
Attendance: If your child will be absent for either in person learning or remote learning, please call the attendance line at **973-383-3227.** It is imperative that you report your child absent prior to the start of the school day if they are unable to participate in remote learning due to illness or other reason. Those students who are not called in absent will be expected to complete their remote learning assignments. A failure to do so will be reflected in their marking period grades.

If your child is absent from their in person cohort, they will be marked absent. If they are able to complete work remotely, the work will be considered as their make up work for the day but the absence will still be marked.

Happy new year Stillwater families! The second graders welcomed back their friends this week. Did you know we have a lot of experts in second grade? We have begun a new nonfiction writing unit. Students are discovering that by using the information they already know a lot about, they can write books that teach others about interesting topics. The children are practicing writing expert books on topics that they know a lot about. The second graders are writing a table of contents with five chapters. Students are also using keywords, writing interesting facts, and adding diagrams and pictures with labels to their expert books. Second graders are working hard!

We will be reading about various impactful figures throughout history. Makerspace News:

Welcome to Winter Gardening at Stillwater School!

During December students in grades K-2 learned about where Christmas trees are grown. The lesson included details about Christmas Tree Farms and how to grow Norway Spruce Seeds. We are currently growing some tiny trees in the Makerspace - we hope to plant them on the school grounds when they are large enough!

Students in grades 3 & 4 were introduced to wheat seeds and the difference between whole grains and white flour. Wheat seeds were planted and are growing well, hopefully we will move them to the greenhouse near the end of winter and eventually into our garden space.

Finally, for our last set of winter gardening lessons, students in grades 5 & 6 learned about cotton. The lessons included information about how to grow cotton and what it is used for. Our seeds are sprouting and the plan is to move them along to our greenhouse and eventually our garden space in the spring!

Music News:

I hope everyone had a safe, healthy and wonderful winter break and are ready to start the new year! Here are a few reminders for everyone:

- 1) Check the classwork tab in your music google classroom. Make sure none of your assignments are missing and to read any comments I may have left for you.
- 2) For students who will be completing music assignments remotely, look for "To earn credit" within the instructions of each assignment. That is what you will be graded on.
- 3) Advanced Band students are encouraged to continue playing your instrument. Review notes and rhythms and play some of your favorite pieces of music or pages in the lesson book. A new piece will be sent home soon for you to begin learning along with your weekly instrument videos.
- 4) For anyone looking to do some more music at home, each music google classroom has one or both of the following posts on the mainstream: "Extra Music Activities" and "Google Doodles". You may have to scroll down the main page to find the post, but there are links that will bring you to various music games, lessons and music-creation apps.
