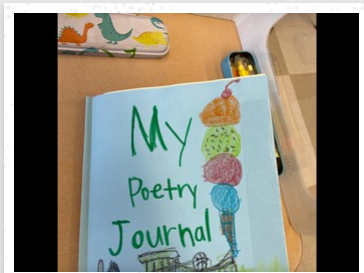

It is imperative that you report your child absent prior to the start of the school day if they are unable to participate in remote learning due to illness or other reason. Those students who are not called in absent will be expected to complete their remote learning assignments. A failure to do so will be reflected in their marking period grades.

If your child is absent from their in person cohort, they will be marked absent. If they are able to complete work remotely, the work will be considered as their make up work for the day but the absence will still be marked.

SECOND GRADE NEWS:

Second graders are poets, and we didn't even know it! This week we have launched our poetry unit while exploring couplet poems. Students are brainstorming topics about things that they love such as friends, family, sports, games, and foods! They are using these ideas to think of rhyming words to write their very own couplet poems! Take a look at some of our work!



THIRD GRADE NEWS:

Third graders were recently introduced to fractions. They can successfully read and write fractions, as well as identify fractions on a number line! Currently students are busy identifying equivalent fractions which are fractions that are the same! In reading, students are reading books about different animals. Next week students will choose the animal they liked the most, and will complete their research project! In Science, students are currently learning about animal and plant life cycles. Students will be planting their own seeds to watch how it becomes a plant!

FIFTH GRADE NEWS:

The fifth graders have been hard at work learning all about fractions. These amazing students can add, subtract, multiply and divide fractions. The students learned that multiplying and dividing fractions is much easier than adding and subtracting fractions! Mixed numbers are also fractions and posed a bit of a challenge for the students who quickly overcame this

challenge. The students are also working on solving algebra problems and learning how to solve order of operations problems! Keep up the great work!

SIXTH GRADE NEWS:

Grade 6 math students have spent the past few weeks learning about ratios. Understanding that a ratio is a relationship between quantities, students learned what is necessary in order to compare these relationships. They learned what a rate and unit rate represent and used conversion rates to convert customary units and metric units. We will expand on ratios and rates by learning about percentages in the next few weeks and then will move forward into Geometry and Statistical Analysis as the marking period progresses. Problem solving will continue to be a focus and students have been making great progress using the mathematical practice standards to help them!
