#### **Morning Drop Off Procedures:**

As the weather turns colder, we typically have more students being driven to school in the morning and temperature checks take a little longer some days. Please help us expedite this procedure by turning down your heat and saying your goodbyes while waiting in line as opposed to exiting your vehicle once stopped. For your child's safety, please remind him/her to go directly into the building once they are out of the vehicle. Please be patient while we follow these new procedures and work to ensure the safety of all students at school.

**Attendance:** If your child will be absent for either in person learning or remote learning, please call the attendance line at **973-383-3227.** It is imperative that you report your child absent prior to the start of the school day if they are unable to participate in remote learning due to illness or other reason. Those students who are not called in absent will be expected to complete their remote learning assignments. A failure to do so will be reflected in their marking period grades.

If your child is absent from their in person cohort, they will be marked absent. If they are able to complete work remotely, the work will be considered as their make up work for the day but the absence will still be marked.



# **Tips for Winter Weather Preparedness in New Jersey**

As New Jersey residents and organizations continue to manage the effects of COVID-19, NJOHSP encourages everyone to prepare for winter weather. Winter weather hazards may include extreme cold, freezing rain, snow, ice, and high winds. Planning may be different this year because of the need to protect yourself and others from COVID-19. Below are tips from federal and State partners to help you and your family prepare and stay safe this winter season:

- <u>Stay informed</u> by visiting credible websites to get information about natural hazards and emergency preparedness.
- <u>Build a kit</u> and include items that can help protect you and others from COVID-19, such as hand sanitizer, soap, disinfectant wipes, and two masks for each person. For more information on how to select and wear your mask, visit the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) <u>website</u>.
- Give yourself more time than usual to prepare your emergency food, water, and medical supplies.
   Home delivery is the safest choice to buy disaster supplies; however, if in-person shopping is your only choice, take steps to protect your health and that of others when <u>running essential errands</u>.
- Follow <u>social distancing recommendations</u> (at least 6 feet apart) and other CDC <u>guidance</u> when checking on neighbors and friends.
- Make a plan, and be sure to account for individuals or family members with special needs, as well
  as <u>pets</u>. New Jersey's <u>Special Needs Registry for Disasters</u> allows residents with access and
  functional needs to share information with emergency response agencies, which are then able to
  better serve them in a disaster or other emergency.

 Create an emergency supply kit for your <u>car</u>. Include an ice scraper, a shovel, jumper cables, sand, a flashlight, warm clothes, blankets, bottled water, and nonperishable snacks. Keep a full tank of gas.


